# First Generation <sup>12</sup>

I begin this ancestry report with the families of Joseph Dill, son of George S. Dill and Henrietta Maria Kilcup, and Mary Burgess, daughter of Caleb Clarke Burgess and Sarah Wood, as they married and raised a large family in Hants County, Nova Scotia in the early 1800s, but they also came from well-established New England settlers to Hants County, Nova Scotia, so many descendants of the Dill, Burgess, Kilcup, Sanford and Wood families will be able to catch their ancestry from this report. I have used several sources as footnoted throughout, primarily J. V. Duncanson's histories of Newport, Falmouth and Douglas, several family genealogies, much personal correspondence, and the main genealogical dictionaries of early New England settlers – see list of sources before the index. The England history takes us back to interesting people such as Deputy Governor John Alden (#398), who came to New England on the Mayflower, and Ann Marbury Hutchison (#655).

Joseph Dill and Mary Burgess had the following children, which are all considered as first generation in this report:

Sarah Maria. Born on 4 Nov 1835 in Rawdon, NS. Sarah Maria died in Elmsdale, NS, on 23 May 1912; she was 76. Buried in Elmsdale Cemetery. "Mrs. Peter Tulloch. There passed away at Elmsdale, on Tuesday May 15th, one of the most highly respected citizens of that community in the person of Mrs. Peter Tulloch aged 77 years. Deceased was formerly Miss Sara Dill of Centre Rawdon. She was twice married; her first husband being the late James Fraser of the Gore who passed away about 20 years ago. Her second husband the late Peter Tulloch predeceased her over two years ago. Four children, one daughter and three sons by her first husband, survive. They are Frances, Mrs George Wright, Joseph, James and George Fraser. Two sisters are left to mourn, Mrs John B Wallace of West Gore, recently moved to Vancouver, and Mrs Simm in Waverley, Mass. There are few people who enjoyed more the universal love and respect of her family and

friends than did the deceased lady. She was a woman of exceptional strength of character, a Christian woman in the truest sense. The passing of Mrs. Tulloch will leave in the hearts of her children a blank, which nothing can fill and she will be greatly mourned by a wide circle of friends. The funeral was largely attended."

In 1857 when Sarah Maria was 21, she first married **George Fraser**, son of James Fraser (16 Sep 1799-1874) & Christiana (Christie Ann) McPhee (24 Aug 1805-). Born on 25 Nov 1832 in Nine Mile River, NS. George died in Nine Mile River, NS, on 17 Dec 1866; he was 34. Buried in Nine Mile River, N.S. They had 5 children: Joseph Dill (22 Oct 1858-23 Sep 1923) unmarried, James Ira (22 Sep 1862-1 Apr 1914) md. Agnes Wallace and Margaret Blois Custance, Harding (13 Feb 1862-13 Nov 1910) unmarried, *Frances Ann (26 Dec 1864-10 Apr 1943) md. George Davenport Wright*<sup>3</sup>, and George (23 Aug 1866-26 May 1950) unmarried.

On 24 Oct 1877 when Sarah Maria was 41, she second married **Peter Andrew Tulloch**, son of Peter Tulloch (ca 1778-14 Dec 1860) & Rebecca Thompson (13 Jun 1795-17 Jan 1867), in Elmsdale, N.S. Born on 18 Dec 1832 in Elmsdale, N.S. Peter Andrew died in Elmsdale, N.S., on 14 Nov 1910; he was 77. Buried in Elmsdale Cemetery.

Mary Dill, age 50, is found as a widow in Noel in the 1871 census, with Mary Dill, age 28, John Dill, age 22, Bessie Dill, age 14, and Joseph Dill, age 12, and Eunice Dill, age 16, is found in the next house.

**6 Caleb Clarke Burgess<sup>5</sup>** (*Edward*<sup>1</sup>). Born on 2 Nov 1782 in Centre Burlington, NS. Caleb Clarke died in Rawdon, Hants Co., NS, on 1 Oct 1853; he was 70. Buried in South Rawdon Cemetery. Occupation: Farmer and Sawmill Operator. Residence: Rawdon, NS.

Caleb was in Rawdon before at least 1812, as evidenced from this mention in Township records. Rawdon Township Book, Town Meeting, 2 Nov 1812. "It was decided that the former apprentice John O'Neil would be supported by the town. He was auctioned for 1 year to Caleb Burgess who would supply 1 pair of working clothes, boarding and washing."

Caleb was the only Burgess in Rawdon in the 1838 census.

Caleb Clarke first married **Hannah Sanford**, daughter of John Sanford (7 Aug 1765-aft 20 Mar 1838) & Rachel Bentley (1767-1803)<sup>6</sup>. Born on 28 Oct 1788. Hannah died ca 1812; she was 23. They had the following children:

On 5 Nov 1867 when John Clement was 33, he second married Elizabeth Ann Barron (1837-9 Jun 1888) in Rawdon, Hants Co., NS. On 24 Nov 1891 when John Clement was 57, he third married Lucinda Carter in Brooklyn, Hants Co., NS. Born in 1847 in Newport, Hants Co., Nova Scotia.

7 Sarah Wood. Born on 27 Mar 1789 in Cornwallis, NS. Sarah died in Rawdon, NS, on 5 Aug 1866; she was 77.

J. V. Duncanson in his book on Newport, NS , states that Caleb Clarke Burgess m. (2) Sarah Wood, d. 5 Aug. 1866. In a letter from Mrs. Helen Plummer, 1274 Alloway Cres., Ottawa, K1K 3Z1, 5 March, 1997, she states that Ephraim's will mentions sons Ephraim, Samuel, Charles, William and David, and daughters Susannah Brewster, Mary Parker, Desire Parker, Sarah Burgess and Hannah Wood. From Terrie Cornell: "Sarah's grave and that of Caleb are in the South Rawdon Cemetery, near Cheverie, NS. It states that she died August 5, 1866 aged 80 years (hence b. 1786). But then from something in PANS (in a box of Burgess papers, mostly collected by Charles E. Whitmore) it states that Caleb' m. (2) Sarah Wood, b. 29 March 1781." In a letter from Bob Johnson, 28 Jan, 1996, he states that a memo from Charles Whitmore of Hantsport, NS, had listed Sarah Wood, Caleb' 2nd wife, 1789-1866. Sarah Wood, b. at Cornwallis, NS, according to Eaton , is listed in Duncanson's Falmouth as the daughter of Ephraim and Mary Wood and granddaughter of Nehemiah Wood. Sarah was b. 27 Mar 1789, as recorded in the Cornwallis Township Book. Sarah and Caleb named their eldest child, a son, Ephraim (b. Nov. 12, 1812) and their eldest daughter Mary.

# **Fourth Generation**

**8 Mungo Dill<sup>7</sup>.** Born app 1755, probably in Donegal, Ireland. Mungo died in Centre Rawdon, Hants Co., NS. Religion: Presbyterian.

There is a cluster of Dill's of the same age who all appeared in Windsor, NS at about the same time: David, John, Mungo, Robert and Catherine. John Dill married Elizabeth Walker in Nova Scotia in 1773 (bonded 13 July, married 30 July, St. Paul's Anglican, by Reverend Neal). The marriage bond of David Dill, batch., and Jane Walker, spinster, was signed 3 Jan 1774 and guaranteed by James Finlay of Sackville, also guarantor for John Dill to Elizabeth Walker. They were married the same day at St. Paul's Anglican, also by Reverend Neal. John Reagh of Cornwallis, famer, and Robert Dill of Windsor, farmer, signed the marriage bond of John Reagh to Catherine Dill, 23 July 1777 Windsor. Mungo was bonded to Rachael Forswell (probably Frizzell) on 16 April 1779. Robert Dill married Jane Denny and settled in Londonderry/ Great Village area of Colchester County.

John, David and Mungo Dill became tenants on two 500 acre lots originally granted to Keightly Day on 12 October 1765, escheated on 19 June 1781 and granted to the Dills on 9 July 1784. They were there for some time prior to July of 1784 when the bounds were recorded as starting at a stick and stones in front of John Dill's house. It appears that John and Mungo remained here when David moved to Cinq Maisons.

David Dill rented the farm known as Cinq Maisons, later known as Georgefield, from Michael and Margaret Scott (the son and wife and heirs of Colonel Joseph Scott) for a period of 30 years beginning in 1802. "The Cinque Maisons", was so named by the French settlers, as there were five Acadian houses there. After the expulsion in 1755, it was included in a large land grant received by Colonel Scott in 1759. David's children John, William, Alexander and Joseph bought Cinq Maisons from the Scotts in 1811. The Manor House, home of Colonel Scott, was built there. Georgefield remained in the Dill family for at least six generations (Hand to the Plow, Century Farms, Hants Co. Rural Beautification Cmtee., 1967, Dill Cochran, Newport Station, great-great grandson of David Dill). Mungo and John were never part of Cinq Maisons but resided on their land grant.

Reference to the first Dills in N.S. from "Hand to the Plow", Century Farms, Publ. by the Hants County Rural Beautification Committee, 1967, written by Dill Cochran of Newport Station Hants Co. "This farm is called 'The Cinq Maisons' by the French settlers, as there were five Acadian houses here. After the expulsion it was included in a large grant received by Colonel Scott in 1759. He brought as tenants three Dill brothers, David, John and Mungo (a half-brother) from Ireland. David Dill settled at 'Georgefield', the name given to this farm at that time. The Manor House, the home of Colonel Scott, was built here. 'Georgefield' has remained in the Dill family. I am the sixth generation, being the great-great-great-grandson of David Dill. The Dill families lived in one of the French houses until 1906, when the house we live in was built by my great uncle, Seth Dill, the owner at that time."

This narrative was continued in "The Story of Cinq Maisons and Georgefield, Winckworth, Mantua and Reminiscences", by Pearl Cochran Brown, Dill Cochran's aunt and Seth's niece. The family of Mungo Dill by

Maribelle Smiley also continues this narrative: the Windsor Dill settlers were brothers David and John Dill and their half-brother Mungo Dill, from Ireland.

Unfortunately, no primary-level evidence exists to confirm the relationship of David, John, Mungo, Robert and Catherine, and recent genealogy DNA does not readily confirm that they are brothers. See further discussion in my Dill Family descendancy report. Hence, the parents of Mungo Dill are unknown.

#### On 16 Apr 1779 when Mungo was 24, he married Rachel Frizzel in Nova Scotia.

From Jane Wile, "a Daniel Frizzell, d. Mar. 28, 1797, Windsor, Hants, 1st wife unknown, 2nd wife Margaret Crowe (b. 1736, m. 1772, Windsor), d/o James Crowe, ch. Sarah, Jan. 7, 1775, Margaret, b. Apr. 19, 1779." A good candidate for Rachel's father?

From Bob Dill, A Daniel Frizzel had his will probated on 28 March 1797 and in it he mentions his daughter Eleanor Dill. Mungo married Rachel Frizzel but Daniel does not mention a Rachel in his will. Eleanor may have married a son of John Dill since all other male Dills seem to have been accounted for and Rachel's age makes her a candidate to be Daniel's brother.

From Tom Canning, 2001, I don't have much on the early FRIZZELLs. My GGGG grandfather was one of the early Frizzells, arriving about the time of Mungo Dill and his brothers, but don't have anything on him. John & Hugh Frizzell, b. about 1790, are buried in the Old Parish Burying Ground in Windsor. They could be siblings of Rachel. There were many Frizzells in and around Windsor over the years, but whether they are all from the same ancestors is not clear to me. The Frizzells from Ellershausen were one of the hardest hit families in the Halifax explosion in

1918. I take it that you're more interested in the DILLs, but if you have any interest in the Frizzells after about 1800, I might be able to help. Tom Canning.

**20 William Kilcup.**<sup>10</sup> (5<sup>th</sup> generation in North America), son of George Kilcup (3 Aug 1713-) & Margaret Detton (ca 1714-bef 23 Dec 1773). Born in 1739 in Boston, MA. William died in Windsor, Nova Scotia. Residence: Fort Louisbourg (1759) Ellershouse, NS (400 acres).

The ancestry of William Kilcup, going back to the American family, was principally from Doris Kilcup Winskie, May 4, 1996. She has positive evidence of the American tie. However, Ralph Blois, in his extensive Blois genealogy, disputed this claim. His claim comes principally from "Gateway to the Valley", published by the Centennial Committee of the Annapolis Valley, 1977, which states that the McKillup family of Ireland emigrated to Nova Scotia and changed their name to Kilcup. Religious persecution caused them to leave Ireland. They settled in the Annapolis Valley, Kings Co., NS and then moved to Falmouth where son William m. Hannah Lutches on 2 Mar. 1765. It should be noted, however, that there are a few unconnected Kilcups - see the Appendix at the end of this report. It is possible that one or more of these families might have been McKillup's.

William's petition for a land grant in Nova Scotia (6 July 1785) to Governor John Parr stated that he had served as a soldier in the Royal American Regiment and the Royal Nova Scotia Volunteers (J. V. Duncanson's Rawdon and Douglas) originating in New England, Amesbury, Mass. He served from 1759 under Col. Jonathan Bagley and was in Louisburg, NS for one year from Jan. 1, 1760 to Jan. 12, 1761. He was mustered out as a private at that time. William was baptized at the New North Church in Boston on Nov. 11, 1739, the son of George and Margaret (Detton) Kilcup, and spent his early years in Boston, enlisting in the service at age 20 in Amesbury.

In his 1785 petition, he stated he had "two sons able to labour, and four daughters". The two sons were likely William Jr. and Joseph, because they were the only Kilcup's listed in the 1817 Hants County census. In that census, Joseph was in the Township of Windsor and in his household were three males between 16 and 50 years of age, three boys, three women and two girls. William was in the Township of Douglas and in his household were two males between 16 and 50 years of age, one boy, and two women.

On 2 Mar 1765 when William was 26, he married **Hannah Lutches**, daughter of **Gerrit Lutgens** (ca 1711-, Friesland to Nova Scotia, 1761) & **Hendris**.

It should be noted that Benjamin was not the only Burgess Nova Scotia immigrant. **Seth Burgess**, son of Benjamin Burgess (1708-18 Sep 1748) & Mercy (1710-4 Jul 1746), and third cousin of Benjamin Burgess, the Newport immigrant, was born on 22 May 1736 in Dartmouth, MA. He moved to Cornwallis, Kings Co., Nova Scotia in 1760. Seth died in Cornwallis, Kings Co., NS, on 10 Jan 1795; he was 58. On 5 Jun 1757 when Seth was 21, he married **Abigail Howe**. Born ca 1740 in Dartmouth, MA. Abigail died in Cornwallis, Kings Co., NS, in 1801; she was 61. Their son **Benjamin** was born on 19 Feb 1762. Benjamin died on 25 Apr 1853; he was 91. In 1788 when Benjamin was 25, he married **Abigail Hovey**. Abigail died on 28 Jun 1836. They had six sons and 4 daughters. Descendants are available in Burgess, Barry Hovey. 1941. Hannah is listed in the Burgess Genealogy (1865) as surname Church and in Duncanson's Newport as the dau. of Thomas and Edith (Woodman) Church, although Duncanson also writes that J. N. Arnold's Vital Records of Rhode Island only show marr. to Hannah \_\_\_\_\_. The 1865 reference would seem to be fairly credible. Austin's Genealogical Dictionary of Rhode Island also confirms a Hannah as dau. of Thomas and Edith Church. However, that Hannah b. 1714, married Allen Cary and had a family. It does not seem possible that She would have remarried Benjamin Burgess in 1753 and had children until 1768.

I received a letter from Mrs. Thomas E. (Sybil Card) Crawford, Jan. 26, 1996, who wrote:

"At a conference two years ago, I sat at a table with Alicia Crane Williams, historian for Mayflower Descendents, and discussed this problem with her. (Since Church ancestry leads back to the Mayflower, that is important information to them). When she returned home, she checked the Mayflower records and wrote that no one had ever submitted an application for membership through Benjamin and Hannah of Nova Scotia. She also confirmed that Hannah's surname is illegible on the Benjamin Burgess marriage record (having been seriously water damaged during the Revolutionary War). I have kept in mind the possibility that Benjamin Burgess might have married a Hannah who was a widow of a Church, but my efforts to identify such a person have not been productive."

Further, in Rhode Island Roots, March 1990, following the identification in the same newsletter dated Dec. 1989 of Hannah, the wife of Benjamin Burgess, as Hannah Church, dau. of Thomas (by Terrie Cornell, excerpted from Duncanson), following a "Who was she?" query in Sept. 1989, Mrs. Esther Littleford Woodworth-Barnes, for many years a researcher of the Alden family for the Mayflower Five Generation Project, wrote:

"Since Benjamin Burgess is an Alden descendent, I am very interested in the identity of his wife Hannah Church. The Hannah Church mentioned on page 102 of Rhode Island Roots, vol. 15 is incorrectly identified. That Hannah is a descendent of Richard Warren of the Mayflower and according to "Richard Warren, 3rd Edn., pg. 76, of Mayflower Families in Progress", is called Hannah Carey in the will of her father in 1745/6. Further, if Hannah were age 39 at marriage, she is unlikely to have been the mother of the 8 children named in the will of Benjamin Burgess. He was born 1728 making it not probable that he had previously married and was 14 years younger than the Warren descendent. The Thomas Church family probably stayed in Little Compton. The puzzle remains!"

Familysearch has Hannah Church the daughter of Thomas and Edith (Woodman) b. 23 Sep 1714, md. 21 Nov 1731 to Allen Carey (1708-1746), family of 7 between 1732 and 1744, remarried Samuel Clarke (1699-1759) 12 April 1749 in Bristol, d. 30 Nov. 1782 Bristol, Rhode Island, bur East Burial Ground, Bristol.

Thomas Williams Bicknell in "The history of the state of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations, 1920 (Volume 8)" shows both the Church line and the Carey line. This further shows that Hannah (Church) Carey had family, making her less likely to be Hannah (Church) Carey Burgess.

From Find A Grave. "Hannah Church Clark." BIRTH 23 Sep 1714, Little Compton, Newport County, Rhode Island. DEATH 30 Nov 1782 (aged 68). BURIAL East Burial Ground, Bristol, Rhode Island. Daughter of Thomas & Edith Church and wife of (1) Allen Carey and (2) Samuel Clark per "Vital Records of Rhode Island" [Bristol County - V6]: Carey, Allen, of Bristol, and Hannah Church, of Little Compton, (Int.) Oct 9, 1731. Clark, Samuel, of Portsmouth, and Mrs. Hannah Carey, April 12, 1749.

Subsequently, I received this email from Nancy Edwards in Feb., 2017. "I was recently researching some of my Nova Scotia ancestors and ran across your Dill, Burgess, Kilcup, and Wood Ancestry report. I noticed on page 11 the discussion regarding Hannah Church, wife of Benjamin Burgess. I agree with what is written there. The original marriage document from the town record is illegible as the page is torn away. The Hannah Church daughter of Thomas is too old to have had the children attributed to her and Benjamin. I have a ray of hope for you. When I reviewed Arnold's vital records of Rhode Island, the First Congregational Church of "Bristol", which the

introduction indicates is an error and should be Newport, I see that not many people with the last name of Church married in that church. Two of them are from on or after 1804 and the other two are less than two weeks apart in 1753. Hannah is one of those. So I decided to research the other person, Alice Church, who married Nathaniel Stillwell. I couldn't find much on her either. So I researched Nathaniel. As I did so, I found reference to his wife being the daughter of (Capt.) Charles Church and Mary Pope of Freetown, MA. When I researched that family, I found that not only did they have a daughter, Alice, born in 1726 (old enough to be married in 1753) but also a daughter Hannah born in 1723. This information is in The History of Holland, MA by Rev. Martin Lovering. This document states that Charles is the son of Nathaniel and Sarah Barstow and he was born March 11, 1683-4. He settled in Plymouth and later Freetown. Mary Pope was the daughter of Seth and Deborah of Dartmouth, MA. This line does lead back to Warren and Cooke of the Mayflower. I believe I looked for any inheritance for Hannah but didn't find anything. I'm not really surprised since she moved to Nova Scotia...however, I did this research about 20 years ago so I might not have been as thorough as I would be now (if I had the time to go searching). I also found no other marriage for this Hannah Church."

I can get to Hannah Church (#170), d/o Charles (39), but no other information is given on this Hannah. She might be a better candidate for Benjamin Burgess' wife rather than Hannah Church b 1714 (111) d/o Thomas (26) and Edith Woodman; she is shown as married to Allen Carey.

Familysearch has Hannah Church the daughter of Charles and Mary (Pope) b. 22 April 1723 Freetown, Bristol, Mass. md. 7 May 1758 Trinity Church, Newport Rhode Island to Samuel Hatch (1720-1797).

So I have to conclude that I don't know who Hannah's parents are. My previous versions show the Thomas and Edith (Woodman) lines, but I have now deleted that.

Richard Church, b. 1608 in England, to Boston 1630 and settled in Plymouth, married Elizabeth Warren 1635 in Plymouth, died 27 Dec 1668 in Dedham, Mass. Elizabeth was the daughter of Richard Warren (1580-1628) and Elizabeth Marsh(?) (1583-2 Oct 1673). Richard Warren was the 12th signer of the Mayflower Compact. From "Families of the Pilgrims: Richard Warren," second revision, 1986, pub. by Mass. Society of Mayflower Descendants. It begins as follows:

"Richard Warren is among the most enigmatic of the pioneers who crossed the Atlantic in 1620 in the Mayflower. Clearly a man of some rank, he was accorded by Governor William Bradford the prefix 'Mr.,' pronounced Master, used in those times to distinguish someone because of birth or achievement. From his widow's subsequent land transactions, we can assume that he was among the wealthier of the original Plymouth settlers." Hannah Burgess is likely a descendant of Richard Church and Elizabeth warren, if Church was her maiden name.

Encome Sanford was an Ensign in the 3rd Newport, Rhode Island Militia in May, 1743, an Ensign in the 2nd Company in May, 1744 and Lieut. in the 2nd Company in 1745. Encome had served as an officer during the French and Indian Wars in Rhode Island. He came to Nova Scotia with his brothers in 1760. He was chosen Proprietors Clerk and kept the records for the community in Newport Landing. The original book is in the Public Archives of Nova Scotia, Halifax. Encome obtained a lot in the town plot, now part of Newport Landing, and other lots in the area: lot #17 between Cogmagun and Kennetcook Rivers, lot G, a 10 acre lot of marsh land just to the south of Upper Burlington and lots 28 and 29 between Upper Burlington and Scotch Village on the west side of the river. The unsigned will of Encome is in the Records Office in Windsor, NS, docket #82, Estate of Encome Sanford, 1805. (from David Allen, Mahone Bay, NS).

A. H. Eaton, in the History of Kings County, lists that John Wood and Jonathan Wood were two of the original grantees at Cornwallis Township. Jonathan received a 1/2 share of 333 1/3 acres on 21 July 1761. John received a full share of 666 2/3 acres in the second grant 31 Dec. 1764. John Duncanson, in Falmouth, lists that Nehemiah and William Wood were two of the original grantees at Falmouth Township, each receiving 500 acres in 1761.

It would seem that Thomas and his wife Abigail, both aged 76, accompanied their two youngest sons to Nova Scotia in 1760. Nehemiah was 32 at the time, with a family of 4 children under the age of 10. Jonathan was 30. A number of other sons-in-law and grandchildren of Thomas and Abigail were also involved in this move from Mansfield, CT to Nova Scotia.

According to the 1765 Assessment of Cornwallis Township, there were only two Wood families present: John and Jonathan.

The Kings County Township Books record that Thomas died 21 Sept. 1760 in Cornwallis. The fact that Thomas was born 1 day earlier and died 1 day earlier than Abigail means they were exactly the same age when they died.

Daniel Hovey, of Mansfield in the county of Windham, borrowed 60 pounds from Mary Stutuson on Jan. 28, 1744/5. As collateral, he gave her the note to his house and lands.

From Eaton's History of Kings County, "In 1761, one Daniel Hovey in King's County was presented by the Grand Jury at a Quarter session, 'for uttering certain expressions of a dangerous tendency, and highly derogatory to his obedience to His Majesty' the King. The Justices, without trial, ordered him to find sureties for his good behaviour for twelve months, and committed him to the county goal 'for preaching the gospel'. The case was carried to the Council at Halifax, and that body promptly set the Justices' verdict aside. Precisely what treasonable utterances Daniel Hovey had made in 'preaching the gospel' we do not know, but the Council evidently took a milder view of the case than the local Justice's of the Peace had done. The Council, indeed, did not hesitate to pronounce the Justices' orders 'irregular'."

The elder Job had died in 1718, before Joseph Reynolds, so the next generation Job's are likely. While neither John or Job Sr. is listed as having a daughter Susannah, John had a daughter Ann, making her a likely candidate. The dates would suggest that Susanna/Ann was younger than Joseph Reynolds, and this is perhaps confirmed by the fact that Austin also states that perhaps Reynolds had an earlier wife than Susanna, and she remarried Robert Spencer after Joseph's death, so she might have been the younger second wife, and not the mother of Joseph Reynolds children, or at least all nine of them.

Hannah is listed quite definitively in the Straight genealogy as Hannah Tolman of Watertown, MA, and the genealogy includes the Tolman Coat of Arms. Yet no parents are listed, and a search of the genealogy of Thomas Tolman of Dorchester, MA and of Savage has not shown up a Hannah Tolman to fit the description. Duncanson's History of Newport lists her as Hannah Torman/Turman, and Austin only refers to Hannah with no surname.

He lost his home and daughter in a housefire in 1675. His will, made 21 July and proved in Suffolk County 7 Nov. 1687, names his wife and children, and his brother Obadiah.

The parentage of Ann WOOD, wife of Thomas, is yet unknown. Because Thomas WOOD in a deposition called John TODD "brother", some have assumed that Ann was Ann TODD. The will of Mary GRANT, widdow of John GRANT of Rowley, dated 2 Feb., proved 16 Feb. 1697/8, discloses that Ann, wife of Thomas WOOD, and Susanna,

wife of John TODD, were sisters of the testator. Richard William CUTTER, states that John GRANT married Mary HUNT but does not cite authority for the statement. It is probable that there is a relationship with the HUNT family of Concord and Billerica. When Mary GRANT was granted administration on the estate of her husband, Samuel HUNT of Billerica and John TODD were the sureties on her bond; in her will Ann TODD "is to have one feather bed that Jeremiah lyes on. Jeremiah is probably Jeremiah HUNT.

James died 2 Aug 1675 at Quabog, at least according to traditional HOVEY family histories (there is little documentary history). Quabog was near the English settlement of Brookfield in western MA near Springfield. Hostile relations had developed between the white and native inhabitants which broke out into what became known as King Philip's War. King Philip was the chief of a small Indian tribe who helped spark the hostilities. When the Brookfield settlers sent out a small party to meet and confer with the local, supposedly-friendly Indians at Quabog, they were ambushed and some of the members killed. Some of those known to have been killed here are well documented and others, including James HOVEY (if, in fact, he was killed here) are not. One of the most famous pictures depicting this time period is the attack of the Indians on Brookfield, two days after the Quabog massacre, where the settlers had taken refuge in the home/blockhouse of John Ayers (Ayres), whose wife, Priscilla, was also supposed to be a daughter of Daniel HOVEY. However, there is some documentary difficulty in proving this connection (at least some unclear contradictions in various sources). Daniel HOVEY, James' father, was also supposed to be settled in the area, and like most of the others after the attack was beaten off by militia from Springfield, made back for the Boston area (Boxford, Topsfield, Ipswich). Some of the best sources on King Philip's War are George M. Bodge's "Soldiers in King Philip's War" (1906 and Genealogical Publ Co reprint of 1976), Russell Bourne's "The Red King's Rebellion. Racial Politics in New England, 1675-1678" (1990, Atheneum), D.E. Leach's "Flintlock and Tomahawk. New England in King Philip's War" (1958, Macmillan), R. Slotkin and J.K. Folsom's "So Dreadfull a Judgment. Puritan Responses to King Philip's War, 1767-1677" (1978, Wesleyan U Pr), and Michael Puglisi's "Puritans Besieged. The Legacies of King Philip's War in the Massachusetts Bay Colony" (1991, Univ Pr).

Thomas came to America in 1635, age 15, with his Uncle Anthony. He was put under the direction of Rev. Charles Chauncey of Scituate, who prepared him for his profession with great dilligence. He was ordained minister at Weymouth, Mass., 2 Jan. 1645. His good sense united with a general acquaintence in science of that day acquired for him a great reputation as a physician. His first wife, Elizabeth Partridge, daughter of Rev. Ralph, died in 1664, and soon after he married Margaret, widow of Jacob Sheaffe, daughter of Henry Webb, and removed to Boston, joined the first church 4 Aug. 1667 and was desired to be the minister of a new society there. In Oct. 1669, to save the feelings of his fellow worshippers, the took dismissal of the church at Charlestwon, and on 16 Feb. 1670 was installed over the new church of Boston and was held in high esteem.

Thomas was not with his Uncle Anthony on a voyage in Aug. 1635 from Ipswich to Marblehead, Mass., in which the ship was wrecked on Aug. 16 upon a reef off Cape St. Ann, since known as "Thacher's Woe". Of 23 person's

aborad, only Anthony and his wife were saved. Anthony had previously lost 5 children before his depature to America, and his four remaining children, Mary, Edith, William, and Peter, were lost in the wreck. According to Dr. Cotton Mather, Thomas had such a strong and sad impression about the issue of the voyage, that he opted to go the journey by land, and so escaped. Anthony wrote of the disastrous wreck: "My daughter Mary, the eldest, severed from me on the rock, sitting at my feet; in the pinnace my little babe, Ah poor Peter! sitting in his sister Edith's arms, who to the uttermost of her power sheltered him from the waters; my poor William standing close unto them; all three of them looking ruefully on me, poor silent lambs! their countenances pleading pity and help at my hands."

He was disarmed in November, 1637, due to the teachings of his mother-in-law, Ann Marbury Hutchinson, and her brother-in-law, Rev. John Wheelwright. As a result, he, along woth Gov. Coddington, settled in Rhose Island in 1638, but returned to Boston soon after. He was a representative for Boston, Hingham, and Andover to the Massachusetts government in 1654, 1659, 1660, 1671, 1667, and 1668. He had command of the forces at the opening of King Philip's War.

In 1637 when Major Thomas was 29, he first married **Faith Hutchinson**, daughter of William Hutchinson (14 Aug 1586-1642) & Anne Marbury (1591-20 Aug 1643), in Boston, MA. Born in 1617 in Alford, Co. Lincoln, England. Faith died in Boston, Mass., on 20 Feb 1652; she was 35.

Thomas Burgess arrived from England in 1630 to Salem with a young family, and settled for a time at Lynn, MA. He received land in Duxbury on July 3, 1637, but removed to Sandwich in the same year. According to Savage , he was a "chief man" among the men in Sandwich. He a an original member of the church and became a large landholder. He served in town in every office, humble or honourable, from road-surveyor to Deputy to the Court at Plymouth for several successive years. He died aged 82 and was honoured with a monumental slab imported from England, the only monument stet up for any pilgrim of the first generation. His homestead at Sandwich remained in the Burgess family for at least 6 generations.

The descendancy of Thomas and Dorothy Burgess is well documented in an old genealogy, which includes considerable biographical data.

**398** John Alden Deputy Governor. Born in 1599 in England. John died in Duxbury, MA, on 12 Sep 1687; he was 88. Occupation: Deputy Governor. Residence: Southampton, Came To America On The Mayflower.

John Alden was the 7th signer of the Mayflower compact. His residence was Southampton, England when he was hired for passage, and his occupation was cooper. John Alden and Priscilla Mullins are featured in Wadsworth's poem about Miles Standish Sailed to the New World as a Pilgrim on the Mayflower. From "The Great Migration Begins", by Robert Charles Anderson, "In early 1634, he (John Alden) became involved in an incident in which a party of Plymouth men led by himself and John Howland became embroiled with a group of men from the Piscataqua settlement which would grow into Dover. One man on each side was killed, and in the aftermath Alden was detained at Boston as security against the final resolution of the conflict".

According to the information provided me by Paul Bailey McBride, many suggestions have been made as to the English origin of John Alden, and although the lineage suggested here is "tempting", it is not proved. From Caleb Johnson's Mayflower page (http://members.aol.com/calebj/mayflower.html): Extensive research has been done into the ancestry of John Alden, but nothing has conclusively been found. There are two major theories that have been presented over the years:

Charles Edward Banks, in his book The English Ancestry and Homes of the Pilgrim Fathers, 1929, puts forward a theory that John is the son of George Alden and Jane (---) and grandson of Richard and Avys Alden of Southampton, England. Since Bradford says John Alden was hired in Southampton, this would be a logical place to start looking for Alden's. No other supporting evidence has been found, and it has been noted by many researchers that the names George, Richard, and Avys do not occur anywhere in John Alden's family. Naming children after parents and grandparents was an extremely common practice in the seventeenth century, and the absence of such a name is nearly enough evidence to disprove this theory.

The currently popular theory is that John Alden came from Harwich, Essex, England. There was a sea-faring Alden family living there, who were related by marriage to Christopher Jones, captain of the Mayflower. It has been suggested John Alden may be the son of John Alden and Elizabeth Daye, but this is not fully proven either.

### **Biographical Summary:**

William Bradford wrote, in his history Of Plymouth Plantation: "John Alden was hired for a cooper [barrel maker] at Southampton where the ship [Mayflower] victualed, and being a hopeful young man was much desired but left to his own liking to go or stay when he came here; but he stayed and married here." And later wrote "John Alden married Priscilla, Mr. Mullin's daughter, and had issue by her as is before related."

John Alden was an assistant for the Plymouth colony for many years, and was deputy governor for two years. His marriage to Priscilla Mullins was the subject of the Henry Wadsworth Longfellow poem, "The Courtship of Myles Standish", which although a classic has little factual basis. John and Priscilla were among the founders of the town

### of Duxbury.

In 1634, John Alden was on the Kennebec River assisting in the forceful removal of John Hocking who was illegally fishing and trading on land that had been granted to the Pilgrims. Hockings refused to leave, and when the party arrived at his ship by canoe to board and remove him, he shot and killed Moses Talbot. In return, Hockings was shot and killed. The Massachusetts Bay Colony took matters into its own hands, and arrested John Alden (even though he was not the one who fired the shot). Myles Standish was sent by Governor Bradford to obtain Alden's release, which he successfully did.

In his later years, John Alden was on many juries, including even a witch trial--though in Plymouth's case, the jury found the accuser guilty of libel, and he was fined and whipped. The alleged witch was allowed to go free. Plymouth only had two witch trials during its history, and in both cases the accuser was found guilty and punished.

John and Priscilla Alden probably have the largest number of descendants of any Mayflower passenger, but with stiff competition from Richard Warren and John Howland. They are the ancestors of Presidents John Adams and John Quincy Adams, poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, and Vice President Dan Quayle.

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION:

### The History of the Mayflower Compact

The Mayflower Compact was signed on 11 November 1620 on board the Mayflower which was at anchor in Provincetown Harbor. The Mayflower Compact was drawn up after the London and Leyden contingents started factionalizing, and there were worries of a possible mutiny by some of the passengers. The primary argument was over the fact the Pilgrims were supposed to have settled in Northern Virginia, near present-day Long Island, New York. If the Pilgrims settled at Plymouth, there was no government in place there. The Mayflower Compact established that government by creating a "civil-body politic". In a way, this was the first American Constitution, though the Compact in practical terms had little influence on subsequent American documents like the Constitution of the United States.

The Mayflower Compact was first published in 1621 in Mourt's Relation: A Journal of the Pilgrims at Plymouth. William Bradford wrote a copy of the Mayflower Compact down in his History Of Plymouth Plantation which he wrote from 1630-1654. Neither version gave the names of the signers. Nathaniel Morton in his New England's Memorial, published in 1669 was the first to record and publish the names of the signers, and Thomas Prince in his Chronological History of New England in the form of Annals (1736) recorded the signers names as well.

The original Mayflower Compact has never been found, and is assumed destroyed. Thomas Prince may have had

access to the original in 1736. William Bradford's Journal, Letter-book, Register, and possibly the Mayflower Compact may have all fallen victim to Revolutionary War looting. His journal was found in 1854 in London, England; his Letter-book in 1796 in Halifax, Nova Scotia . The Register and Mayflower Compact were never found.

The following is an exact transcription of the Mayflower Compact made by me from a photo-scan of the original page of William Bradford's History Of Plymouth Plantation in his own handwriting.

### [The Mayflower Compact]

In ye name of God, Amen. We whose names are underwriten, the loyall subjects of our dread soveraigne Lord King James by ye grace of God, of Great Britaine, Franc, & Ireland king, defender of ye faith, &c.

Haveing undertaken, for ye glorie of God, and advancemente of ye Christian faith, and honour of our king & countrie, a voyage to plant ye first colonie in ye Northerne parts of Virginia, doe by these presents solemnly & mutualy in ye presence of God, and one of another, covenant & combine our selves togeather into a civill body politick; for our better ordering & preservation & furtherance of ye ends aforesaid; and by vertue hearof, to enacte, constitute, and frame shuch just & equall lawes, ordinances, acts, constitutions, & offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meete & convenient for ye generall good of ye Colonie: unto which we promise all due submission and obedience. In witness wherof we have hereunder subscribed our names at Cap-Codd ye .11. of November, in ye year of the raigne of our soveraigne lord King James of England, France, & Ireland ye eighteenth, and of Scotlanye fiftie fourth. Ano: Dom .1620.

### London and Leyden contingents

Many people are aware that the passengers of the Mayflower were fleeing religious persecution. What most people don't realize is that over half the passengers were "strangers" picked up from London, whose passage to America on the Mayflower helped the religious separatists pay the excessive expenses involved with sending a ship to the New World.

The following is a list, as best as I can reconstruct, of the members of both contingents (by head of the household-wives and children are assumed to belong to the same contingent). It should not be misinterpreted that the London and Leyden contingents were strongly opposed to one another; in fact most of the London contingent were probably Puritan and Separatist sympathizers and some even had family connections to those of the other contingent.

William Dyer arrived in Boston with his wife, Dec. 1635. They soon joined the Church whereof Mr. Wilson was pastor. On Mar. 15, 1637, he and others signed a remonstrance, affirming the innocence of Mr. Wheel wright (the religious zealot of whom Mrs. Ann Hutchinson was involved), and that the Court had condemned the truth of Christ. On Nov. 15th of 1637, he was disfranchised for signing the above remonstrance. On Nov. 20 of the same year, he and others were warned to deliver up all guns, pistols, swords, powder, shot, etc., because "the opinions nd revelations of Mr. Wheelwright and Mrs. Hutchinson have seduced and led into dangerous errors many of the people here in New England." Mr. Winthrop (in the history of New England) thus alludes to him and his wife, "The wife of one William Dyer, a Milliner in the New Exchange, a very proper and fair woman, and both of them notoriously infected with Mrs. Hutchinson to found the Colony of Rhode Island.

On March 7, 1638, in Newport, Rhode Island, William and eighteen others signed the following compact: "We whose names are underwritten do here solemnly in the presence of Jehovah incorporate ourselves inot a Bodie Politick, and as he shall help, will submit our persons, lives and estates unto our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, and to all those perfect and most absolute laws of his, given us in his holy word of truth, to be guided and judged thereby." He was elected clerk this same day.

On April 28, 1639, he and eight others signed the following compact preparatory to the settlement of Newport: "It is agreed by us whose hands are underwritten, to propagate a plantation in the midst of the Island or elsewheres, and to engage ourselves to bear equal charge, answerable to our strength and estates in common; and that our determination shall be the major voices of Judge and Elders, the Judge to have a double voice". He signed as clerk, the Judge being William Coddington.

On Mar 10, 1640, he had 87 acres of land recorded in Newport. From 1640-47, he was Secretary for the twons of Portsmouth and Newport, General Recorder in 1648, and Attourney General from 1650-53. In 1653, he travelled to England with John Clarke and Roger Williams to obtain a revocation of Gov. Coddington's power. His wife stayed

abroad. On May 18, 1653, he received a commission from the assembly to act against the Dutch. The officers were to be "Captain John Underhill, Commander in Chief upon the land, and Captain William Dyer, Commander in Chief upon sea".. On Feb. 15, 1654, in describing the bounds of certain highways laid out by himself and two others, he complains of encroachments upon the highway by Mr. Coddington and Richard Tew, closing with the following language: "Let them therefore know any injury in this kind put it down under their hands, as I now have down, and be ready to make it good as I am, so shall we avoid hypocrisy, dissimulation, backbiting, and secret wolvish devourings, one of another, and declare ourselves men, which, how unmanlike the practice of some sycophants are, is and may safely be demonstrated. Therefore let us all that love the light come forth to the light and show their deeds".

William was Commissioner of Rhode Island from 1661-2, Deputy 1664-66, General Solicitor, 1665-68, and Secretary to the Council, 1669.

On Oct. 18, 1669, testimony was given in his behalf by Gov. Coddington: "I do affirm that we the purchasers of Rhode Island (myself being the chief), William Dyer desiring a spot of land of us, as we passed by it, after we had purchased the said island, did grant him our right in the said island, and named it Dyer's Island." Others so testified also. On July 7, 1670, he deeded son Henry northerly end of farm, but if he only had female issue then the land was to go to son Samuel at decease of Henry, said Samuel giving to daughter or daughters of Henry, 150 pounds (the oldest having a double portion). On Aug. 5 of that same year, he deeded as a free gift to son William, "all that my island commonly called Dyer's Island".

Mary Dyer arrived with her husband in Boston in 1635. They soon joined the Church whereof Mr. Wilson was pastor. By 1638, following a demonstrated following of Mr. Wheelwright by she and her husband, she was being referred to by Mr. Winthrop (history of New England) as follows. "The wife of one William Dyer, a Milliner in the New Exchange, a very proper and fair woman, and both of them notoriously infected with Mrs. Hutchinson's errors, and very censorious and troublesome". In 1653, as Attourney General of Rhode Island, William Dyer travelled to England with his wife. He returned the same year, by she did not return until 1657. In the interim five years, she had become a minister of the Quaker denomination. On disembarking at Boston, she was soon put into prison by the authorities but was released at the intercession of her husband and leave granted him to take her home to Rhode Island - "bound in a great penalty not to lodge her in any town of the colony, nor to permit any to have speech with her in the journey". She spent some time in Newport after this.

However, in 1659, she returned to Boston and was tried and condemned to death with Marmaduke Stephenson and

William Robinson, but was reprived on the very scaffold with the rope already about her neck. On the 31st of October, 1659 (the next day after her reprive), she wrote: "Once more to the General Court assembled in Boston, speaks Mary Dyer, even as before: My life is not accepted, neither availeth me in the comparison of the lives and liberty of the truth". She was sent by the Magistrates to Rhode Island, and thence went to Long Island.

On the 31st of May, 1660, having returned to Boston 10 days before, she was this time brought before Governor Endicott. He said, "Are you the same Mary Dyer that was here before?" She replied, "I am the same Mary Dyer." He then said, "You will own yourself a Quaker, will you not?" She answered, "I own myself to be reproachfully so called." He sentenced her to be hung the day following. On the gallows, June 1, 1660, she was abjured to repent by her early pastor Mr. Wilson and not to be "so deluded and carried away by the deceit of the devil." She was accused of having said she had been in Paradise, to which she replied, "Yea I have been in Paradise these several days", and added: "No ear can hear, no tongue can utter, no heart can understand the sweet incomes and the refreshings of the spirit of the Lord which I now feel". She was accompanied from the prison to the gallows by a band of soldiers, and drums were beaten before and behind her that none might hear her speak. She is described as "a person of no mean extract or parentage, of an estate pretty plentiful, of a comely stature and countenance, of a piercing knowledge in many things, of a wonderful sweet and pleasant discourse". The Friends' records of Portsmouth thus note her death: "Mary Dyer the wife of William Dyer of Newport in Rhode Island: She was put to death at the town of Boston with the like cruel hand as the Martyrs were in Queen Mary's time upon the 31 day of the 3rd month 1660."

Much has been written about this HOVEY, b. in England (probably Waltham Abbey, Essex) in 1618 (christened 9 Aug) and d 24 Apr 1692 in Ipswich, Essex Co., MA. He immigrated to the Salem colony area in 1635. Just about any history of Ipswich, genealogical treatises about New Englanders or Puritans, and similar sources mention him. He and his wife, Abigail Andrews (supposedly b 1620 in Ipswich, MA, but I have my doubts about this), md. prob. in 1641 (although one source says 1643), had 8 children over the period 1642-ca 1660, with Daniel first, James fourth (ca 1650), and Priscilla last. My line comes from the second child and second son, John (b 1644), who md Dorcas IVORY 13 Aug 1665. Stephen HOVEY, John's g-grandson, emigrated from Topsfield, MA to Maugerville, New Brunswick (then Nova Scotia) about 1770-1776.

His highest offices held were as an Assistant in 1653 and much later as a deputy to the General Court in 1671 when he was almost 80 years old. He made his will on 12 January 1677, dying the same day with the will unsigned, leaving his affairs in limbo for the following two decades.(Wikipedia)

Much has been written about his origin, with little consensus and no proof. However, that he was of the Westcott family of Devon is well accepted, perhaps of the family of Guy Westcott and Mary Stukely. Guy was the son of Edward Westcott. This is at odds with the record of the Westcott family followed here, and needs to be investigated further.

Anne Marbury was born in Alford, Lincolnshire, England and christened there in the Church of England, 20 July 1591. She was the third of fifteen children born to Reverend Francis Marbury and Bridget Dryden, the daughter of John Dryden of Canon's Ashby in Northamptonshire, and second cousin to the poet John Dryden. Her mother's ancestry traces to families of English nobility and to Royal lines, even back to Alfred the Great and Charlemagne. Anne's father was a minister in the Church of England in Alford and in London. He was once put on trial for his unorthodox teachings, but he made peace with the church. His grandfather was Mayor of Lincoln (d. 24 may 1565). In 1612 Anne Marbury married William Hutchinson in London. During the next twenty-two years they resided in Alford where fourteen children were born. Two daughters and a son died there. In 1633, their eldest son, Edward, emigrated to Massachusetts Bay Colony with the Rev. John Cotton, To flee further religious persecution, Anne and

William decided to emigrate to America the following year to join their son. This wealthy family was willing to give up the ease and safety of England for the barren wilderness of the New World in order to follow the exiled minister of their choice, John Cotton. It took great courage, a trait of character Anne displayed throughout her life. She displayed early an independence of thought and a firmness of conviction in religious matters, for which she would later have to pay a penalty. But in time she would be honored as the most conspicuous woman in the Eastern Colonies, and she has been called "the most intellectual woman of her century in all America."

On the 18th of September, 1634 Anne and William arrived in Boston Massachusetts Bay Colony on the ship "Griffin," with ten children. The 15th child was born there two years later. Life in the hardy village of Boston, particularly for women, was hard, monotonous and depressing in 1634. In these grim surroundings Anne Hutchinson brought new light and new life, dispensing medicine, wisdom and cheer in ample proportions, beloved by some, respected by all. Indeed, Governor Winthrop, whose benevolence was tempered with harsh Puritan justice and suspicion of female "meddling," complained that "Mrs. Hutchinson, a woman of ready wit and bold spirit," who "brought over with her dangerous errors" of religious belief, was more sought out "for counsel and advice than any of the ministers." Anne Hutchinson was not deterred by the growing resentment among the Elders of the colony against her views and outspokenness. New suspicions and jealousies were stirred when she founded the first "woman's club in America--a meeting in her home for women to discuss the previous Sunday's sermon. Wives and daughters, excluded from the similar discussion traditionally held by the men, flocked to her house. As Anne expounded more and more of her own views, the crowd of women--and men, too-- who came to hear this new gospel and enjoy her warm hospitality became increasingly large.

When Governor Winthrop and other Elders rejected her beloved brother-in- law, John Wheelwright, as assistant to John Cotton, the suspicions and jealousies were intensified. Anne stated publicly that only Cotton and Wheelright, of all the ministers in the colony, were worthy of attention. Her brilliant analysis of prevailing theological doctrine cut behind the accepted words and phrases of the other ministers, bringing fear and anger to their hearts as well as increased numbers to her meetings. What right had this mere woman, never ordained as a minister, to preach a divisive gospel? By what authority did she stress the grace of a believing heart over outwarad evidence, canon laws and church attendance? An attack on the church was an attack on the state under the Puritan theocracy governing Massachusetts. John Wheelwright was censured, then tried and later banished for sedition and contempt. His friends who signed a petition on his behalf were deprived of their weapons. The "Hutchinsonians" who held public office were then defeated in the May 1637 elections. And finally Anne Hutchinson herself was brought to trial before the General Court.

The woman who stood trial, head unbowed, before the General Court of the Massachusetts Bay Colony on that raw winter's day in 1637, was indeed dangerous, according to the charges presented: "One of those who have troubled the peace of the Commonwealth and the churches"... "not fit for our society"... the "cursed fountain" of "all the mischief and all those dastardly things which have been overthrowing" law and order in the colony. Governor John Winthrop himself presided over the court and tongue-lashed the defendant with accusations and contempt. With him the magistrates, deputies and ministers of the Colony sat with rigid scowls, determined to punish and humiliate this evil source of criticism and heresy. The defendant before them--enfeebled in body, depressed in mind but invincible in spirit--did not fit the picture of a dangerous criminal being tried by a great state in an historic trial. Anne Hutchinson was a forty-six- year-old housewife and mother of fifteen children and expecting another, incapable of violence, disloyalty or duplicity. She stood, weary and alone, in open court to face her accusers, denied the right of counsel or even the steadying presence of a friend. She knew she had no prospect whatsoever of persuading the court or governor of her innocence, and very little prospect of being treated with the leniency her sex, her high standing in the community, and her gentle nature might otherwise deserve. Yet, rather than recant and throw herself upon the mercy of the court, Anne Hutchinson not only defended but reiterated even more strongly the religious views she was accused of preaching to others.

Legend had it that the trial was held in an unlighted, unheated church in Newtown, in order to discourage Anne's friends from crossing the Charles River and marshes to support her. The weather was raw; the ice was already piling up on the banks of the Charles. In this gloomy courtroom the fundamental right of free worship, which someday all Americans would enjoy, was being defended by a lonely woman. Ruthlessly and unfairly cross-examined by the openly antagonistic civil and religious authorities she had challenged, Mrs. Hutchinson replied with determination and candor to those who sat in biased judgment on her. More than once she clearly had the better of

the argument with her more-learned judges. She had even the temerity to ask that the ministers who were witnesses in their own case (as well as judges) be required to take an oath to tell the truth! She was given every opportunity to repent, to back down, to discard her dangerous beliefs and teachings, but she would not. And so the official journal of the Massachusetts Bay Colony records that one "Mrs. Hutchinson, wife of William Hutchinson, being convicted of traducing the ministers and the ministry of this country, (was) thereupon banished." Later, Anne's youngest sister, Katherine, because of her religious views, was imprisoned in Boston and cruelly whipped. Thus these Marbury sisters were among those leaders who fought for the right of religious freedom, an ideal which became, over a century later, one of the fundamental guarantees of the American Constitution.

Expelled from Boston, excommunicated from the church, pursued for the rest of her life by the wrath of the elders, she helped to found a new settlement of religious freedom in the wilderness of Rhode Island. It was in the Spring of 1638 when Anne joined her beloved Will, who had earlier gone to find a home in the settlement of Aquidneck, later called Rhode Island. With her went many of her followers and the following nine children: Francis, age 17, Bridget, Samuel, Anne, Maria, and Katherine, together with the small ones, William, Susanna, and two-year-old Zuryell. Edward, the eldest son, was one of the first settlers of Newport, Rhode Island but then returned to Boston for business; he died of wounds incurred during the King Phillips War. Richard is supposed to have stayed behind in Boston; he is next heard of in London. Persecution followed Anne to Rhode Island. It appeard that Massachusetts would claim jurisdiction over the colony there.

Her husband died in 1642, and without his loyalty and protection, his widow moved, with six of her children, into the New York wilderness. She and her family sought a haven near the Dutch settlement of New Amsterdam, in Westchester County, New York. She built the first house in this area. On August 20, 1643 the settlement was attacked by Indians. They at first appeared to be friendly, but when the dogs were tied the Indians cruelly tomahawked the devoted mother and all her children living with her, save one, the nine-year-old daughter Susanna. They burned the house and carried Susanna into captivity. She remained with her captors four years and was finally ransomed by the Dutch and returned to her relatives in Boston. Susanna eventually married John Cole and had eleven children, leaving a numerous posterity including Orson Pratt. Of her other children, son Edward (1613-1675) was the great-grandfather of Thomas Hutchinson (1711-1780), Governor of Massachusetts Bay Colony, daughter Faith became the wife of Thomas Savage, commander-in-chief of the Massachusetts forces during King Philip's War, and daughter Bridget married John Sanford.

A bronze tablet placed on "Split Rock" in Westchester County, New York marks the place of the untimely death of Anne Hutchinson. This tablet reads, "Anne Hutchinson, banished from the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1638 because of her devotion to religious liberty. This courageous woman sought freedom from persecution in New Netherland. Near this rock in 1643 she and her household were massacred by Indians. This tablet is placed here by the Colonial Dames of the State of New York, Anno Domini MCMXI." In front of the State House in Boston there is a majestic statue of Anne Hutchinson wrought by Cyrus E. Dallin. With head held high, lips proudly curved, poised, erect and imperious, one hand holding a Bible and the other resting on the shoulder of her young daughter, she stands as when she paused on the threshold of the church that had rejected her, and proclaimed, "Better to be cast out of the church than to deny Christ." She was unafraid. It is an interesting example of the irony of history that her statue should now occupy a place of honor in front of the present meeting place of the General Court of Massachusetts, which cast her out of their jurisdiction so many years before.
