# **First Generation**

**1. John Goff**. John Goff was born in Ireland (before 1776) and died in Nova Scotia, Canada (after 1841, so at least 65 years old). Occupation: Farmer. Residence: Bedford Basin and Hammond's Plains, Nova Scotia.

An excellent article has just been published, shedding new light on the origins of the Goff and Gough surnames. (Goff, Phillip G. 2019. History of Gough and Goff Surnames. Journal of One-Name Studies. Vol. 16, No. 6 (Part 1), No. 7 (Part 2). I will include a summary as Appendix 1 at the end of this report, page 161. One main conclusion is that the two names grew distinctly and were not to any extent used interchangeably within families. As of the year 2000, there were approximately 82,000 Goff's and Gough's worldwide, distributed as follows: 55% Goff, 45% Gough; 60% in the United States, of which almost 80% are Goff's; 25% in the United Kingdom, of which 85% are Gough's. In Ireland, nearly 80% use the Gough spelling. The Goff/Gough Family Association, <a href="https://goffgough.com">https://goffgough.com</a>, represents both families world-wide, and a great source for the exchange of family information.

Since John came to Nova Scotia from Ireland, I will include a bit of history of Goff's and Gough's in Ireland. Most of the Irish Goff's were originally of English descent. In the Republic of Ireland, the name Goff was found in most abundance in Co. Wexford whereas the name Gough was primarily found in Co. Waterford; both of these counties are in the southeast. The Tithe Applotment books of 1824-34, records of land holders who owed tithes to the Church of Ireland, record the Goff name in a total of 36 parishes across 15 of the 32 counties of Ireland - 14 parishes in Co. Wexford, 4 in Co. Waterford, and in 1 or 2 parishes in several other counties. The Gough name is recorded in 60 parishes in 21 of 32 counties across the country - 11 in Waterford and 1 in Wexford. Wexford Co. currently has the highest number of "Goff's" in Ireland. There were at least two prominent Gough/Goff families in Wexford Co. The Ballyorley House in Boolavogue, Ferns, County Wexford, was the original property of Clement Gough, built in 1675. Clement was a descendant of Garrett Gough, who settled in Ireland in 1530. The Ballyorley property in 1998 was in the ownership of Mrs. Micheal Gough and her daughter. I (Doug Goff) visited and had a wonderful tour of the property, which hasn't left Gough hands since it was built. The house was wonderfully decorated with portraits of its many inhabitants. John Gough (now deceased) of Clifton Royal on the Saint John River, N.B., established a link between Gough's of this family and a Gough/Goff family that ended up in Prince Edward Island and New

Brunswick, from whom he descended.

Another prominent Goff family originated from Horetown House, in Horetown, Co. Wexford. It was built by Richard Goffe, son of Gen. William Goffe, who was the son of Rev. Stephen Goffe of Sussex County, England. Major-Gen. William Goffe rose to prominence in the days of Oliver Cromwell. He was one of the regicide judges of King Charles I. However, after the death of Cromwell and the restoration of King Charles II to the British throne, the new government offered rewards for the capture, dead or alive, of the regicide judges. Col. William Goffe fled to the colonies with his father-in-law Joseph Whalley and was befriended by sympathetic partisans of Cromwell and Parliament in Hadley, Massachusetts, where he died in seclusion in 1679. This family of Goff's in Ireland were part of the Anglo-Irish protestants, and a recent memoire has been written by Annabel Davis-Goff, entitled "Walled Gardens". There is also a very good account written by Dinah Goff from this family of the 1798 rebellion in Wexford. Horetown House is now used for overnight guests, horse trekking, etc. I (Doug Goff) visited also in 1998, and was most impressed with its stature. A genealogy of the Goff family was prominently displayed on the fireplace mantle. One of the descendents of this family from Horetown, Fade Goff, also ended up in Prince Edward Island, in a position of some authority. He has been written up in the Canadian Dictionary of Biography. There is a local community named Goff's Bridge in PEI.

Beside these two families from Wexford, there were a few other scattered "Goff" families. There were Irish Catholic "O'Goffe" and MacGeough, derived not from the English families but from the Celtic. There were also Goff families in Ulster Ireland, undoubtedly also English immigrants. The modern Goff family in the Republic of Ireland is well known for their horsemanship abilities, and I (Doug Goff) also visited Goff's Paddocks and Auction in County Kildare (<a href="https://www.goffs.com/history">https://www.goffs.com/history</a>), not far from Dublin, one of the best horse breeding and trading stables in the British Isles.


The earliest known ancestor of ours in Nova Scotia was **John Goff**, who it appears married a widow with 6 children in 1796 in Cornwallis, Kings Co. (at least the marriage is recorded at St. John's Church, Cornwallis). We are unsure of the origins of John, although family tradition certainly held that he was of Irish descent and both his daughter Mary and his son Thomas declared their nationality in NS census records as Irish, as did his grandson William. Whether he came direct from Ireland to NS or via the US is not known by us. Is our John descended from any of the families in Co. Wexford Ireland? I don't know. One of the grandchildren of Thomas Anthony Gough, grandson of the original John, understood the family to be from County Waterford, perhaps from family folklore, which is very intriguing as it borders Co. Wexford and may imply a connection to one of those families. This branch of the family (see Thomas Anthony Gough, #4), took the spelling of Gough. Certainly the surname Gough was more widespread in Waterford at that time. It seems unlikely that John came via the US. I had a yDNA test done as part of the Goff/Gough Family Association DNA project, and I did not match any of the US Goff families. It is also unknown whether he came alone or with family. Many of the colonizers to NS were from America or from England or Ireland (mostly the Scots-Irish) and generally, they immigrated with large families, aged parents with several grown children and their wives and children. These families have been well documented by the early histories of the various counties of Nova Scotia. We have no such knowledge of our John, however, who appears to have been on his own, or perhaps with unmarried siblings that left little or no progeny. Thus, the origins of John are difficult to find and may never be fully known.

A John Goff received a town lot in Shelburne, Nova Scotia, in 1784, but we are unsure if this is the same John. It seems perhaps unlikely that John would have started off in Shelburne, 10 years later married someone in Cornwallis in 1796, and then found himself with his family in Bedford in 1812. A Thomas Goff received 100 acres in Digby Township in the same year. Also there is a marriage record of James Goff to Elizabeth Crawford in Halifax in 1777. This same James ("soldier") appears to have tangled with the law over the shooting of one Christopher Schlegall, 1 Nov. 1776 (Proceedings of the Nova Scotia Historical Society), although there was no conviction.

Ann (McCormack) Goff had 6 children from her McCormack marriage, and John and Ann had a further 3 children.

This comes from a page of a family bible, from the home of Edna (Goff) Warner. Their son Thomas stated his birthplace as Halifax, 1796. Her maiden name and origin are unknown. The Goff children included Thomas (who md. Eleanor Holland), Mary (who md. Nicholas Holland, a brother of Anthony Holland and Eleanor Holland, Thomas' wife) and William, who died young. Thus Thomas became the progenitor of our family.

John Goff of Dartmouth, Yeoman, received a land grant of 230 acres at Bedford Basin, April 1, 1813 (Crown Land Grants Folio 11, Book C, page 100), comprised of a block of 100 acres granted in 1810 and another 130 acres between the original block and the eastern shore of Bedford Basin. From Land Grant maps of the Nova Scotia Crown Land Information Management Centre, Halifax, John's 230 acres stretched from Roach Cove east to Anderson Lake (along today's Bedford Bypass (Hwy 7) and at the site of the Department of National Defense Magazine depot 'Magazine Hill'). The birthplace of John's son Thomas in 1796 was Halifax, on Thomas' death certificate. If John and Ann married in Cornwallis, they didn't stay there long, as Thomas was born 6 months after the marriage. It appears likely they were in the greater Halifax/Dartmouth area somewhere, and by 1810 were on the east side of the Bedford Basin, between Dartmouth and Bedford.



Land was granted to Richard Cunningham on the east side of Bedford Basin, formerly granted to Mrs. Mary Magdalen Howe, on 17 Oct. 1816, adjacent to the land granted to John Goff at the head of Lobster Cove, and continuing to Pace's Brook. Mrs. Howe owned all the land south of Parker's Brook (today's name) as far as Roche's Cove, including Admiral's Cove (Tolson). Darius Pace came to Bedford in the late 1700's. Between the Sackville River and Parker's Brook was the land owned by Joseph Scott; from the Brook south to Roche's Cove was Mary Howe's 560 acres. She leased her land to Pace after 1772. An old plan in the Crown Lands Office shows Pace's Brook and Pace's Cove. It was he who named Admiral's Rock, after Admiral Lord Nelson. At that time, the east side was the less-developed side. In the early 19th century, Dartmouth consisted of about twenty-five families working as a sawmill and agricultural outpost of Halifax. By 1823, there was a "new Dartmouth Road to Sackville", but it did not receive the traffic of the Halifax Road to Bedford. The route to Halifax from the east side would have been overland via the Bedford Road or perhaps to Dartmouth and via boat across the harbour.

There is reference to John having received another 500 acres at Bedford Basin in 1819 recorded from the Land Grant Index at the Provincial Archives of Nova Scotia, but no record of this can be found from the Crown Lands Grant maps or in the Crown Land Information Management Centre.

John Goff of Bedford Basin, Husbandman, also received a Land Grant of 500 acres split on both sides of the Annapolis Road out of Hammonds Plains, 28 April 1824, bordering the lands of Frederick Rhalves (Crown Land Grants Folio 207, Book L, page 2). (From Joan Dawson's book, the original Hammonds Plains Road leaving the Bedford Road was headed towards Annapolis via New Ross). This can be seen on the old Land Grant maps, and includes the current areas south of Kelly's Lake and Long Lake, between Chain Lakes and Holloway Lake (then Rhalves Lake), south and including Hubley Mill Lake, and then east to Pogwa Lake in the area west of Hammonds Plains and north of the Head of St. Margaret's Bay. This today is undeveloped land: rock, lakes and bogs. John may have used it for lumber, but any development of it is now unknown.

The census of 31 December, 1827 records John and Ann Goff in the Hammond's Plains area. There was one male and one female listed in the house, occupation was farming, and religion was listed as R.C. (although this is suspect, because they were married in (or their marriage was recorded at) St. Johns Anglican Church, Cornwallis Twp., Kings Co., and Thomas' family had strong connections to St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville - no other connection to the Roman Catholic church is present in this family). By 1827, all of the children would have been on their own. (Note: Mrs. Elsie Tolson in her history of Bedford states that the original church at St. Johns began as early as 1797, maybe even as early as 1790. The present Church was built in 1829. The parish as set forth in 1804 included Bedford, Sackville, Birch Cove, Rockingham, part of Lantz, up to the head of Grand Lake and a small part of Rawdon parish. All faiths and races were allowed to be buried.)

John Goff deeded land to Thomas Goff in 1819, to James Quinlan in 1829, and to Alexander Hubley in 1841. Beyond that, we don't know more about John or when he died. No clear record of any of the McCormack children has been found, beyond the single family bible page.

#### On 21 Jan 1796 John Goff married Mrs. Anna McCormack, 1755-1842.

Information on Ann is very sketchy. The McCormack name comes from a family bible page that came from the home of Edna (Goff) Warner, listing the names of her McCormack children followed by the names of her Goff children (Thomas, Mary, and William). Her surname was recorded in the Cornwallis Township Book as McKenzie, but this may have been a handwriting interpretation for McKormack, the spelling found in St. John's Anglican Church, Cornwallis, records. Although there was a family of McCormacks in Kings County dating back to this time, we have not been able to place her former husband or children amongst them. We thought that would be an obvious clue to finding her identity.

Acadian Recorder Sat 31 Dec 1842, "died 22 Dec. at Hammond's Plains, Mrs. Ann Goff, 87, of Cornwallis."

#### Children of John Goff and Ann:

     N.S., in 1890; she was 90. Buried in Hammonds Plains Anglican Cemetery, Hfx. Co., NS.

Mary Holland, age 82, was listed in the 1881 census of Hammonds Plains, as a widow, nationality Irish, living with Charles and Mary Thomson (her niece). This is good evidence of John's origin, as little other evidence has been found, other than family tradition. We are unsure of any family, although suspect they had no children.



On 20 May 1826 when Mary was 26, she married **John "Nicholas" Holland**, son of Johann "Matthäus" Holland (27 Jul 1755-25 Jan 1830) & Margaret Appledore (1767-17 Jan 1820). Born on 25 Jun 1796 in Halifax, N.S. John "Nicholas" died in Bedford, Nova Scotia, on 2 Jul 1866; he was 70. Buried in Hammonds Plains Anglican Cemetery, Hfx. Co., NS. Occupation: Farmer (1826). Residence: Windsor Road (1826).

A marriage bond (NSARM) was signed May 17, 1826, between Nicholas Holland, Windsor Road, bachelor, farmer, and Mary Goff, spinster.

Death is recorded in the NS Historical Vital Statistics, s/o Matias and Margaret, cause of death "disease of kidneys", married, age 70.

iii. William Goff (14 Jun 1802-2 Jan 1814) Born on 14 Jun 1802. William died on 2 Jan 1814; he was 11 (Family bible).

## **Second Generation**

#### Family of John Goff (1) & Mrs. Anna McCormack

**2. Thomas Goff** (*John*<sup>1</sup>). Born on 14 Jun 1796 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Thomas died in Goffs, Halifax Co., Nova Scotia, on 23 May 1868; he was 71. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS. Occupation: Businessman, Tavern Keeper, Miller, Husbandsman. Residence: Bedford, Sackville, Guysborough Road (area later to become Goffs). Religion: Anglican.

Thomas Goff, 1796-1868, lived in the Bedford area for many years and was active in a number of early Bedford businesses and activities. He married Eleanor Holland in 1823, in Halifax. Thomas Goff and his brother-in-law Anthony Henry Holland, the founder and first editor of one of Atlantic Canada's first newspapers, the Acadian Recorder, had a number of business ventures together. The biography of Anthony Holland has been written in the "Dictionary of Canadian Biography" by Miss Gertrude Tratt. Thomas was involved with Anthony in the establishment of the first paper mill in the province, built at the head of the Bedford Basin in 1819. The paper was made from linen and was used in the printing of the Acadian Recorder and the various phamplets which issued from his press. The heavy paper manufactured at this mill was said to be of a tolerably good description (Halifax: Warden of the North).

It is likely that Anthony Holland and John and Thomas Goff became acquainted around 1819, when Holland began his operation on the northwest of the Bedford Basin. (It is possible they were acquainted previous, but we have no evidence to connect John to Halifax city or to the Little Dutch Church or the German population with whom Holland had his roots.) Thomas was 23 years old in 1819. Two of the papermakers in the mill in 1821, Samuel Courtney and John Campbell, both married sisters of Anthony's in 1821 (Note: neither are in the 1827 Nova Scotia census). In 1823, Thomas married Anthony's youngest sister Eleanor (marriage bond at NSARM dated 2 May 1823 between Thomas Goff, bachelor, residence "on the new Dartmouth Road to Sackville", occupation farmer, and Eleanor Holland, spinster) and in 1826, Anthony's brother Nicholas married Thomas' sister Mary. In 1823, Thomas' address was listed as "on the new Dartmouth Road to Sackville", i.e., on the east side of the Basin, likely John's property. John Goff deeded property to Thomas in 1819. By 1827, and likely soon after their marriage, it appears that Thomas and Eleanor were living "on the Hammonds Plains Road", very near to the Nine Mile House and Anthony's home, perhaps a part of his landholdings. The 31 December 1827 census of Hammond's Plains lists Thomas Goff, with 3 males, 2 females, and 1 servant residing in the house; religion listed as Anglican. In the 1827 census, Thomas' occupation is named as "Agriculture"; the household beside Thomas was that of John Grigrey, occupation papermaker. Between 1823 and 1830, Thomas and Eleanor had 5 children. Thomas has been described in various histories (including Thomas Randall's Halifax: Warden of the North) as being "involved with" Anthony in the operations of the paper mill. John Goff and Thomas Goff are both in the 1827 census of Hammonds Plains district, but separated by several families. On 11 May 1830, Thomas and Anthony Holland jointly received a water lot on the Bedford Basin, Thomas' occupation listed as "husbandsman".

Anthony died in a driving accident (fall from a horse) on Oct 10 1830 and on Nov 8, 1830, Eliza (Mrs. Anthony) Holland, Phillip John Holland and James William Merkel (Eliza's brother), executors of the estate of Anthony, leased to Thomas Goff for three years all of the land holdings of Anthony, 1000 acres, including the Nine Mile House. We have a copy of that lease, found in the home of Mr. Alex Goff. The Nine Mile House was an Inn of Bedford fame, run by Holland from 1823 to his death, during which time it was also known as Holland's Inn. On Nov 22, 1830, Thomas is advertising "To be let, that pleasantly situated cottage with garden etc. attached thereto, recently occupied by the late Mr. A H Holland on the Windsor Road, within eight miles of Halifax. It will be let for

one or more years, as may be agreed upon. Inquires on the premises of Thomas Goff."

Acadian Recorder, Nov. 20, 1832 "Nine Mile House. The Subscriber having again rented the above house, with all the grounds, etc. attached thereto, is now fitting it up in a more convenient style, as a Public Inn, begs leave to inform his friends both in Town and Country, that he will not fail to use his best endeavours to give general satisfaction; his larder will be well supplied, his liquors of the best quality, and his stables (which are superior well attended to. THOMAS GOFF."

John McGregor leased the Acadian Paper Mill and about 13 acres of surrounding land from Anthony Holland in 1829. McGregor ran an ad in the 15 Sept 1832 Acadian Recorder: "Acadian Paper Mills For Sale. 8 ½ miles from Halifax on Hammonds Plains Road. Only one of a kind in the Province. Dams permanently fixed to give supply of water. Machinery of the best make, in good repair. New machine recently from United Sates makes double quantity of paper. Rope cutting machine from Boston, boxes for new way of bleaching. Mill house is strong stone building, 35x45x22 high, and drying loft of wood. 10 acres belong to mill. Good house close to mill for two families, frost proof cellar with oven. Stone barn, shingled, can store 20 tons of hay or paper stock. Water privileges for two mills. One was lately occupied by saw mill. Mill never freezes. Apply P. J. Holland, or to the proprietor on premises." (Tolson). James W. Merkel and P.J. Holland foreclosed on Mr. McGregor's mortgage in 1835, and then leased the mill in 1837 to the Piers' family.

From 1830 to 1840, it appears that Thomas operated the Nine Mile House and various properties associated with it, and at some point acquired at least some of it from the estate of Anthony Holland. He was variously listed as "tavern keeper" or "innkeeper" in historical records from this time. He also was a grist mill operator at Piers Mill (Tolson). He was said to have been Proprietor of Eight Mile House (which, I think, was the same Inn), 1832-1839. He was listed as a trustee of Birch Cove School District #8, 12 June 1835. On the school roster were William Goff 12, John Goff 10, Margaret Goff 8 and Thomas Goff 7, children of Thomas Goff. Thomas appears to have financially supported several other school children as well. Thomas and Eleanor had 3 more children between 1830 and 1840.

"Piers Cove. On March 26, 1836, William Bevil Thomas Piers bought two pieces of land at Millview from Henry Mixner for 500 pounds. Mixner's tannery (from 1813) was on one piece. Piers built a grist mill on the other, using the same water power as did the Acadian Paper Mill. The mill was built was a large overshoot waterwheel on the north side of the building. The tannery was in the yard of a small house near the mill. Mr. Piers' purchase included that house plus a large house to the north. It was a pretty house, a spreading English country home type, with a fine row of native elms. It was occupied from 1836 by Piers. A wharf, store house and grain elevator were built beside the mill and Thomas Goff was the miller at the Grist Mill. He was proprietor of Eight Mile House from 1832-39 and that Inn was very near the mill. Good-sized vessels brought corn to the wharf, and for 72 years the cove was known as Piers' Cove, or Piers' Mill Cove. In 1837, Piers obtained a 5-year lease on the Acadian Paper Mill, the house, etc. at the foot of paper Mill Lake on the Hammonds Plains Road. James W. Merkel (Anthony Holland's wife's brother) was administrator of the Holland estate and granted the lease. Piers also manufactured line and twine at Piers Cove." (Tolson) (Note: she refers to Thomas as proprietor of Eight Mile House, likely referring to what they called the Nine Mile House)

The paper mill must have stayed in the Holland family for many years. From www.hughespaper.com, "A document, dated 10 October 1873 shows that Daniel Hughes and his sons took over the lease of this mill from Jeremiah O'Connor. This lease, from William Holland (Anthony's son, 1826-1875) was due to expire on 1 May 1875 and covered "All that piece or parcel of land on the old Hammond's Plains Road in the County of Halifax on both sides of the Nine Mile river situate to the north of Archibald's Mill and . . . containing four acres more or less . . . " The lease cost Hughes \$12,500 with repayments to be made at \$40.00 per week plus interest until the full amount had been repaid. A fire on 20 August 1875 destroyed the mill and its contents. It was never rebuilt."

In 1840, Thomas appears to be letting go of the Bedford property, as evident from this newspaper article of March 11, 1840. "Valuable Property. The Subscriber offers for sale, near the Nine-Mile River Bridge – A Water Lot, on

Bedford Basin, fronting on the Windsor Road 150 feet, and running 200 feet into the Basin; there are on the premises a new Store 30 feet square, 2 stories high, and a wharf attached to it; the store can be made into a good dwelling house at a small expense. Also – One acre of Land, opposite the Nine Mile River Bridge. Also, TO LET – A Grist Mill, in good order, about ¼ mile from the basin, on the Nine Mile River. Also, FOR SALE, 20 acres of Land, being part of Lot No 1, of Windsor Road Lots, bounded by the Hammonds Plains Road. Also-Part of Lot No 3, of Windsor Road Lots, containing about 250 acres, covered with hard and sfot wood, there are on the premises a good frame House and Barn, and about 25 acres fit for the plough, which cut about 14 tons of Hay; the clearing is under a good stone wall. There are also on the premises two Log houses and clearings attached to each. Also-A good Wood Lot, being part of Lot No 5 of Windsor Road, containing 50 acres. Also, a Lot of Land covered with hard and soft wood, ling between the Sandy lake and the Windsor Road, containing 73 acres. Also – A Lot of Land, being part of Lot No 6 of Windsor Road lots, having two fronts on the Hammonds Plains Road, containing 158 acres, covered well with timber; there are on the premises a House, and a considerable clearing. Any part of these lands will be sold to suit the purchaser. Terms of sale may be know by application to – THOMAS GOFF. Nine Mile House, March 11, 1840."

In 1840, Thomas N. Jeffery leased to Thomas Goff, farmer, Windsor Rd., the dwelling, farm, saw mill, mill pond and land situated on the Windsor Road known as the 30 mile house, provided that he would not use the premises as a tavern or public house, an arrangement which continued for at least two years. We have a copy of that lease, found in the home of Mr. Alex Goff. Thomas and Eleanor's 9th child was born in 1841.

(Note: Thomas Nickleson Jeffrey (1783-21 Oct 1847 Halifax), Collector of Customs in Halifax, s/o John Jeffrey of Poole, Dorset, England, m 3 May 1805 Martha Maria Uniacke (16 Oct 1785-15 Nov 1873) d/o Attorney General Richard J. Uniacke of Halifax and Mount Uniacke Hants Co. and Martha Maria Delesdernier (1762-1803, d/o the pioneer Swiss settler at Windsor Moses Delesdernier.))

According to Joan Dawson's "Nova Scotia's Lost Highways", the road out of Halifax, the Bedford Road, split at Fultz's Inn, Sackville, at Mile 12 to the Windsor Road to the left and the Truro road to the right. The Windsor Road followed the Old Sackville Road and Route 1 of today. Uniacke House is at Mile 27. Jeffrey's property at the 30-mile mark is shown on Woolford's survey map of 1818 at the present Pigott Lake, and the Newport Road (Rte 215) is at mile 35, Windsor at mile 44.

On the 19th of Aug., 1843, Thomas received a land grant of 100 acres at Guysboro Road, and appears to have moved out to this new settlement with most of his family before that time. His son William's first grant was in 1846. Thomas and Eleanor's 10th and last child (Catherine Elizabeth Pirie) was born at Guysborough Road (St. Johns Church baptism record) in 1846 (the Pirie family bible recorded her birthplace as Antrim, Halifax Co, as copied by Connie Hill).

Two receipts in the possession of Douglas Goff (originally obtained from the Thomson family) read as follows: "Jan. 3, 1842, I agree to pay Nicolas Holland the sum of two pounds for the hire of two cows for one year Halifax currency and to return them in the same order as they are at present likewise the sum of twenty four shillings Halifax currency for the hire of eight sheep for one year and to return them in the same order as they are at present. Signed Thos. Goff (X his mark), witness William Goff' and "Musquodoboit June 6 1842 Nicolas Holland to Thomas Goff Sr., 1 pair of oxen Twenty pounds. Received payment Thomas Goff (X his mark) witness William Goff'. I suspect "Musquodoboit" referred to Thomas' home on the Guysborough Road.

The New Guysborough Rd branched from the Truro Rd. at present day Waverley- the original Truro Rd (Old Cobequid Road) stayed east of Lake Thomas to present-day Fall River, then west of Fletcher's Lake along Hwy 2, whereas the Guysborough Rd went west of Fletcher's Lake and east of Miller Lake, probably Hwy 2 and then current 102, until it joined what we know as the Old Guys Rd today (Dawson). Thomas Jeffrey, Collector of Customs in Halifax, had land grants in the Guysborough Rd area (Gray & Smith). They say 1784, although that's the year he was born so they have their year mixed up there. But it was Thomas Jeffrey who leased Thomas Goff the

land for two years from 1840-42 on the Windsor Rd.

In the 1851 census Wyse's Corner, Thomas Goff & wife, 1 female under 10 (Catherine Elizabeth) 2 males 10-20 (Henry & Phillip) 2 females 10-20 (Ellen & Eliza) 2 males 20-30 (Wm., John or Thomas A.) 1 male over 50 (Thos) 1 female over 50 (Eleanor). {Note: names are just a guess, 1 of Wm., John or Thomas A., and Mary were likely on their own.} Neighbours are Alexander McMullen, John Kerr, James Kerr, \_ Leck, \_ Johnston, Thos Goff, John Miller, John Murphy, \_ Buckley, Lewis Dillman, Titus Grant, Chas Dunbrack, Alexander Grant).

Thomas Goff is in the 1861 census of Wyse's Corner sub-district, with 1 male and 2 females in the household. Philip Goff is beside him, and other neighbours include Samuel Kerr, Alexander McMullen, John Kerr, Bridget Howard, William Wyse, John Ledwedge, (Note: in the 1861 census, William Goff was enumerated with the Truro Road subdistrict, 2 males and 5 females).

Based on these names, it suggests that Thomas' home on the Guysborough Road was in the Devon/Antrim area, further east than William's grant and where the village of Goffs now resides.

Thomas died at Guysboro Road May 23, 1868. His cause of death was apoplexy (stroke). His recorded birthplace as listed in his death register was Halifax and parents were John Goff, occupation carpenter, and Ann Goff. The informant was William Goff (9 June 1868). He is buried at St. John's Anglican Cemetery, Lr. Sackville, N.S. (I. S. Smith, minister, officiating). Eleanor, wife of Thomas, died June 16, 1865 aged 65 yrs., and is buried St. John's Anglican Cemetery, Lr. Sackville.

Thomas and Eleanor raised a large family, all born at Bedford except for Catherine Elizabeth, as recorded in St. Johns Anglican Church records. Catherine Elizabeth was born at Guysborough Road (recorded as Antrim in her family bible).

On 3 May 1823 when Thomas was 26, he married **Eleanor Holland**, daughter of Johann "Matthäus" Holland (27 Jul 1755-25 Jan 1830) & Margaret Appledore (1767-17 Jan 1820)<sup>1</sup>, in Halifax by Rev. Parsons. Born in 1800 in Halifax NS. Eleanor died in Goffs, Halifax Co., Nova Scotia, on 16 Jun 1865; she was 65. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS.

The marriage of Thomas Goff to Eleanor, youngest daughter of Mathias Holland was reported in the Free Press, Tuesday, 13 May, 1823.

A marriage bond was signed May 2 1823.

Eleanor Goff, New Guysborough Rd., aged 65, buried June 4 1865, I. S. Smith, minister (St. Johns Church records).

- ii. John (1826-29 Feb 1856) Born in 1826 in Bedford, Nova Scotia. John died in Goffs, NS, on 29 Feb 1856; he was 30. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS. John was accidentally shot while hunting moose by George Logan's father (as recorded by nephew M. D. Goff, 1951) and was not married. His death is recorded in the records of St. Johns Anglican Church, Lr. Sackville, minister Thomas Maynard. His address at the time of death was Guysborough Road.
  John Goff of the New Guysboro Road had petitioned for 100 acres Crown Land to the south of the Guysborough Road near a lot granted to Timothy Sullivan, to include a wild meadow, land was "unoccupied, unimproved and ungranted". It appears from the Crown Lands Information Centre documents like he made payments 15 Dec 1854 and 19 March 1855 and then the land was granted to Henry Goff Mar 19 1856 (John died 29 Feb 1856).
- iii. Margaret (1827-7 Mar 1851) Born in 1827 in Bedford, Nova Scotia. Margaret died in Hammonds Plains, Nova Scotia, on 7 Mar 1851; she was 24. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS.

**3. William Goff** (*Thomas*<sup>2</sup>, *John*<sup>1</sup>). Born on 22 Jul 1823 in Bedford, Nova Scotia. William died in Goffs, Halifax Co., Nova Scotia, on 11 Feb 1885; he was 61. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS. Occupation: Innkeeper, Carpenter, Farmer, Justice of The Peace. Residence: Bedford, Sackville, Goffs. Religion: Anglican.

William received a land grant of 100 acres in 1846 at Guysboro Road, three years following the land grant of Thomas in 1843 in the same area. He also received grants of 112 acres in 1857 and 90 acres in 1862, and purchased Henry Goff's 100 acres in 1862. The 11 room house built by William on the south side of the Guysborough Road on his original 100 acres was to become home to four generations of Goff's. The village of Goff's, still in existence near the Halifax Airport, is named for these founding fathers and the history of the area has been recorded by Mrs. Noreen Gray and Mrs. Annie Smith in their book, "History Along the Old Guysborough Road". They write, "The Goff's farm is now gone, having become part of the Airline Golf Course. However, this family, in giving their name to the community, will long be remembered."

William and Hannah's home stood at the junction of the road from Enfield (the Oldham Road) and the old Guysboro Road near Kelly Lake. They ran a Stage Coach Inn which was no doubt a welcome sight to travellers when they finished the first part of their journey. The early days of stage coaches in Nova Scotia were described by R.D. Evans in a paper read before the Nova Scotia Historical Society on March 20, 1936 (Collections, NSHS, 1938, Vol. 24).

He reports that the semi-weekly Guysborough stage was established in 1861 by a man named Archibald and ran from Halifax to Musquobodoit, Guysborough, St. Mary's, Country Harbour, and Port Mulgrave. The coach set out from Dartmouth, through North Preston, and thence pursued a northerly course through the woods to emerge on the Guysboro Road at the Inn familiarly known as "Goff's", a name which became adopted for the local village and has carried on to the present time.

Archibald secured the mail route in 1862 along the Guysborough Road and including the Eastern Shore and Tangiers, and by 1879, the Goff's Inn had also become the area's post office which carried on at the same house until 1969. The house later became the home of James Ledwidge but has been left only in memory and pictures. Stories about the old property have appeared at least twice in Halifax newspapers. It was directly opposite to the Goff's school, which was for a period of time used as the community fire hall. A new fire hall and recreation centre has been built on the site of the Goff's school, directly opposite the site of the Goff's home. In 1990, Everill Goff and his sons Murray and Douglas donated a reprint of an original charcoal sketch of William and Hannah Goff to the Goff's Memorial Recreation and Fire Hall, where it now hangs.

William and his family also ran a lath and shingle mill. He was a skilled carpenter and his carpentry work is still in existence in the homes of some of his descendants. William was appointed supervisor of roads, Eastern district, Halifax Co., May 1865, and also acted as a Justice of the Peace in the area.

William Goff declared his birthplace as NS, nationality as Irish and religion as Church of England in the 1871 and 1881 census for Guysborough Road. Hannah declared her birthplace as NS, nationality as Scotch, and religion as Reformed (Wesleyan) Presbyterian. Despite a lifetime together, they were buried apart - William in the Anglican cemetery (St. John's) in Lower Sackville with his parents and siblings, Hannah in the Presbyterian cemetery in Meaghers Grant with her parents and siblings. William and brother Philip are on the same headstone. The inscription reads, "They were pleasant in their lives and in death were not divided." They died 6 weeks apart.


In the 1861 census, William Goff was enumerated with the Truro Road subdistrict, 2 males and 5 females. (Note: Thomas and Philip were in the Wyse's Corner sub-district). In the 1871 census Goff William 47, Hannah 44, Mary 17, Ellen 15, John 13, Alexanderina 11, William 8, Ernest 5, Clifford 3, Mary E 7, and Sarah Ann 4. Mary and Sarah Ann are William's brother Phillip's children. Ellen should be Eliza and William is William Miles Dickey.

In the 1881 census Mary 27, Eliza 24, Alexa 21 (school teacher), Dickie 19, Ernest 15, and Clifford 13 are at home. Only John had left by then. It is interesting that all the children are listed as Scottish and Reformed Presbyterian, like their mother, rather than Irish, like their father.

In addition to their seven children, a girl, Mary Jane Marshall, born in Halifax, Jan. 12, 1880, was raised in the home of Mrs. Hannah Goff. She arrived in the Goff home as a small child in need of parenting and was quickly accepted as one of the family by all the Goff's throughout her lifetime. In 1900, she married Frank MacPherson and had two children, a son, Lorne, and a daughter Jennie. One of Jennie's family, Darrel, was raised by Mary. He was a victim of polio as a youth.



Goff's Post Office Cancellation, June 2, 1880




On 5 May 1853 when William was 29, he married **Hannah Ann Dickey**, daughter of Samuel Dickey (1797-13 Apr 1872) & Alexanderina MacInnes (8 Aug 1798-1841)<sup>2</sup>, in Dartmouth, Nova Scotia. Born on 3 Aug 1826 in Glenmore, Musquodoboit, NS. Hannah Ann died in Goffs, Halifax Co., Nova Scotia, on 26 Nov 1900; she was 74. Buried in Meaghers Grant, Halifax Co., NS. Religion: Presbyterian.

In all writings of Hannah's, also the gravestone of her father Samuel and the naming of her son Miles Dickey, the spelling "Dickey" is used. I have therefore adopted that spelling for at least her father's generation, but thereafter Dickie seems more prevalent, although both can be found.



She lived in Rhode Island and Massachusetts until her retirement and then came to Milford Station, N.S. where she lived with Flora (Goff) Wardrope, her niece. She died at the Victoria General Hospital in Halifax and is buried in Milford Station. She was remembered as a stern woman of strong moral character.

Upon retirement in the early 1930's, Ernest Simpson Goff returned to live in a small house, the "House by the Side of the Road", at Goff's. He was never married. He became ill in 1936 and moved to Enfield where he died at a nursing home. His funeral was held from the home of his brother M.D. Goff in Milford Station. He was buried in Meaghers Grant near his mother and her family. His cabin was left to his niece Edna, Clifford's daughter, and was moved to Musquodoboit Harbour where Edna lived for many years. "Uncle Jerry" was remembered as a fun loving, care free person and had a warm, friendly relationship with all of his family.

Thomas and Isabella were married and had their first 5 children (Jessie, Margaret, Sarah, Nicholas Holland Howe and Thomas Henry) baptized all on Oct. 10, 1869 at St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS, I. S. Smith, officiating (parents recorded as Thomas Anthony Gough and Isabella Gough). Their son Nicholas was born in Hammonds Plains in 1867. Following this time, they moved to Almon Street, Halifax (1868-9). All of their family adopted the spelling of GOUGH, although the reason for the change is not clear.

McAlpine's 1907-08 Halifax Directory shows Gough, Alfred G, dairyman, 164 Almon; Gough, Daniel S, carpenter, 164 Almon; Gough, Isabel, wid Thomas, 164 Almon; Gough, John B, blacksmith 164 Almon; Gough, Nicholas H, carpenter 114 Almon; Gough Philip A, dairyman, 164 Almon; Gough, Thomas H, carpenter, 164 Almon.

Gough -Isabel, Henry, John, Alfred Gil, Philip and Joseph Flack (grandson) are in the 1911 census together in one household, beside William and Isabel Greening, Sarah's daughter.

On 10 Oct 1869 when Thomas Anthony was 41, he married **Isabella Boutilier**, daughter of John David Boutilier & Hannah Catherine Boutilier (18 Mar 1804-), in Hammonds Plains, N.S. Born on 21 May 1843 in St. Margarets Bay. Isabella died in Halifax, Nova Scotia, on 17 Aug 1933; she was 90. Buried in St. Johns Fairview Cemetery, Halifax,

Isabella Gough is remembered as a very strong matriarch of the family. She raised her own large family and several of her grandchildren as well, including Joseph Flack and Jean and Kathleen Gough, after their parents were killed in the Halifax explosion.

A letter from June Mortimer, wife of LeRoy Goff Mortimer, states "Roy's mother and Roy were very close to the Thomson 'girls' (note they used the older spelling). I believe there were five of them - Martha Stoddard, Alice Pulsifer, Emma Boutilier, Mary and Lina. I knew Martha, Alice, and Lina. They were lovely, lovely women. Martha Stoddard and Alice Pulsifer both had a hand in the raising of Laird Boutilier."

On 4 Feb 1890 when Mary E. (Molly) was 37, she married **Amos Thomas** in Halifax Baptist. Born on 19 Apr 1851 in Hammonds Plains, N.S. Amos died in 1904; he was 52. Buried in Hammonds Plains Baptist.

Tremaine ran a barrel factory in Hammond's Plains. There was close connection between Tremaine and the older generation of Goff's. He had no family.

**6. Henry Mattheas Goff** (*Thomas*<sup>2</sup>, *John*<sup>1</sup>). Born on 11 Apr 1833 in Bedford (Nine Mile House), Nova Scotia. Henry Mattheas died in Goffs, Halifax Co., Nova Scotia, on 24 Feb 1865; he was 31. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS. Occupation: Farmer.

The record of Henry's baptism by A.D. Gray at Sackville was located. His first marriage license, 1858, was located at the Nova Scotia Historical Vital Statistics resource, witness was Philip Goff. Henry was granted 100 acres on th south side of the New Guysboro Road, 18 June 1858, and was listed at the time as a farmer. Ann Goff died in 1860 (St. John's Church records). He married Catherine Gates in 1862, a sister of brother Philip's wife.

John Henry Goff, son of Henry and Catherine, was baptized Jan. 28, 1865 (I. S. Smith, officiating). Henry lived on Guysborough Rd. and was a farmer at that time. Note that Henry died one month later. Henry's death is recorded on 24 Feb 1865, Oldham, cause of death Neuralgia, informant Cath. E. Goff. The NS Historical Vital Statistics show a Louisa Ann Goff, b. 16 Sep. 1865, Oldham, d/o Henry Goff, farmer, and Catherine Gates, registered by Catherine Goff. Henry would have been deceased by then.

On 30 Dec 1858 when Henry Mattheas was 25, he first married **Ann Boutilier**. Born in 1841. Ann died in 1860; she was 19. Buried on 5 Sep 1860 in St. Johns Anglican, Lower Sackville, NS. Residence: Guysborough Road.

Marriage from NS Historical Vital Statistics, witness was Philip Goff. Death from St. John's Church records, W. R. Cochran, minister.

On 2 Dec 1862 when Henry Mattheas was 29, he second married **Catherine Elizabeth Gates** in Dartmouth, NS. Born on 9 Apr 1837 in New Ross, NS. Catherine Elizabeth died in Braidwood, Will Co., IL, on 9 Nov 1886; she was 49. Buried in Oakwood Cemetery, Braidwood, Will Co., IL.

"Catherine Elizabeth Gates born 9 Apr 1837 and Sarah Ann born 20 Aug 1840 New Ross Nova Scotia Canada were children of John Henry Gates (1801-1879) and his wife Harriett Ann Reece (1812-1901) who was the daughter of Jacob and Catherine Myers d 1881 at 95 years old. John Henry Gates, New Ross, was the son of Joseph Gates and Mary Ann Grogan, Lunenburg Co.There was another sister Mary Eliza b. 1849 married George Dunham lived in South Carver Mass" (Note Philip Goff had Mary Gates age 20 with him as housekeeper in 1871 census, so likely younger sister of his late wife). Also a son John Henry Jr. (hhenigar)

William John McK. Goff (illegitimate), b. 5 Feb. 1868, Oldham, Catherine E. Goff, mother (NSHVS). Curiously, it has parents marriage date as May 7, 1860, but no father or other surname listed.

27 Jan 1870 by licence Ch. Of England, Halifax, Henry Canfield Bachelor 24 res Oldham miner b. Wallace, Joshua and Isabella Canfield, parents, Farmer, married to Catherine Goff, Spinster, 26, res Oldham, John and Harriet Goff parents, farmer, Witnesses P. Goff and M. E. Gates, Rev. I. C. Cochran.

- There must be some stretching of the truth here. Catherine was actually widow, age 33, parents John and Harriett

Gates. Philip Goff was brother-in-law and Mary Gates a sister.

Sarah Sybil Canfield m. 22 Apr. 1897, Grundy, IL to Charles Henry Craver, age 33. Bride's parents Henry Canfield Maria (sic) Gates.

Henry Arnold Canfield died 27 Dec 1916, Joliet, IL, b. Nova Scotia, father Joshua, occupation barber, burial Oakwood (Illinois deaths).

In the "Descendents of Stephen Canfield" book published by Joyce Aitchison Wills and Irvine Canfield Scarlett it says Joshua H. Canfield (21 May 1811 - 4 Sept 1897) and Sibbil Anne Jeffrey of Bedeque PEI (22 Oct 1822 - 11 Nov 1908) had 11 children.

John and Ann were identified in the 1871 census in Wallace, Cumberland Co. and again in the 1880 census of Braidwood, Illinois with their mother and step father Henry Canfield. They may have gone by the surname Canfield. See above for details.

**7. Phillip Goff** (*Thomas*<sup>2</sup>, *John*<sup>1</sup>). Born on 11 May 1835 in Sackville, Nova Scotia. Phillip died in Waverly, Nova Scotia, on 26 Dec 1884; he was 49. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS. Occupation: Farmer, Day Labourer (1871 Census), Butcher (1881 Census). Residence: Guysborough Rd. (1860), Waverley.

Phillip's life was not blessed with good fortune. He was married in 1860, and they had children born in 1862, 1864, and 1865, but then the baby died, age 5 months, and their oldest child died in 1866. They had another baby in 1867, but then Sarah died April 13, 1867, a complication of the childbirth. The NS Historical Vital Statistics show a Sarah Ann Goff, b. 13 Apr. 1867, d/o Philip Goff, mail carrier, Waverley, and Sarah Ann, mother. The two remaining children were with William and Hannah in 1871. Philip declared himself as a widower in both the 1871 and 1881 census. He also declared his nationality as Irish. He ws living with Mary Gates, age 20, housekeeper, in the 1871 census (may have been his wife's younger sister or a niece?), and with daughters Mary, age 17, and Sarah, age 14, in the 1881 census. It was reported to us by his granddaughter, Gertrude Graham, that Phillip was twice married. This note was also made by Miles D. Goff in handwritten notes about his father's family. He married Kate A. Reeves in 1882 (NS marriage records) and her name was also provided by Agnes MacDonald, great granddaughter of Phillip's brother Thomas. Nicholas Gough and Maggie Gough (cousins) were witnesses. A note in the 1880 diary of William Goff recorded the visit of Uncle Phillip and Aunt Kattie on the 18th of March (but they weren't married until 1882?). A note in the same diary recorded the visit of Phillip and Sarah (daughter) on May 29, 1880 to the home of William Goff. Phillip died in 1884, aged 49. He is buried at St. John's Anglican, Lr. Sackville, and recorded on the same stone as brother William. The inscription reads, "They were pleasant in their lives and in death were not divided." They died 6 weeks apart.



On 25 Oct 1860 when Phillip was 25, he first married **Sarah Ann Gates** in St. John's Angl., Cornwallis, NS. Born in 1840 in Sherbrooke, NS. Sarah Ann died in Waverly, NS, on 13 Apr 1867; she was 27. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS.

They had the following children:

i. William Henry (Died as Child). Born in Feb 1862 in Waverley, N.S. William Henry died in Waverley, N.S., on 30 Sep 1866; he was 4. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS.

William Henry Goff, Waverly, was buried Sept. 30, 1866, aged 4 years, 7 months, I. S.

Smith, minister (St. Johns Curch records). Remembered on the same headstone as his mother Sarah Goff, formerly at St. John's Anglican Church, Lr. Sackville, NS, now lost.

**8. Eleanor** (**Ellen**) **Goff** (*Thomas*<sup>2</sup>, *John*<sup>1</sup>). Born on 22 Apr 1837 in Sackville, Nova Scotia. Eleanor (Ellen) died in Bay Of Islands (Corner Brook), Newfoundland, on 11 Nov 1877; she was 40.

"Ellen (Goff) Bambrick died 11 Nov 1877 at Bay of Islands, Newfoundland in her 40th year, w/o James Bambric, formerly of Meagher's Grant-leaving husband and five children." (Presbyterian Witness) From Provincial Archives of Nova Scotia via Cyril Cole, Jan. 7, 2015. Cyril tried to find if she had died in Corner Brook and checked cemeteries, but no luck. A few years ago he found out the old cemetery in Corner Brook had been moved. When digging up the graves, all of the gravestones were broken, believe this was in the 1960's.

Ellen and James Bambrick were living in Sheet Harbour NS, according to stated birth of dau. Elizabeth Mary in 1871 and Margaret Ellen in 1873, but they were not found in 1871 census of Sheet Harbour or any of that shore or Wyse's Corner, Little River, Meagher's Grant, Middle or Upper Musquodoboit. According to the NS Historical Vital Statistics marriage register and birth register, son David was born in Bay of Islands, Newfoundland (west coast, Corner Brook area) in 1876 and a baby daughter b. 1877 in Corner Brook, died 1879 and is bur. in Meaghers Grant - so Ellen may have died as a complication of childbirth. James was a widower in 1881 census, so perhaps they had gone to Newfoundland between 1873 and 1876, Ellen died soon after Maria was born, and James returned to his home area by 1879. James was working at lumbering in Sheet Harbour, and many men went from Nova Scotia to the Corner Brook area to be involved in the lumbering business at that time.

On 12 Jul 1866 when Eleanor (Ellen) was 29, she married **James Bambrick**, son of David Deal Bambrick (1813-31 Aug 1889) & Maria Rielly (-1850), in Dartmouth, NS. Born on 7 Mar 1840 in Meaghers Grant, NS. James died in Elderbank, Hfx. Co., NS, on 15 Aug 1917; he was 77. Buried in Elderbank, Hfx. Co., NS.

The marriage of James Bambrick 26, b. Musquodoboit, s/o David and M. Bambrick, to Eleanor Goff 28, b. Waverley, d/o Thos. and E. Goff, is recorded in the Nova Scotia Historical Vital Statistics, 12 July 1866, Dartmouth

James Bambrick's family has not been found in the 1871 census of Halifax Co.: Sheet Harbour, Wyse's Corner, Little River, Middle Musquodoboit, Gay's River. Some time between 1873 and 1876, they were lumbering in Bay of Islands, Newfoundland. After the death of Eleanor, David returned to Meagher's Grant before 1881.

Mary lived at home in Goff's, no doubt with many of the responsibilities which go along with being the eldest sister to a large family, until she was married on Sept. 17, 1888 at age 34 to Alexander J. MacDougall, of Devon, Hfx. Co. Mary's brother Miles Dickey m. Alexander's sister Martha the following day. Mary died in childbirth with their first child, 18 months later.

On 17 Sep 1888 when Mary Eleanor was 34, she married **James "Alexander" McDougall**, son of Daniel McDougall<sup>3</sup> (11 Apr 1831-1 Aug 1901) & Rachel McMullin<sup>4</sup> (1 Jan 1833-26 Mar 1915). Born in 1856 in Kempt, Hants Co., N.S. James "Alexander" died in Devon, Hfx. Co., N.S., on 15 Nov 1899; he was 43. Buried in Gays River United Church Cemetery, NS. Occupation: Farmer, McAlpine Directory, 1890 Goffs, 1896 Antrim.

The obituary of Alexander McDougall reads as follows:

"A gloom has been cast over this community by the sudden death of Mr. Alexander McDougall of Guysborough Road, which occured at his fathers home on November 15th. Mr. McDougall had been ailing for some time but his illness was not thought to be serious until Nov. 3rd; he had been to consult his physician the previous evening and

on the following day had driven some distance alone and on his return went to his parent's home close by his own place; where he was stricken with paralysis. Drs. Densmore of Elmsdale and McLean and Haliday of Shubenacadie were called but all their efforts were unavailing. The remains were interred at Gays River, and 31 carriages containing relatives and other friends followed the body to its last resting place. Rev. A. B. Dickie conducted the funeral service.

The deceased was born at Kempt, Hants County, 43 years ago, but removed with his parents when small, quite near his late home. He leaves a wife and one daughter, aged parents and four sisters to mourn the loss of a loving husband and father, a devoted son, and a kind brother. This is the fourth time that Mr. and Mrs. McDougall have been called to part with loved ones, two sons and one daughter having died some years ago and now their eldest and last remaining son. The sisters surviving are Mrs. John E. Long of Richibucto, N.B., Mrs. George Slocumb of Malden, Mass., and Mrs. Miles D. Goff and Miss Bella McDougall of Guysborough Road.

The bereaved ones feel deeply the kindness shown by their neighbours and friends in their affliction, during the painful illness friends were ready to help and sympathize with the family and the many cards of devotion proved the high esteem in which the deceased was held by those who knew him. Mr. A. Gladwin's consideration for all their wishes and his kind and sympathetic manner while performing the duties of Undertaker were appreciated by all the relatives. The pallbearers were James G. Kerr, James McMichael, John McMichael, Edwin Hirtle, Freeman Nelson, Clifford Goff."

Mr. Goff was born July 26, 1857, at Guysboro Road district, Halifax Co., NS. He left home when a young man and has resided in Somerville, Mass. for the last 40 years. A genial and kindly natured man in the home and in business, he had gained a large circle of friends.

He leaves four sons and a daughter to mourn. The children are Ralph Percy, an engineer on the Boston and Maine RR; Grant L. with the Spaulding Mfg. Co. of Chicopee, Mass.; Charles H., associated with his father in the restaurant business; Frank R. of Tiverton, NS and Mrs. May B., wife of Mr. Arthur Wenzel of West Newton, Mass. He also leaves three brothers and one sister: Ernest S. Goff of Somerville, Mass., Miles D. company in 1916, coming to us from the Davidson Rubber Company. Mr. Goff had been the foreman of our Rubber Department for 30 years.

His kindly disposition and loyal and conscientious attitude won him many friends in our organization and in the community. He was a member of the Chicopee Lodge of Masons. He is survived by his wife, Cora L. Goff, two brothers and a sister. The funeral was held at the E. A. Byron funeral home, Springfield with Rev. Robert L. Scott, officiating. June's father Charles Pearl and Charles Goff were named for the same man, Charles Pinio, who raised William Pearl, June's Grandfather.

Charles was associated with his father in the restaurant business in Somerville at the time of his father's death. There was little or no communication between he and the Nova Scotian Goff family.


Gladys Goff Willis, daughter of Clifford Goff and Charles' first cousin, lived in the same

"The Late Mrs. A. H. Mortimer,

Mrs. Alexandrina Hannah Mortimer, daughter of the late William and Hannah Goff, of Goff's, Hfx Co., passed away on July 3, 1915 at Middleboro, Mass., after an illness of about three months. The deceased was 55 years of age. A daughter, Mrs. Elsie B. Smith, and a son, Leroy; also four brothers, M. D. Goff, Clifford F. Goff, John H. Goff and Ernest S. Goff and one sister, Eliza Goff, mourn her death.

The funeral was largely attended and the floral tributes were many. She was laid to rest in Hopewell Cemetery at Rock, Mass.

Mrs. Mortimer had planned to go to California in May to make her home with her daughter and was preparing to make the trip in April, when she contracted a severe cold which developed into serious complications. Her daughter Elsie, on hearing of her condition, came east at once and has been constantly at her mother's bedside to the end. Mrs. Mortimer lived with her son, who is a traveling salesman.

Her many friends and relatives in Little River and Meaghers Grant will sympathize with the bereaved family as well as her many friends in the United States. She was a devoted mother and her sunny and kind disposition won her countless friends. Her last visit to the Goff homestead was in the fall of 1913, when she spent about 4 months at her old home.

Mrs. Mortimer has lived in Somerville and Malden, Mass., for about 30 years but has visited her old home frequently during this time. Her daughter Elsie leaves for Goffs in a few days where she will rest for some weeks."

William Miles Dickey "MD" died in Milford Station, Hants Co., NS, on 10 Mar 1960; he was 97. Buried in Gays River United Church Cemetery, NS. Residence: Goffs, Milford Station. Religion: Presbyterian (1891), United Church Of Canada. Occupation: Farmer.

Miles Dickey Goff, MD or "Uncle Dick", and Martha Jane McDougall were married in Milford Station, Hants Co., one day following the marriage of Mary Goff and Alexander McDougall. MD worked for his father's lumber business and ran a shingle factory. They lived for a short time immediately following their marriage in Oldham, Halifax Co., where their first son was born, and then in a house on the Guysborough Road, Hfx. Co., near William Goff's home, further east on the same side of the road, where their remaining two sons and one daughter were born.

In 1908, they purchased the Roland Ross farm property in Milford Station. In the 1911 census, Guy 21, John 18, and Alexander 17 are living with Miles 48 and Martha 48. Flora is boarding with a Noonan family in East Dover. They built a new house on the farm in 1916. After the death of Martha in 1925, John returned to the farm and married Hazel Wright, who came to the farm to live. John and Alex also purchased adjoining land from the Power family. They carried on a successful farm for 36 years. MD went to Saskatchewan for a summer some time after Martha had passed on. In 1944, M. D. sold the farm and moved with son John and family to a property in Milford Station next to the Milford United Church, a house which John built. He died in this house in 1960 at age 97. MD was a man of sterling character and was highly respected by all of the family members and the community at large.

"Miles Goff, 97, Dies at Milford,

Milford Station, March 15 - The death of Miles D. Goff, 97, which occurred at his home on Thursday, March 10,

brought to a close the life of one of Milford's oldest and highly esteemed residents.

Mr. Goff, who was born on June 14, 1862, was the fifth in the family of eight children born to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Goff, of Goffs, Guysborough Road. For 20 years he carried on farming and lumbering in Goffs, selling out in 1908 and coming to Milford with his wife and family. Here he purchased the Ross farm which he successfully operated until his retirement in 1944.

After retiring, he built a new home near the Milford church where he lived happily with his son John and Mrs. Goff. Four years ago he was called upon to bear the loss of his son John, who died very suddenly, but his Christian faith supported him and the excellent care given him by his daughter-in-law, Mrs. John Goff, helped to make life pleasant.

Mr. Goff was a home-loving man and was happiest there with his family, and was always pleased to welcome his friends. He was a man of strong Christian principles and convictions, and until a year ago was in attendance at all services in the Milford United Church of which he was a member. Of late, when infirmities of age prevented active participation in church and community activities, he was, nevertheless, interested in and supported all church and community work. He lived a full and rewarding life and even in the face of failing health never complained, remaining cheerful until the last.

The funeral, attended by relatives and friends from his old home in Goff's and friends from the nearby communities, was held from his late home on Saturday, March 12, and was conducted by his pastor the Rev. Russell MacLeod, who read comforting messages from the Psalms and the New Testament. He paid tribute to the Christian life of Mr. Goff and spoke of the Christian's hope in the life hereafter. The Milford Choir led in the singing of "Unto the Hills" and "O Life That Will Never Let Me Go". Burial took place in the Gays River Cemetery beside his wife who died in 1925. The many beautiful floral tributes testified to the esteem in which he was held.

Sincere sympathy is extended to the surviving members of the family, the daughter Flora (Mrs. Chester Wardrope) of Ottawa, sons Alex of Milford and Guy of Gull Lake Saskatchewan, who was unable to be present but who telephoned the family on Thursday. Also surviving are a number of grandchildren and great-grandchildren."

On 18 Sep 1888 when William Miles Dickey "MD" was 26, he married **Martha Jane McDougall**, daughter of Daniel McDougall (11 Apr 1831-1 Aug 1901) & Rachel McMullin (1 Jan 1833-26 Mar 1915)<sup>5</sup>, in Milford Station, N.S. Born on 23 Dec 1862 in Kempt, Hants Co., N.S. Martha Jane died in Milford Station, Hants Co., NS, on 19 Jun 1925; she was 62. Buried in Gays River United Church Cemetery, NS. Religion: Methodist (1891 Census).

"The Late Mrs. Dickie Goff. There passed away peacefully at her home in Milford on the evening of June 19, Mrs Dickie Goff, a highly respected citizen, and her passing is mourned by a large circle of relatives and friends. She was a sincere Christian; a peaceful loving character full of good will and charity for all humanity in the home and all around her. Her kindness will ever be remembered by all. Mrs. Goff, who attained the age of 62 years, was born at Cheverie, but had lived at Milford for the past 17 years. She leaves a sorrowing husband and two sons, John and Alex, at home, a daughter, Mrs. Chester Wardrope in the west, Carmichael, Saskatchewan, also one son in the west, Guy of Gull Lake, Saskatchewan. Also three sisters Mrs. Long of Richebucto, NB, and Mrs. Slocomb and Mrs. Prescott, both living in Massachusetts. Sympathy goes out to them all. The funeral, which was held on Sunday afternoon, was very largely attended and the collection of flowers sent by sorrowing friends was very beautiful. Services were held at the Milford Church and internment was made in Gays River. Rev. E. A. Kirker of Truro officiated at the Church and grave, in the absence of Rev. J. P. Falconer, the regular minister."

Daniel McDougall's mother was Jane Murphy, and Rachel McMullin's mother was Martha, so Martha Jane was named for her grandmothers.

Memory Gardens Cemetery, Swift Current, SK (CHRISTUS, Section 122, Plot C, Lot 3). Guy travelled by train to the Canadian Prairies on the seasonal grain excursions as a very young man, probably beginning 1912, and settled near Gull Lake, Sask. at a young age. His sister and brother John had already travelled to Saskatchewan, in her case as a teacher and John for summer grain work. Guy farmed on the 'Bench' south of Gull Lake. He was neighbours to and worked closely with the Connick family, Lester and sons Raymond, Bill and Dick. Other neighbours were the Wheelers - brothers Henry and Clyde, and later Henry's son Leonard. They moved up from Minnesota around the same time as Guy arrived in the west. The Connick farm was just a mile down the road from the Wheelers. (Note: Rod Stork is Henry Wheeler's grandson). Other neighbours included Henderson, Probert, Fralick, and Pilling. Guy farmed until 1954 at which time he retired, married Elvie Marion Borden, a native of Waterville, N.S., and moved to a small house in Gull Lake. They had an "adopted" daughter, Carole.



He later moved back to Milford Station in the village from where he continued to run the oil business for many years until retirement.

On 28 Jan 1926 when Alexander Mac was 32, he first married **Elizabeth (Bessie) Eleanor (Wardrope) Grant**, daughter of James "Edwin" Wardrope (1 Jun 1866-19 Jan 1954) & Margaret Jane Benjamin (25 Apr 1866-29 Apr 1938). In the 1901 census, Clifford was alone at the home in Goffs, with a boarder William Price, following the death of his mother in 1900. Clifford and Mary were married in 1902 and they continued to live in the house built by William and Hannah Goff on Guysboro Road where they carried on the Coach House and Post Office. Clifford and MD also ran a lath mill. In 1919, they sold the Goffs farm to James Ledwidge and moved to Elderbank where Clifford worked at farming and served as a letter carrier. Clifford died while working on a highway project in Elderbank. Mary and daughter Edna moved to Milford Station where Mary died a short time later.

In addition to the responsibilities of the Post Office at Goffs, Clifford was a mail carrier, according to the terms of the following legal documents:

- Post Office Dept., Mail Services Branch. A contract for conveying His Majesty's mail between Enfield and Goffs. Contractor Clifford F. Goff, farmer, of the village of Goffs, 3 times per week, 6 1/2 miles, \$146 per annum. From 1st Jan 1910 to 31 Dec 1913, via the Post Office at Oldham by horse and vehicle. "Leave Goffs Post Office on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday so as to arrive at Enfield half an hour before 1st mail train for Halifax is due, and return on arrival of first mail train from Halifax, performing trip in either direction within one hour and a quarter, average speed of five miles per hour, seven minutes to be allowed for changing the mail at each post office on route." Signed C. F. Goff, contractor, William Kidston, Goffs, surety, Frank McPherson, Waverley, surety, John McDowall, J.P., witness.
- A continuation of the above contract for 4 years (1914-1917).
- A continuation of the above contract for 4 years (1918-1921). \$180 per annum.

On 17 Sep 1902 when Clifford Francklyn was 34, he married **Mary Louise Greenough**, daughter of James Greenough & Eliza Warner, in Dartmouth, NS. Born on 22 Jul 1877 in West Petpeswick. Mr. Scranton retired early to devote his full time to the raising and promotion of Hereford cattle. The high quality Herefords of Scranton Park Ranch have achieved national fame. They have captured such outstanding honours as Junior Champion Male, Reserve and Grand Champion Male and best two bulls of the show at the Royal Winter Fair in 1972. Since this time Scranton Park Herefords have become famous not only in the Scranton herd but also in the herds of other breeders.

Much of Mr. Scranton's life has been spent in service to his community, his church and his fellow man. In 1936 he became the first President of the Guysborough Credit Union. At present he is on the fellowship of Deacons of the First Baptist Church in Charlottetown and Past Vice-president of the Maritime Baptist Convention.

Mr. Scranton is a gifted orator and has on many occasions received the honour of being chosen as guest speaker. Two of such occasions were the Bicentennial Celebrations for the oldest Baptist Church in Canada in Sackville, New Brunswick and the Annual Convention of the Hereford Association in 1979.

Mr. Scranton's wisdom and guidance have given encouragement to many young farmers. His endeavours range from finding a farm for a stranded immigrant, to judging livestock and poultry at the exhibitions. He has continuously, for the past 36 years, judged poultry at the Charlottetown Exhibition.

He is a Director of the Canadian Hereford Association representing Eastern Canada, a Director on the Advisory Board for Record of Performance of Beef Cattle for Canada, President of the P.E. I. Easter Beef Show and Sale and Immediate Past President of the Maritime Beef Testing Society where he has been a Director for seven years. Mr. Scranton is also a Director of the Prince Edward Island Federation of Agriculture. For 10 years he was Secretary-Treasurer of the P.E.I. Hereford Assoc.

Mr. Scranton is married to the former Helen MacKeen. They have two sons - Blair of Edmonton, Alberta and Robert of Cornwall, Ontario.

Scranton Park Ranch visitors are always given a warm welcome by both Charlie and Helen.

His enthusiasm and dedication to agriculture continues to earn Charlie the admiration and respect of his contemporaries throughout North America.

Charlie Scranton passed away Dec. 10, 2013 at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island

Charlie was named to the Order of Canada in 2007. He was inducted into the Atlantic Agricultural Hall of Fame in 1982. He has been recognized by a number of organizations including the PEI Institute of Agrologists, the Canadian Hereford Association and the PEI Easter Beef Show & Sale.

#### **Brakesman Norman Pirie Meets With Fatal Accident**

Falls between two cars and both legs severed – died at the hospital.

Norman Pirie, brakesman, met with a fatal accident this morning while in the discharge of his duty. The hour was early - 5:30 o'clock. It was dark and raining and shunting, always dangerous, was particularly so this morning. Pirie was engaged at the time disconnecting a coal hopper from a train of cars. He had accomplished the task but slipped from the other car and fell between it and the detached hopper, and the latter went over the unfortunate man, severing both legs. He was discovered on the track immediately after by his comrades.

Dr. Hawkins was summoned and he did all he could to allay the sufferings of the man, He stopped the flow of blood, and ordered the ambulance from the Victoria Hospital, and the patient was conveyed to that institution with all despach. The handsome black horse attached to the ambulance was driven at its limit and the gong sounded as it passed rapidly along the streets. The superintendent and the house surgeon had made preparations to receive the patient, and everything was done to save his life. Pirie was conscious to the last. His condition, however, was hopeless and his family was summoned. His father and mother were at the bedside when death came. The deceased was the son of Walter Pirie, switchman at North Street Depot. He was a young man of good habits and was generally well liked. He resided with his wife at 10 North Albert Street. He was married less than a year. David A.

Frank and Roy bought house together and started a business together making walk-in refrigerated coolers for restaurants. Frank was unschooled, but an excellent carpenter (although he lost 2 fingers) and mechanical person. Roy was not, but a great salesperson. They were a good team and did well until Frank had a stroke. He was sick for 5 years and didn't take the incapacitation well at all. Ada, John Farrell, and Louise Farrell (2 older sons already out on their own) moved in to help with his care and also lived upstairs.

From Robert Mortimer, "Frank lived in Mechanic Falls during the late 40's or early 50's. He worked for my father who sold commercial refrigeration and had a warehouse/workshop in Mechanic Falls. Frank worked on reconditioning used refrigerators and building walk-in coolers. He would also travel with my father throughout the state selling his products. During the early 50's Frank moved to Mass. and if I recall correctly, lived in the same house as his son Roy. Frank was a very likeable, hard-working, down-to-earth man with a great dry sense of humor. As I recall Roy, his son, was an out-going, happy-go-lucky person who, I believe worked in sales. We lost touch after the mid 50's but I have fond memories of my limited association with the Goffs."

Malden Evening News, Wednesday, April 22, 1959. Frank L. Goff, 70, of 74 Medford St., a retired contractor who worked in this area for nearly 50 years until retirement in 1952, died Tuesday at a Medford nursing home after a long illness. Mr. Goff did carpentry work in addition to general construction until poor health forced him to retire. A native of Somerville, he lived here since 1939 and previously resided in Melrose. Basil Scully died on Monday. He was 85. The native of Little Current was first heard on the radio in Sudbury. He made the jump to CKSO-TV when the first private television station in Canada signed on Oct. 25, 1953. Bas was Sudbury's first TV weatherman, a natural comedian with quick comebacks, an interesting sense of humour to say the least and a natural on-air presence. Sadly Scully's wife Dot (Dorothea) died in September. They had resided in the Lo-Ellen Park area for decades. Their home on Windle Drive was a favourite spot at Christmastime because the Scully's put up an elaborate outdoor display. Scully's long-time colleague Bill Kehoe, the first television news anchor in this city, was saddened to hear about Scully's passing. Scully was Kehoe's best man at his wedding. "Basil was a great practical joker," recalled Kehoe, in a telephone interview from the Ottawa area. "One of my favourite stories...we were conducting some kind of contest and people had to buy something from various stores and send a coupon in to the station. Entries poured in. Before the live on-air draw Scully asked Kehoe to get his fedora from a nearby office. Ten tickets from the barrel were put into the hat and Scully drew one out, announcing with his own particular sense of humour that the winner was 6 7/8. A hat size. Corny, but it worked.. "Scully had a short run at politics and ran as a PC candidate both federally and provincially. His political career was notable because ran against Lester B. Pearson in Algoma Riding in the 1958 federal election. The Liberal prime minister had been parachuted into the "safe" Grit riding. Scully "was a sacrificial lamb," recalled Kehoe. I said to him 'Basil, you haven't got a hope in hell of beating Lester Pearson'. He said 'ah, you never know, I might get something out of it'...I don't know if he ever did ever get anything out of it, but he did pretty well against Pearson, who was a pretty popular prime minister." Kehoe said there are no characters on local television now like in the "golden days" of the 1950s. Scully "represented another age," said the former broadcaster. "There were very few people as happy go lucky as he was. People have too many worries nowadays. Basil never seemed to have too many worries. Kehoe recalled that Scully wasn't even afraid of TV news manager Wilf Woodill. "We never knew if we had a job the next day, but Basil couldn't care less," said Kehoe. Judy Erola also knows first hand what a character Scully was. In those early days of television in Sudbury she was weathergirl Judy Jacobson. She had to be on her toes when Scully and her were on camera. "His comeback was never more than two seconds after," said the former federal cabinet minister and Nickel Belt MP. "He didn't have to think about it, it was right on his fingertips." Erola said they made the television rules up as they went along. Everything was live and there were jokes galore. Erola remembers one night appearing with Scully on the weather set dressed in Indian costumes. It was the start of Indian summer. "We had to come up with a gag a night and it was usually Bas's inspiration I can assure you," said Erola. Scully did get his comeuppance one night for all the practical jokes he played on his colleagues. During a live commercial promoting a new refrigerator with a water tap, staff replaced the H2O in the appliance with Tabasco sauce. Scully wasn't fazed — at least while the camera was on. "He took a sip and said 'wonderful'," said Erola. In 1965 Scully became the first director of northern programs at the Addiction Research Foundation. Scully wrote an autobiography in 1992 called Barefoot Boy with Chique. He is survived by two daughers Sheila Ethier and Brenda Laframboise, a sister, Joan Asselin, and four grandchildren, James, Alyson, Jonathan and Rosalyn. # Blue Jays 98-year-old superfan confident in team 'It's a Canadian team, and I'm really a Canadian, and a Nova Scotian'

As the Blue Jays biggest game in 23 years draws nearer, one of the team's biggest fans says there's no way they can lose.

Ninety-eight year old Alice Moore is decked out for today's big Blue Jays game. She's sporting her Blue Jays shoes, shirt and baseball cap.

Moore is keeping her cool, and her faith in her favourite team hasn't wavered.

"They're going to win, there's no doubt about it. With the enthusiasm that these young players have, and they're just going all-out today. There's no doubt about that and they're going to win."

Moore lives in a Shannex care home in the Halifax suburb of Clayton Park.

Henry Hicks was one of the most significant presidents in Dalhousie's 200-year history, overseeing nearly two decades of dramatic growth and change on campus. But he didn't do it alone. If Hicks is considered the architect of the modern Dalhousie, then Alice Moore (1917-2018), his executive secretary and confidant for 14 years, was the project manager. Moore was born in Halifax three months before the 1917 Explosion. As she neared adulthood, she took a job at Eastern Canada Savings and Loans (the precursor to Central Trust) to help earn extra money for her family following the death of her father. Starting as secretary, she rose through the ranks to become department head. She also met her future husband, Morris, at the company — on her first day of work, no less. They worked together in the same building for years, but when the company implemented a policy forbidding husbands and wives working together, Moore was let go. She was devastated, but her supervisor had an inside track on another opportunity: Dal's president was looking for a new secretary. "I said, 'I don't want to do secretary work,'" Moore recalled. "He said, 'Give it a shot.' 'Ok', I said, and he wrote me a letter of recommendation."

She got a call back from the President's Office that afternoon. It had been years since she had practised secretarial shorthand, and she was worried she'd be a bit rusty. But the skills came back quickly, and her leadership experience soon made her an invaluable asset at a key time in Dal's history.

Dalhousie was evolving rapidly in the late 1960s. Many buildings we take for granted now as stalwarts of campus life were mere holes in the ground when Moore walked to her office each morning. The Dalhousie Arts Centre and Dalplex were two spaces that

sprung out of the ground while Moore handled the heavy administrative workload — made doubly complicated by Hicks' frequent trips to Ottawa to fulfill his duties as a Canadian senator.

"It was busy in those days, when he was a senator, a lot was happening at Dalhousie" she said. "Our office held it all together." Even after her retirement Moore continued to work with Hicks, moving from their office in the administrative building — the one we now call the Henry Hicks Building — to his home office. She worked with him until the day he died in December 1990. Moore, who passed away in early 2018 at the age of 100, looked back fondly on her time at Dalhousie. She remembered when denim jeans came into fashion, and when students started wearing long hair.

"It was nice being around all the young people. Dalhousie was wonderful, it was a big part of my life," she said with a laugh, "which is great because at the time I was hired it was the last place I wanted to work."

**Vanderbilt political scientist noted for expertise on Communist China**. Derek John Waller, a retired Vanderbilt University political scientist who taught and wrote extensively about the politics of Communist China, died on Dec. 31, 2009. The Sewanee, Tenn., resident, who was 72, had suffered from pancreatic cancer.

Waller, a professor of political science, emeritus, taught Vanderbilt's first course on the Communist Chinese system of government during a time of keen American interest in China's turbulent political and cultural developments.

The British native was a graduate of the London School of Economics. He earned his master's at Indiana University and doctorate at University of London's School of Oriental and African Studies before joining the Vanderbilt faculty in 1969. Waller was conducting research in Hong Kong during the summer of 1971 when he managed to secure a visa to visit mainland China. Waller's trip occurred several months before President Richard Nixon's famed visit to the People's Republic of China.

The Tennessean later reported on his trip, noting that he had walked across a bridge into Red China. Waller was quoted in the article as saying "everyone was friendly, in marked contrast to official propaganda. There were placards everywhere condemning the United States and its policy in Vietnam." During that same trip, Waller visited West Pakistan, where he found strong evidence of "massive economic aid from Russia."

Waller was a former associate dean and director of the Vanderbilt's East Asian Studies Program. He developed Vanderbilt's International Studies Program in London and served as director of Vanderbilt-in-England.

Waller was a collector and dealer of rare books on Tibet and India. His publications included The Pundits; British Exploration of Tibet and Central Asia (1990), which was translated into Japanese, and The Government and Politics of the People's Republic of China (1981).

"Derek was a wonderful professor who was deeply admired by faculty and students," Bruce Oppenheimer, professor of political science and acting department chair, said. "He was a class act in every sense of the word and will be greatly missed."

Erwin Hargrove, professor of political science, emeritus, and former department chair, remembers Waller as "a delightful colleague who loved to travel to faraway countries, including Singapore, India and Burma. He was deeply curious and versatile in his knowledge of a wide range of subjects."

During his retirement he volunteered for the Sewanee Writer's Conference and Sewanee Elementary School and was secretary of the University of the South's Friends of the Library board.

Waller is survived by his wife, Gayle McKeen; son, Daniel; daughter, Juliet (Alan) and grandson, Eli. A memorial reception will be held in Sewanee in January at a time to be announced later.

I have a large photo of Gertrude and Clifford Eastham which I keep over my desk. They were little children at the time. Clifford died of the great Influenza epidemic after world war I. Thank you so much for your work on the family tree. I know I shall be referring to it from time to time.

I am also very interested in genealogy and I know that my grandmother Gertrude was as well. Until now however I haven't known very much about the Goffs and I had often wondered how little Gertrude and her brother Clifford managed after their mother died. Now I know it was because of the Goffs who came to the rescue. Gertrude and Frank spent some time in British Columbia "homesteading" in Pinder Harbor area. At some point they were called back to Hardwoodlands to help Rebecca MacPhee Graham with the farm there. I'm not sure of all the details. My Dad was born in N.S. in 1920 but some of his sisters were born out in British Columbia. One of my sisters lives on the Olympic Penninsula and so I have visited Victoria with her many times. I believe that Frank Gertrude and 4 children moved to So. Middleboro MA around 1922 or 1923. They were naturalized much later – Dad was about 13 or so at the time. I had always hoped I could claim dual citizenship with Canada at some point but I'm not sure it is possible.

I do not know Mary Smith or Ethel Barrows. My Mom and Dad didn't hand down much

of the information about our family to us. We got some notes from Margaret Moxom McConnell who died last year in New Brunswick. As for the Easthams, I think it is a sad tale. One of my cousins, Deborah Clark Newhall, one of Edith Graham's children, actually lives in Providence. I think she has done a lot of the research on the Eastham side of things.

I visited N.S in 1973 when I was in my early 20's and haven't been back since. I hope to go back armed with more information some day. I will keep in touch and see how to make that photo of my grandmother into an attachment for you – it is precious. I have almost no photos of everybody. Remembering Bill Blight - The Riverman

A well-known Espanole passed away just over a week ago who had a profound influence on local environmental projects. Bill Blight loved the water and spent most of his life, not only enjoying it, but also helping to preserve the environment.

William James Blight was born on February 9, 1929. He died at home on Sunday, January 25 and is survived by his wife, Shirley, and children; Faith, Jane, Bill and Jim.

Blight made the North his home and was a clerk at one of the Kalamazoo-Vegetable-Parchment logging camps when German POWs were cutting the mill's start-up logs in 1945-46. He was an employee at the mill for many years until he retired and was a very active member with the Friends of the Spanish River (FSR) as well as the Espanola Historical Society.

His work with the Friends was perhaps the most important job he took on, besides taking care of his family. Fellow Friends volunteer, Bill McKenna, said Blight was so energetic when it came to the group.

"He was our Membership Chairman for as long as I can remember. I got involved with the FSR in 1995. It was formed in 1994 and I think Bill was involved from it's inception," recalled McKenna. "He and fellow FSR member, Ed Tate, built our 32' replica pointer boat together, running between Sudbury and Espanola. We have been enjoying 'Big Red' ever since. He sure gets attention wherever we display him.

"Bill was involved in almost every aspect of the FSR and his help was really appreciated.

"One only needs to visit the website, www.friendsofthespanishriver.ca to see Bill in action is some meaningful way. "Here are some examples of what I mean: Bill's own 'Logging Days' in our new 'History' section, as well as Travels with Captain Blight, (under it's own title in our Main Menu) first appeared in the Spring 2002 issue of Kanawa

Magazine and highlights a three-day journey down the Spanish River from Espanola to Spanish in 'Big Red' with some seasoned adventurers.

"Our film, 'Muskies' on our website features Bill and some Ministry of Natural Resources biologists struggling to carefully lift large muskies from live traps in the North Channel to extract their eggs and milt to continue the planting program."

Blight was also active in other ways too, added McKenna.

"Bill never missed our annual Spanish River cleanup. There he is in our 'Year 2000 in Review' with the late Scottie Carson dredging up an old computer monitor from the Spanish River. For the last three years in a row, Bill and I exhibited at 'Earth Day' in Sudbury representing the FSR. Every year was better than the last and they were all good. We were the big winners just being a part of it!

"Bill was the type of volunteer you could always count on. He worked quietly and persistently to get whatever job we were doing done."

Besides the Friends, Blight also donated his time to other organizations, including being an active volunteer with the Espanola branch of the Victorian Order of Nurses, a part of the Spanish River Forestry Stewardship Committee and so much more.

# **Appendix 1:** The Origins of the Surname

An excellent article has just been published, shedding new light on the origins of the Goff and Gough surnames. (Goff, Phillip G. 2019. History of Gough and Goff Surnames. Journal of One-Name Studies. Vol. 16, No. 6 (Part 1), No. 7 (Part 2). Here are some excerpts from that article:

A worldwide study of the frequency of the Gough and Goff surnames points to England as the source for both family names. At the time when hereditary surnames were first adopted, the Gough surname was written as Gogh' and was restricted to western England along the border with Wales, in Shropshire and Herefordshire The Goff surname was spelled as Goffe and stretched from Dorset to Essex, and perhaps to Norfolk. In addition, the Goffe family was also centered in Warwickshire and its neighbors, Worcestershire and Northumberland, in the center of England.

Gough is a surname derived from a nickname. Surname dictionaries describe Gough as being derived from the Welsh word coch or goch, meaning red, which likely signified someone with red colored hair or complexion. By the 17th century, Gough was the nearly universal spelling of the surname in England. The surname had evolved from Goch (pronounced gōkh) to Gogh and finally to the modern form of Gough (pronounced gof), in use today.

The Goffe surname appears in many counties in the 13th and early 14th centuries, also at the dawn of hereditary surnames. Surname dictionaries as early as 1605 have identified the Goff/e surname as being derived from the Celtic or Welsh word for "smith", likely referring to an occupational affiliation, the blacksmith. However, geography makes it improbable that a Celtic word would be the origin of the Goff/e surname. The earliest known attested instances of the Goff/e surname, in the 13th and 14th centuries, do not overlap with the geography of Celtic-speaking populations. Occupational data in the 14th century Poll Tax and Lay Subsidy Rolls further tilts the odds against Goff/e being derived from the occupation of smith. There are two likely, interrelated origins: Goff/e as a godefader (godfather) and an older respected male; and, derived from a pet form of the Middle English Given name of Godefrido or Galfrido. Godefrido appears in the Goff/e geographical footprint at the right time. The name goffe for godefader appears in an English-Latin glossary within two centuries after Goff/e seems to have been adopted as a surname. However, to appear in this glossary it would seem reasonable to assume the word Goffe, meaning godefader, had been in use earlier. Interestingly, both Godefrido and godefader have "God" as the root word for the first syllable. The second half of Godefrido means peace. The shared root word may hint at that both words are sources for the Goff/e surname.

An analysis of nearly 5,000 English baptisms for the period 1538 through 1837 shows a strong correlation between the dropping of the "e" in Goffe with overthrow of the monarchy in 1649 and its restoration in 1660. In 1653, Oliver Cromwell, one of the 59 Regicidal judges who condemned Charles I to deatj, was appointed Lord Protector. Two of the other judges who signed the death warrant were Edward Whalley, first cousin of Cromwell, and Whalley's son-in-law, William Goffe. The Cromwell family connection was convenient for Whalley and Goffe as long as Cromwell lived, but shortly after Cromwell died in 1658, the monarchy was restored. Charles II, the son of the executed king, began his reign in May 1660. At the restoration of the monarchy, 24 of the judges, or Regicides, were already deceased, 16 had left the country and 19 remained in England. It was generally understood that death warrants would be taken out on the surviving Regicides. On 6 June 1660, Charles II summoned Whalley and Goffe, and the other judges, to appear before him in two weeks' time. Whalley and Goffe fled England for America, arriving in Boston on 27 July 1660. Goffe and Whalley were pursued under warrants for their arrest for the

remainder of their lives. They were protected by local residents in New England and never captured. The year 1660 also marked a shift in the spelling of the surname from Goffe to Goff. In some cases, the change may have been influenced by a fear of a perceived family connection with Judge William Goffe following the restoration of the monarchy. Such a concern would not have been without merit. By the time of the 1841 England census, about 85% of the Goff/e population used the Goff spelling. In most families, the surname had evolved from Goffe (pronounced gof-ə) to Goff (pronounced gof), which is still in use today.

# **Appendix 2:** The Holland Family

**Johann "Matthäus" Holland** (son of Johann "Matthäus" Holland(t)-Merten and Christina "Barbara" Kramer). Born on 27 Jul 1755 in Rotterode, Hessen-Kassel, Germany. Johann "Matthäus" died in Halifax, Nova Scotia, on 25 Jan 1830; he was 74. Buried on 28 Jan 1830 in Little Dutch Church Cemetery, Halifax, N.S. Occupation: Nailsmith; Soldier In Regiment Von Stein;. Residence: 1776-8 New York; 1778 Halifax; Land Grant At Nine Mile River, Hfx. Co.

AN HISTORICAL NOTE ON THE ACADIAN RECORDER from Genealogical Association of Royal Nova Scotia Historical Society 1978. Publication #1, N.S. Vital Statistics from Newspapers 1813-1822.

The Holland family of the Recorder was founded in Nova Scotia by Matthaeus (Matthew) Holland. He was a native of Rotterterode (actually "Rotterode"), in the Landkreis of Hersfeld (actually Hersfeld was the place of the garrison, in Hessen-Kassel, the Landkreis of Rotterode is Schmalkalden the Exclave including Amt Hallenberg, note from Rolf Wahl), in Hesse-Cassel (actually "Hessen-Kassel"), and a veteran of service in the fourth company of the Regiment Von Seitz during the later part of the American Revolutionary War. In the early summer of 1783, when the Revolution was, in fact, ended, Holland was reported as having left his regiment. He died at Halifax on 28 January 1830, aged 74. By his marriage, 3 June 1784, to Margaret Appledore (died 17 January 1820, aged 53), there were six children.

He is buried in the old Dutch (Deutsch = German) Church cemetery in Halifax.

I received a most interesting letter (28 Jan 2010) from Rolf Wahl (wahl-rolf@t-online.de) from Jena, Germany, formerly of Steinbach-Hallenberg, Hessen-Kassel, Germany. He is a historian who has researched the 120 soldiers from this area who were part of the Garisionsregiment von Sten/von Seitz/von Porbeck. They were in New York 1776-1778, then Halifax 1778-1783. All but 3 soldiers (Valentin Hilpert, Matthäus Hollandt and Georg Häfner) returned to Hallenberg in 1783.

"The Steinbach-Hallenberg area was part of former "GDR". In this period - it was not permitted to communicate with the archives in West-Germany. I started my researching after the fall of the wall. I learn now more and more about the time in Halifax/Nova Scotia of our soldiers. I looking also after still living descendants of our deserted soldiers. I am also a Descendant of a soldier, which was soldier of the Seitz-Regiment of 1776 to 1783 in New York and Halifax. His name was Johannes Jägerand Private in the 5.Company. I have already contact to Ron Helpard - Descendant of Valentin Hilpert."

Mr. Wahl sent me several maps and documents, including the ancestral information about Matthäus Holland in Steinbach and Rotterode, Hessen-Kassel, Germany, also "transkription of parish register year 1755 (including number 51 Johann Matthäus Hollandt (see the difference to number 54 here another father Matthäus Holland -> Holland without "t" to end). There are two different family names in the Hallenberg area." Later (16 Feb, 2010) he sent several documents showing that the familial surname was actually Holland(t)-Merten, along with various Church registers. Also a very intersting original instructure of 1784 - "in summary it was forbidden to get post (mail) from America for the townsfolk of Hessen-Kassel after the American War time. It is possible the family of the deserted soldiers have never had contact thereafter."

Most soldiers of the 4th company were of Schmalkalden and the towns thereabouts (Trusen, Asbach, Brotterode, Seligenthal, Floh, Struth etc.). Most soldiers of the 5th company were of Steinbach, Rotterode, Altersbach, Herges, Oberschönau, Unterschönau, Herges, Berbach and Springstille = all the places of the Hallenberg area. All these soldiers have visited the same school and the same church, your ancestor Johann Matthäus Holland-Merten is baptised here:

From a "List of German Settlers at Nine Mile River in the Province of Nova Scotia", document from the Nova Scotia Archives dated Halifax 26 May (17)84, "Private Holland" with one man, one woman and one child. This Nine Mile River grant was in Halifax Co., to the east of Halifax City, in the present Beechville area off the St. Margarets Bay Road. Rolf also sent me (15 Nov 2012) a document from the German archives, which was a copy of the original report to the Landgrave of Hesse-Kassel, dated July 1783, which listed 24 soldiers who had deserted in Halifax - Mathias Holland (sic) was named on the list.

A letter addressed to Mrs. William Pulsifer (Alice Thomson, d/o Mary Goff and Charles Thomson) Sept. 18, 1913 from St. Georges Rectory read: "Dear Madam, I am pleased to be able to forward you the birth of John Nicolas Holland. He was the son of Matthias and Margaret Holland and was born on June 25 1796. His sponsors were John Nicolas Smith, Henry Miller and Harriett Theiss. There were several other children besides Nicolas, such as Catharine Barbara and John Philip. Thanking you for the fee. I am yours truly, A. W. Cunningham." A following letter addressed to Mrs. Pulsifer Sept. 26, 1913 from St. George's Rectory read "Dear Madam, Following are the names and dates of birth of the other Holland children in the old register: Catharine Barbara, 21 August 1784; Anthony 25 Nov. 1785; X; Catharine Elizabeth 30 January 1791; John Philip 24 June 1793; John Nicolas 25 June 1796. Matthew Holland died Dec. 12, 1784 age 2 years 1 month 1 week. There is a gap from 1785 to 1791 and I think some other children must have been born but I cannot find them. Yours truly, A. W. Cunningham"

On 3 Jun 1784 when Johann "Matthäus" was 28, he married **Margaret Appledore** in Halifax, St. Georges (Little Dutch Church). Born in 1767. Margaret died in Nine Mile River, Hfx. Co., NS, on 17 Jan 1820; she was 53.

There is a marriage for Christa (Christopher) Appledore to Sarah (or Clara) Miller (Meuller) on May 1, 1763 at St Paul's Church, in the book "Baptisms, Marriages and Burials, 1749 -1768, St Paul's Church, Halifax, Nova Scotia." by Jean M Holder. They later located to Lunenburg where they had baptized, a daughter, Mary Margaret Appledor on April 29, 1766 (St John's Anglican Lunenburg records, parents Chris and Clara). This may be Margaret Appledore who married Matthias Holland. Christopher Apfeltor was listed as a member of the Zion Lutheran Church, Lunenburg in 1775. I don't know where Christopher Appledore came from, Appledore appears to be an English surname (information from Dorothy Selig, dlselig@ns.sympatico.ca, April, 2010).

Her death is recorded in the Acadian Recorder, 17 Jan 1820, Nine Mile River, Halifax Co., age 53, hence the birth year of 1767, although the Mary Margaret Appledor above would also fit.

"Died, at her son's house, Nine Mile River on Monday evening last, in the 53rd year of her age, after a long and painfil illness which she bore with true Christian fortitude and resignation to the divine will, Margaret, consort of Mathias Holland."

Otherwise no information about an Appledore family has yet been found.

They had the following children:

- Matthew (Died as Child). Born on 5 Nov 1782 in Halifax, N.S. Matthew died in Halifax, N.S., on 12 Dec 1784; he was 2.
   The death of Matthew Holland in Dec. 1784, age 2 years, 1 month, 1 week, 0 days, was recorded in the old registry of St. Georges Rectory, as copied in letter to Mrs. Alice Pulsifer, 1913 (see Matthias Holland, father). In May, 1784, Matthias Holland was recorded as living with one child, and Catherine Barbara was not born until Aug. 1784.
- ii. Catherine "Barbara". Born on 21 Aug 1784 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. On 22 May 1821 when Catherine "Barbara" was 36, she married Samuel Courtney in Halifax NS.
   The Acadian Recorder of Sat., 26 May 1821 reported the marriage by Rev. Twining of Mr. Samuel Courtney and Barbara Holland. Marriage bond dated May 22, 1821, signed

by Samuel Courtney, Nine Mile River, paper maker, and Anthony Holland, Halifax, printer, for the marriage of Samuel Courtney to Barbara Holland (NSHVS).

The Acadia Paper Mill is believed to have been founded about 1819 by Anthony Henry Holland on the Nine Mile River, near Bedford Basin. Holland needed paper for his newspaper, the "Acadian Recorder" which he was publishing at nearby Halifax. According to the noted paper historian, Dard Hunter, this was the second paper mill established in Canada. Early papermakers at this mill included John Campbell (who married Catherine Elizabeth Holland in 1821); Samuel Courtney (who married Barbara Holland in 1821) and William Fudge (who married Julia Webber in 1827).

- iii. Anthony Henry. On 22 Dec 1816 when Anthony Henry was 31, he married **Eliza**Merkel, daughter of John Merkel & Catherine Barbara (1770-15 Mar 1833), in By Rev.

  Wright. Born in 1792. Eliza died in Shelburne, NS, on 2 Jan 1863; she was 71. They had the following children: Child (Died as Infant) (3 Aug 1817-); Sophia Hawkins (Died as Infant) (19 Sep 1819-9 Oct 1819); William J. E. (1826/7-7 Mar 1875). See biography below.
- iv. Catherine Elizabeth. Born on 30 Jan 1791 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. NSHVS, "Catherine Elizabeth, daughter of Matthew and Margaret Holland, was baptized by the Reverend Bernard Michale Houseal, Minister and Pastor of the German Congregation on the 30th day of January, 1791. I certify that the above is faithfully extracted from the Register of baptisms kept by the late Rev. Bernard Michael Houseal and now in my possession. Benj. G. Gray, Missionary to the Germans, St. George's Church, Halifax, 2 May, 1821."

Marriage bond, John Campbell, Paper Maker, and Catherine Elizabeth Holland, 2 May 1821.

"Married, on Wednesday evening by the Rev. B. G. Gray, Mr. John Campbell to Catherine Elizabeth, daughter of Mathias Holland of this town."

On 2 May 1821 when Catherine Elizabeth was 30, she married **John Campbell** in Halifax, St. Georges, Rev. B. G. Gray. Occupation: Paper Maker.

- v. Philip John. Born on 24 Jun 1793 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Philip John died in Halifax, NS, on 27 Feb 1837; he was 43. Buried in Old Dutch Cemetery, Halifax. Occupation: Printer; Properietor Of The Acadian Recorder (1822-1836). On 24 Jun 1823 when Philip John was 30, he married **Sarah Ann Smith**, daughter of Thomas J. Smith (1767-1823) & Catherine Vollmar (20 Feb 1773-21 Nov 1864), in St. Pauls Church Halifax By Rev. Dr. Inglis. Born in 1803. Sarah Ann died in Halifax, NS, on 25 Feb 1842; she was 39. Buried in Old Dutch Church, Halifax. They had one child Jane (Died as Child) (Sep 1826-23 Mar 1830).
- vi. John "Nicholas". Born on 25 Jun 1796 in Halifax, N.S. John "Nicholas" died in Bedford, Nova Scotia, on 2 Jul 1866; he was 70. Buried in Hammonds Plains Anglican Cemetery, Hfx. Co., NS. Occupation: Farmer (1826). Residence: Windsor Road (1826). A marriage bond (NSARM) was signed May 17, 1826, between Nicholas Holland, Windsor Road, bachelor, farmer, and Mary Goff, spinster.

Death is recorded in the NS Historical Vital Statistics, s/o Matias and Margaret, cause of death "disease of kidneys", married, age 70.

Their headstone names Nicholas Holland and Mary Goff.

vii.

On 20 May 1826 when John "Nicholas" was 29, he married **Mary Goff**, daughter of John Goff & Mrs. Anna McCormack. Born on 10 Jun 1799. Mary died in Hammonds Plains, N.S., in 1890; she was 90. Buried in Hammonds Plains Anglican Cemetery, Hfx. Co., NS.

Mary Holland, age 82, was listed in the 1881 census of Hammonds Plains, as a widow, nationality Irish, living with Charles and Mary Thomson (her niece). This is good evidence of John's origin, as little other evidence has been found, other than family tradition. We are unsure of any family, although suspect they had no children. Eleanor. Born in 1800 in Halifax NS. Eleanor died in Goffs, Halifax Co., Nova Scotia, on 16 Jun 1865; she was 65. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS. On 3 May 1823 when Eleanor was 23, she married **Thomas Goff**, son of John Goff & Mrs. Anna McCormack, in Halifax by Rev. Parsons. Born on 14 Jun 1796 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Thomas died in Guysborough Road, Halifax Co., Nova Scotia, on 23 May 1868; he was 71. Buried in St. Johns Anglican Church, Lower Sackville, NS. Occupation: Businessman, Tavern Keeper, Miller, Husbandsman. Residence: Bedford, Sackville, Goffs. Religion: Anglican.

Johann "Matthäus" Holland(t)-Merten (father of Johann "Matthäus" Holland). Born in 1710 in Steinbach, Hessen-Kassel, Germany, son of Johann Holland(t)-Merten and Anna Catharina Drechsler. Occupation: Nailsmith And Trader Of Nail Goods. Residence: Steinbach, Hessen-Kassel, Germany. On 2 Jun 1746 when Johann "Matthäus" was 36, he married Christina "Barbara" Kramer in Steinbach-Hallenberg, Hessen-Kassel, Germany. Johann Matthäus Holland-Merten of Steinbach-Hallenberg moved after the wedding with Christina Barbara Kramer to Rotterode (Rolf Wahl, 16 Feb. 2010).

Christina "Barbara" Kramer (mother of Johann "Matthäus" Holland). Born on 19 Jun 1719 in Rotterode, Hessen-Kassel, Germany, daughter of Quirin Kramer (Mayor (Schultheiß) of Rotterode -> working in order of the "Sovereign of Hessen-Cassel") and Margaretha Weißheit (Born in Struth-Helmershof). Christina "Barbara" died in Rotterode, Hessen-Kassel, Germany, on 27 Dec 1757; she was 38.

Anthony Henry Holland (son of *Johann "Matthäus" Holland*). Born on 25 Nov 1785 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Anthony Henry died in Birch Cove, Bedford Basin, Nova Scotia, on 10 Oct 1830; he was 44. Buried in Old Dutch Church Cemetery, Halifax, NS. Occupation: Properietor, Acadian Recorder (1813-1824).

Anthony Henry Holland (1785 - 1830) was the founder and outspoken editor of the Acadian Recorder, one of the province's first newspapers. The biography of Anthony Holland can be found in the Dictionary of Canadian Biography, written by Miss Gertrude Tratt. A biography can also be found in "Genealogical Association of the Royal Nova Scotia Historical Society, 1978, Publ. #1, N.S. Vital Statistics from Newspapers, 1813-1822." These provide a moe complete picture of his talents as a newspaper editor. A picture of Anthony Holland can be found in the Collections of the Nova Scotia Historical Society, Vol. 17, 1913. An oil painting of Anthony Holland hung in the sitting room at the farm of M. D. Goff in Milford Station, NS, that had been passed through the generations. Everill Goff remembers "That room was on second floor. It had a couple of rocking chairs and a couch in it. I was born in that room. It was a wonderful place to relax and read."

Anthony Henry Holland, proprietor of the Acadian Recorder in Halifax, decided to start a paper mill to supply paper for his newspaper and pamphlets from his press, due to unreliable supply from American sources. He did so in 1819 on the west side of the head of the Bedford Basin at the Nine Mile River (formerly Salmon River on Woolford's map, see below), near the intersection of the Hammonds Plains Road (Mill Cove; present day Millview). The "Acadia Paper Mill" stood upstream from Mill Cove on the river. He received the grant of land for the mill from William IV, signed by John Spry Morris. The site was chosen because of the water power Nine Mile River would provide (Tolson). According to the noted paper historian, Dard Hunter, this was the second paper mill established in Canada (www.hughespaper.com). There were already inns at the mouth of the Nine Mile River along the Halifax-Bedford Road when Holland built his paper mill on the river at the foot of what later became Paper Mill Lake, after the river was dammed (Tolson).

In 1818, John Elliott Woolford published a small book of road maps entitled "Survey of Roads from Halifax to Truro and Halifax to Windsor". The maps laid out in great detail the terrain and the erected structures as found at that time. According to Woolford's map, the road to Hammonds Plains veered to the left immediately south of the Salmon River and just north of Mile 8 (now it is north of the river). The "New Inn" is shown to the south of the river and the Tan Yard and Andrews Inn to the north. The Sackville Bridge, barracks and other establishments are at mile 10 1/2, but the 9 Mile mark per se is shown part way between the Salmon River establishments and the Sackville bridge establishments, with nothing between. Hence, this may have led to confusion regarding the Eight Mile House and the Nine Mile House, which may have referred to the inns on either side of the Salmon River and therefore very close to each other. (Dawson)

Acadian Recorder, Jan. 9, 1819, "Rags, rags, rags. The Subscriber intending to erect a Paper Mill, the ensuing season, he requests families to be careful of their Linen and Cotton rags. A person will be employed in the spring to collect them through the town. In the mean time they will be taken in (and a liberal price given) at No. 1, Corner of Duke and water Streets. –A.H.Holland."

"The first storey of the mill was constructed of quarried stone, mortared, with heavy hand-hewn beams, fastened throughout with pine pins. Ceiling joists were particularly strong in order to support the weight of wet paper stored above. Wooden slats, like venetian blinds, formed the walls of the upper storey to give ventilation for drying the paper that was stored when wet. Water power was directed through wooden sluices from various dams on the river. The paper was made of rags, and John Willis, the ragman, who had a warehouse on north Hollis St., advertised for rags, clean linen or cotton, gathered and delivered them to the paper mill. There the smelly mess of old rags, waste paper and garbage was mangled and mashed together in molasses. This was flattened out in sheets and dried in the loft" (Tolson). Power for the mill was furnished by a twenty foot breast wheel, eight feet wide and one small over shot eight feet in diameter and four feet wide. No steam was used in the mill and the stock was cooked in a large open pot over a fire. It was then loft dried. The paper machine used was a thirty-six inch one with a fire drier. (www.hughespaper.com)

Early papermakers at this mill included John Campbell (who married Catherine Elizabeth Holland in 1821); Samuel Courtney (who married Barbara Holland in 1821) and William Fudge (who married Julia Webber in 1827) (www.hughespaper.com). Catherine Elizabeth and Barbara were sisters of Anthony Holland, the proprietor.

In 1823 the Legislature saw fit to grant 100 pounds towards the upkeep of the mill. By then, Mr. Holland was living in his home near the mill, and the Nine Mile House was known then as the Mill Inn or Holland's Inn." (Tolson)

The Nine Mile House had been in existence as a Public House for some years prior to Holland's mill development. "May 15, 1819. The Mill Inn, formerly the Nine Mile House. Emanuel Williams begs leave to acquaint the ladies and gentlemen of Halifax that he has opened the above well-known and pleasant situated house as a Public Inn, and has fitted it up in a superior style to accommodate those who may favour him with their countenance and support. Dinner parties will be accommodated at the shortest notice, and furnished with every luxury the country affords. The choicest wines and liquors will be constantly at hand. Travellers and lodgers will find clean beds and comfortable

apartments; good provender and stabling for horses, and an attentive and careful groom. Nothing will be wanting to render the stay agreeable." In December, 1822, the Bedford Road was the busiest in the province. The inn was on the lower side of the road, a few yards from the later Moir's Chocolate Factory. The dinner parties were superb and the Nine Mile Inn was the place to go! (Tolson).

"In 1822, Holland added his brother Philip John and a friend, Edward A. Moody, as partners, and two years later left the newspaper business to them. Philip John continued until 1836, when he sold the Recorder to Edward A. Blackadar and John English. From 1814, (AH) Holland had also issued a yearly almanac, the Nova Scotia Calendar, which was carried on by his brother until 1832" (Tratt). (Note: John English was a witness to the 1830 lease of AHH's inn (Nine Mile House) and lands (1000 acres) from Eliza Holland, Philip John Holland and James William Merkel to Thomas Goff). Thus by 1823, it seems Anthony Holland had left Halifax and the daily operations of the newspaper and relocated to Bedford, where he ran the paper mill and purchased the Nine Mile House Inn and other related properties (Tratt). By 1830, when he accidentally died in a driving accident from the fall from a horse, his property totaled 1000 acres and included the Nine Mile House, a cottage, blacksmith shop, and various outhouses, barns, stables and other buildings in and around Mill Cove, to the west and north of the Basin (Tolson).

Thomas Goff married Anthony Holland's sister in 1823. From ~1820 - 1830, Anthiny and Thomas were involved together in the paper mill and other business ventures. In 1830, following Anthony's death, Thomas leased much of Anthony's business holdings and property from the estate and assumed operations of the Nine Mile House.

Anthony Holland also owned land at mile 21 of the original road from Sackville (the split) to Truro on the west side of Fletchers Lake (Dawson). She describes "Blade's Inn, on a property owned by Anthony Holland, printer, founder and editor of the Acadeian Recorder. It was in the Acadian Recorder that Blades' advertised in 1817 "The Subscriber informs the public that he has taken that convenient STAND on the COBEQUID ROAD belonging to Mr. Holland and has opened a House of Entertainment. He will keep good LIQUORS and strict attention will be paid to his STABLES." She goes on, "The Holland name persists on this part of the old road, which today is identified as the Old Holland Road."

AN HISTORICAL NOTE ON THE ACADIAN RECORDER from Genealogical Association of Royal Nova Scotia Historical Society 1978. Publication #1, N.S. Vital Statistics from Newspapers 1813-1822.

When Anthony Holland founded the Acadian Recorder on 16 January 1813, Nova Scotian journalism entered upon its second phase of development. The older newspapers had been too sensible of their indebtedness to the administration of the day to risk the expression of critical opinion. The Gazette was the governmental organ, its publisher being generally also the King's Printer. The Halifax Journal and the Weekly Chronicle were circumspect, and their publication did not in the least offend the local oligarchy. In agreement with the government and with one another, the established newspapers were content to treat the public to accounts of the latest British victory over Napoleon.

Holland was 27 years old, Halifax-born, and the son of German settlers. He was named in honour of Anthony Henry, an earlier German printer in Halifax. He was not especially a rebellious young man, but he did believe in progress and improvement. He was in the Whiggish tradition of Charles James Fox, Lord Holland. One member of the Holland family, whether inspired by the politics or the coincidence in names, gave his son the name, Charles James Fox Holland, in 1813.

Anthony Holland wanted to see his town and province become up-to-date, for the area was sadly backward and appeared to be reluctant to change.

The new editor went to work with a sense of having a mission to educate his contemporaries. He included letters from the public in his columns, and he printed discussions upon topics of the day. Everyone may not have liked this, but people got the Acadian Recorder in order to read the latest controversies. In 1818, Holland had to appear at the bar of Assembly for some criticisms of members, and received a short imprisonment in consequence. A few years later, a pamphlet from Holland's press landed its author, William Wilkie, a term of two years imprisonment with hard labour. It was a dangerous climate in which to publish anything that challenged the existing state of affairs. Holland did, however, create a demand for more reading material, and this in its turn necessitated the founding of

other newspapers and even a monthly magazine.

During its first decade, the Acadian Recorder published two series of letters which have a place in the literary history of Nova Scotia, both for their philosophy and their content. A Scot, John Young, wrote his valuable 'Letters of Agricola' upon agriculture beginning in 1818. Young's comments illustarte the backwardness of local farming methods. "The principles of vegetation," said Young, "were so grossly misconceived that few even of the farmers imagined that plants, like animals, stood in need of food". As to the use of equipment, 'Agricola' found it almost unknown: "Even a common roller was a wonder, and there were counties that could not furnish one of them." Beginning late in 1821, Holland published the remarkable series of 'Letters of Maphibosheth Stepsure' from the pen of another Scot, Rev. Thomas McCulloch. These epistles cast the blame for much of the province's backwardness where it belonged, at the doors of the people themselves. In this satire, M'Culloch criticised the waste of time and money on gossip, idle travel, and the desire to possess luxuries before the necessities had been provided. The Acadian Recorder endured for many years, and to an end only after three decades of the twentieth century had elapsed. When the Recorder finally was discontinued, the western world was in the grip of the Great Depression. For a newspaper to run from two years before Napoleon's fall to two years before Hitler's rise was no mean achievement. The course set for it in the first decade or so by Anthony Holland had given it an excellent start. If, when it perished nearly 120 years later, the Acadian Recorder had grown old-fashioned, that was not the fault of its first proprietor, who had been a forward looking man.

# Appendix 3: A Brief Ancestry of Alexanderina MacInnes

# First Generation

**1 Alexanderina MacInnes.** Born on 8 Aug 1798 in Lower Meaghers Grant, NS. Alexanderina died in Glenmore, Musquodoboit, NS, in 1841; she was 42. Buried in Meagher's Grant, NS. Ca 1823 when Alexanderina was 24, she married **Samuel Dickey**.

# Second Generation

**2 Miles MacInnes.** Born ca 1754 in Camucross, Sleat, Isle Of Skye, Scotland. Miles died in Meaghers Grant, NS, in 1818; he was 64. Residence: North Carolina (1774), Halifax (1784).

Lieut. Miles MacInnes, by Flo Dickey, Tucson, AZ.

Miles MacInnes departed from the Isle of Skye, Scotland to North Carolina in 1774. It has been said that he was born at Camucross, Sleat, Isle of Skye. It is also possible that he was born at North Uist. It is very possible that he was a son or close relative of John MacInnes (MacGinnis) who was the boatman for Flora MacDonald and Bonnie Prince Charlie, but I have not found any documentation to prove any of the above as yet.

Miles arrived in North Carolina in 1774 with enough money to purchase livestock and operate a plantation of 1800 acres in Anson County, North Carolina. He grew apples, peaches, wheat, corn, rye, and oats. He raised cattle, horses, sheep, and hogs. The nearest villages were Cross Creek and Campbelltown (which were merged about 1778 under the name of Campbell- town was then changed to Fayetteville in 1783). Miles probably purchased goods from this village. It was a thriving trade center with mills, pharmacy, courthouse, hotel, and general store.

Miles was appointed a lieutenant by his regiment leader Colonel Hector McNeil. He served under Captain Allen MacDonald who was commander of the Anson Battalion that was in the battle of Moore's Creek Bridge. Miles future father-in-law, Captain Angus MacDonald and Angus's son, Angus, also served in this battalion.

When the North Carolina governor called up the Highland settlers of his Province, he expected that they would march about one hundred miles to the sea-coast where British ships would arrive to transport them to Nova Scotia and they would be given training and arms in order to defend their country against rebels. But this was not the case. Before the Highlanders reached the coast of North Carolina they met a smaller and much better armed body of Yankee rebels. Unfortunately for these Highlanders, less than half were armed and those classed as "armed" had nothing other than swords. The battle took place at Moore's Creek Bridge February 27, 1776. In the brief battle Highlanders were outmaneuvered by the highly skilled Americans. A few were killed and more than 800 taken prisoners. Included among the prisoners were Allen MacDonald of Kingsburgh and his two sons, our Capt. Angus MacDonald, and our Lieut. Miles MacInnes. Since there were so many prisoners and not nearly enough Yankees to guard them, the younger men were released. They were told to go home and think about joining the Yankee cause. Some of the Highland prisoners escaped.

Miles MacInnes was among those captured. He was carried to the Cross Creek jail where he was "loaded with irons and suffered many cruelties." When word came of the approach of a large British force, the rebels removed his chains and he made his escape to the British Army.

Miles MacInnes continue to serve as a lieutenant in the British forces under Colonel Ray. He served on active duty in the Carolinas, Georgia, and Florida, until 1783. For the last few months of his military service he was in St. Augustine, Florida.

Miles' property was confiscated. After the war he went to London to present his claims for losses suffered in North Carolina arriving December 9, 1783. He had excellent references and letters of recommendation from high officials, but things moved slowly. In late summer 1784, (nearly a year later) he was awarded about 45% of his losses and given permission to emigrate to Nova Scotia, where he had friends and connections. His old unit and the 84th Royal Highland Emigrant Regiment had been sent there a few years earlier and mustered out at Windsor, Nova Scotia at the end of the war. The soldiers were given land in Nova Scotia provided they stayed.

After the deportation of the French Acadians, the British offered free land and vacant farms in Nova Scotia to anyone willing to settle. Many New Englanders, including our Dickeys and other groups from Scotland, the British Isles, and German states along the Rhine came to settle. Two hundred Scots settled at Pictou, Nova Scotia in 1773 from the ship Hector. They were the first of a vast wave of Highlanders who crossed the Atlantic seeking a better life. These Highlanders settled mainly on Cape Breton and Prince Edward Island.

In 1775, when the Revolution broke out in America, it seemed likely that Nova Scotia would join the other thirteen colonies. This did not happen. It remained a Crown Colony and thus Nova Scotia became one of the main receiving points for the flood of Loyalists who fled the new United States after the war. In all, about 30,000 people settled in Nova Scotia mainly along the Atlantic Coast. The arrival of so many people, some of them very influential, transformed Nova Scotia into a busy Crown Colony.

Megher's Grant was a grant of land comprising about 9000 acres near Halifax. For the purpose of colonization, this land was granted to "Bachelor Meagher" a Major in the British Army in 1765. One of these Loyalist colonists was our Miles MacInnes.

Miles MacInnes was a single man when he arrived in Halifax, Nova Scotia in the autumn of 1784. He was awarded 200 pounds sterling for his property losses in North Carolina and he received "half-pay" for one year, and a pension of 20 pounds per annum from 1783 to 1790, when the amount was reduced to 16 pounds sterling per annum. The Pension Rolls show that he was paid until 1818 and from that date the pension was paid to his widow, Christiana MacDonald MacInnes.

Miles was promised 200 acres on the Musquodoboit River as soon as it could be surveyed, but he had to wait until December 1785 before that was done. Miles and another loyalist named Daniel Blue and Andrew Murphy, were the first three white settlers on that part of the Musquodoboit River. This area is located above the rapids (falls) that are located about two and a half miles from the mouth of the river, which is a few miles north east of Halifax.

A settlement had been started in 1784 on the headwaters of the Musquodoboit River by men from Truro and Onslow by way of the Stewiacke River and that settlement extended downstream.

The Dickeys were in this group of settlers and married into the MacInnes family. But Miles and his companions were the first white settlers to come into the Musquodoboit Valley from the Atlantic Coast and extend the settlement northward.

This settlement on the Musquodoboit River, Halifax county, was made up of Scottish North Carolinians. It was a nucleus of ten men, four women, and two children who settled there as early as May of 1784. Most of the men had served in the Militia and were from Cumberland and Anson county, North Carolina. Miles MacInnes was one of these Musquodoboit settlers.

The grant of land which Miles was to settle was stony, uncultivated, and full of underbrush, but fertile. When they first went in, they had to cut roads around three waterfalls. Miles and his party missed the distribution of food and tools which the provincial government made to the loyalists and during the first year they had to eat their seed potatoes. By the time they got more from Halifax the following year the season was to far advanced for a successful crop. Miles said the only communication with Halifax was by water and that was hazardous most of the year.

Even though Miles built a log house on this land, he found the land unsuitable for farming and tried to obtain another grant of land farther up the river. Unfortunately all the good land had been already granted to others, particularly a large area granted to Martin Meagher.

This district is now called Meagher's Grant, named for "Bachelor Meagher." This grant of land was comprised of some 9000 acres. It is documented that Ranald MacDonald, one of the first settlers came from the United States. Ranald was born on the Isle of Skye, a loyalist and believed to be the son of Flora MacDonald. Archibald Crawford, another early settler, married Mary MacDonald, daughter of Angus MacDonald and sister of Christiana who married Miles MacInnes. Another early settler was John Dunbrack, a Scotchman, who married Catherine MacDougall and her brother, Alexander MacDougall married Catherine MacDonald, another sister of Christiana MacDonald.

About 1790, Miles purchased some land a few miles up stream from where he first settled on a farm known as the Parker Place (owned in 1980 by Fulton Dunbrack) and a few years later moved to a farm where he resided for the remainder of his life. Miles son, Malcolm remained in the home and raised a family of sixteen. It was eventually sold to Wellington Kent, then to a Dr. Wilson, and in 1980 to Robert Misiner. It is on Lay Lake Road and just west of where the Lower Meagher's Grant school was located in 1987. His neighbors included Angus MacDonald, Archibald Crawford, Jacob Bayer (Byer), a son of George Bayer, Sr. formerly of Frankfort on-the-Main, Germany, James Cruickshank, and John Dunbrack to name a few.

The first time Miles MacInnes saw his wife was when he and some other officers were on a trip to McNabb's Island and unexpectedly came on the three MacDonald girls while bathing.

On September 19, 1789, Miles MacInnes married Christiana in St.Paul's Church in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Two of Christiana's sisters were married to neighbors of Miles; her sister Mary became the wife of Archibald Crawford and her sister Alexandrina, better known as "Lexy," became the wife of Jacob Bayer. A third sister Catherine married Alexander MacDougall.

In 1810, Miles MacInnes signed as a witness to the Will of Alexander Mackenzie, Lake Egmont, Halifax County, N.S. The other witness was to the Will were Ranald MacDonald and James MacDonald.

Miles MacInnes was instrumental in getting a road from Meagher's Grant to Halifax. He became a Justice of the Peace and was a prominent citizen of the district. In 1814, he and Archibald Crawford applied for Crown Land on West River St. Mary's, where they hoped to raise cattle. Each was to receive a grant of 500 acres, but before the land could be granted, Miles MacInnes died and the land reverted to the government.

Miles died in 1818 and Christiana died in 1853 at the age of 84. Miles MacInnes apparently died without a Will. For no stated reason, the estate was not settled until about 1834, when part of his land at Meagher's Grant was conveyed by a deed to his son Malcolm. The deed was signed by the other heirs. Other nearby land was conveyed to his son Angus. The names of the female heirs were:

Ann McDougal (no mention of name of husband) Jennet Logan, wife of Robert A. Logan. Mary Cruickshanks, wife of James Cruickshanks. Alexandrina Dickey, wife of Samuel Dickey.

Christiana Cruickshanks, wife of Alexander Cruickshanks. Elisa Ann McInnes, (a daughter born 1816)

Miles MacInnes and Christiana MacDonald MacInnes had 9 children who produced at least 60 grandchildren all whom lived to be adults and had large families. Their descendants are now widely scattered over Canada and the United States and have included men and women who became lawyers, doctors, educators, bankers, engineers, explorers, publishers, military officers, nurses and writers.

\*\*\*\* In all documents signed by Miles MacInnes the surname is spelled MacInnes. In deeds signed by his heirs in 1834 the name appears as MacInness. In a map of Halifax County showing names of householders about 1860 the name appears as McGinnes and as McGinness. In some books, such as "Historical and Genealogical Record of the First Settlers of Colchester County" by Thomas Miller, the name appears as McInnis.

\*\*\*\* In a story about the early settlers of Meagher's Grant by A.B. Lay, he stated that when ever you hear the name MacInnes you will find carpenters. It has been said of Malcolm MacInnes that he could build a mill with a square, saw and broad axe."

**3 Christiana MacDonald.** Born in 1769 in Isle Of Skye, Scotland. Christiana died in Meaghers Grant, NS, in 1853; she was 84. Residence: North Carolina (1773), Halifax (1778).

Christiana was the daughter of Angus MacDonald the VIII of Griminish, North Uist and Catherine MacLeod, the daughter of the Rev. Donald MacLeod of Skye and Ann MacLean of Boreray. Christiana was born on the Isle of Skye in 1769. She was about five years old when she went with her family to North Carolina in 1773.

After the American Revolution the family settled in Nova Scotia and on September 19, 1789 Christiana married Lieut. Miles MacInnes in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Christiana's father, Captain Angus R. MacDonald the VIII of Griminish was a descendant of Hugh (Uisduin) Alexander, First of Sleat and his thrid wife, the daughter of MacLeod of Harris. Christiana's mother, Catherine MacLeod was born about 1731 in Skye and died 1813 in Nova Scotia. Christiana's lineage goes back to Somerled through John, First Lord of the Isles and both of his wives, Amy MacRuari and Priness Margaret Ross Stewart.



"At Musquodoboit, aged 84 years, Mrs. MacInnes, widow of Mr. MacInnes, an officer of the British Navy. She was born on the Isle of Skye, and arrived in America before the war of independence. After the Revolution she came to Nova Scotia and married, and has left behind her a numerous family of children, grandchildren and great grand children...."

Miles MacInnes and Christiana MacDonald MacInnes had 9 children who produced at least 60 grand-children all whom lived to be adults and had large families. Their descendants are now widely scattered over Canada and the United States and have included men and women who became lawyers, doctors, educators, bankers, engineers, explorers, publishers, military officers, nurses and writers.

All of the ancestry of Christiana MacDonald, which includes Kings of both Scotland and England and many Barons and Knights, has come from Flo Dickey, the Burkes and Scots Peerages, and the Clan website genealogies for Clan MacDonald, Clan MacLean, Clan MacLeod and Clan MacFarlane.



**6 Angus (VIII) MacDonald.** Born in Griminish, North Uist, Scotland. Angus (VIII) died in 1802 in Meaghers Grant, NS.

Angus MacDonald, VIII of Griminish of Scotland, North Carolina & Nova Scotia by Flo Dickey, Tucson, AZ

Angus and his brother Archibald, the sons of John MacDonald, VII of Griminish and Ann MacDonald of Balivqueen, appear about the same time as 'on record as of Griminish and Scolpig'.

Tradition tells that Angus of Griminish, evidently on his succeeding his father, was hoodwinked into a scheme of emigration by several of the North Uist gentlemen, who pretended that they were to cross the seas to America.

Angus is said to have been masterful and domineering and his neighbors devised this somewhat dubious plan to get him out of the country. Be this as it may, Angus alone made genuine preparations for the voyage to America while the others kept up the deception to the very end by sending packing cases laden with peats and other similar contents to the port of embarkation.

At first, Angus was taken in by this ruse; but afterwards, when it was too late he sailed for the new world. Angus, having given up the tenure of Griminish for the new world, his brother Archibald came into possession as tacksman of Griminish.

A poem by John MacCodum, the North Uist poet, bemoans the emigration. But the poem states that Angus was a man of considerable wealth, nobility and much stature in North Uist.

Angus was living in Griminish prior to his fathers death in 1765 and was then on record as Angus of Griminish. One could assume that Angus went to America after his father's death in 1765. It is said he did not find a congenial home in the new world and returned to Scotland before 1769. However circumstances change and he returned to America and settled in North Carolina with his wife and some of his children in December 1773. Angus was married when he went to America the first time and his wife, Catherine stayed with her parent's family on the Isle of Skye

during his absence as three of their daughters were born on the Isle of Skye; Mary born 1767 and Christiania "Christy" born 1769 and Catherine born 1773.

In the later part of 1773, Angus and his family set sail for North Carolina and arrived in December of 1773. Also on the same voyage in 1773 were three young neighbors and cousins of Angus' from Knockline in North Uist. They were Marion, Janet, and Augus, children of Donald MacDonald. These young people came over as servents to pay for their passage. They were just a few of the many Highlanders that left their homeland for the new world. The following story relates the reasons for this move.

In 1746, following the Battle of Culloden, the Parliament of Britain passed some harsh laws to abolish the Highland Clans. The use of the tartans and the wearing of kilts were prohibited. These measures were endorsed by the occupying army. Local government thereafter was to be by Government appointed officials. No Highlander was allowed to own any arms. All this meant was that the clan chief would have no further use for the tacksmen except as tenants. A clan could survive only so long as the chief adhered to the ancient principles and they all had a perfectly valid legal right to lay those principles aside and rent the land for the best price it would bring. Sooner or later every clan chief adopted the new order of things. The tacksmen did not like it. They were as equally determined to emigrate rather than accept the new law.

This is what happened in the case of our Skye and Uist MacDonalds. In 1746 Sir Alexander of Sleat, the Chief, died the same year of the new laws. His oldest son, James, was a minor. Old Kingsburg was his tutor. James was given a good education, and when he took over the reins, he had not the remotest idea of doing differently from the long established custom. Every clansmen loved him and it was reciprocal. But Sir James died in 1766 at the age of 26 and unmarried. The next in line to inherit the chiefship was the next brother, Alexander. He had been educated in London, and perhaps no thought had been given to the possibility that he might some day be chief. He began to rent his land for the best price he could get regardless of kinship. As rapidly as leases expired the tacksmen were to pay higher rents or leave and leave they did. There was propaganda widely circulated that greatly hurt the pride of the tacksmen, to the effect that they were robbing the chiefs with one hand and the poor people with the other. Dr. Johnson discusses this at length in "The Tour of the Hebrides."

In 1759 a regiment was raised on the estates of Sir James MacDonald, and led by Montgomery, a brother of the mother of Sir James. In order to enlist the Highlanders, Prime Minister William Pitt decided to allow them to organize pure Highland regiments and permit them to wear kilts and be led by their own officers. Fourteen hundred men volunteered and officers were commissioned. They first saw action in New York and Pennsylvania and by 1761 a report came in that the Cherokees were molesting the western Carolinas. Montgomery, with 700 of these men, went to the Carolinas for about a year. Returning north they were discharged at the end of the French and Indian War of 1763. They were offered free land if they wanted to settle in America, or passage if they wanted to go home. But this group of MacDonald men returned to Skye and Uist. Naturally these men would learn a lot about the country during their stay in the Carolinas and tell about it back in Skye.

In 1771, James MacDonald of Heisker, Hugh "One-eye" MacDonald of Armadale, and several other MacDonalds applied for a grant of 40,000 acres of public land in North Carolina for themselves and their families.

In 1772, Hugh was back in North Carolina and bought land on Mountain Creek and returned to Skye and was there in October 1773 to ferry Johnson and Boswell to Mull and returned to North Carolina in 1774 to build a grist mill for the new settlers. In other words the clan was about to move its place of abode, and as Johnson expresses it, carry along their kindred, their customs, their language, etc. and "change nothing but their place of abode and of that they see the advantage."

In December 1773, Angus, his wife Catherine and five children arrived in North Carolina and settled immediately on land transferred to him by Alexander MacDonald, 5th of Cuidreach. In the later part of 1774, arrivals from Skye included Flora MacDonald and her husband, Alan MacDonald of Kingsburgh, their sons, Alexander, and James and

their daughter Anne and her husband, Alexander MacLeod of Dunvegan, Isle of Skye; also Donald MacDonald son of Alexander MacDonald, 5th of Cuidreach and Miles MacInnes. Three young neighbors of Angus, from Knockline in North Uist came on the same passage with Angus to America in 1773. They were Marion and Janet daughters of Angus MacDonald and their cousin Augus, son of Donald MacDonald a relative. These young people came over as servents to pay for their passage.

Angus MacDonald had purchased several other tracts of land and by the time the Highlanders were mobilized at Cross Creek in February, 1776, he owned a total of 1861 acres. He received a commission as Captain from the governor of North Carolina and was in command of his company when taken prisoner at Moore's Creek Bridge, February 27, 1776.

Miles MacInnes, Flora MacDonald, her husband Allen of Kingsburgh, their sons Alexander and James, a daughter Ann and son in law Alexander MacLeod, Donald MacDonald (son of Alexander 5th of Cuidreach) all arrived in Anson County in 1774, most likely on the ship "Cato" arrived from Scotland carrying 312 Highlanders, in December of 1774, all from the Isle of Skye (Port of Brunswick Record Book). They settled in the Cape Fear basin where their relatives had settled a year earlier.

The nearest villages were Cross Creek and Campbelltown, which were merged about 1778 under the name of Campbelltown which was changed to Fayetteville in 1783.

Soon after their arrival trouble began in New England between the British and the American colonies. Two Scottish officers of the British Army were sent to North Carolina to organize a regiment of Highlanders to help support the British cause. They were Major Donald MacDonald and Captain Donald MacLeod, cousins of our descendants in North Carolina.

Many of the Scottishh settlers in North Carolina were born in America or had become Americanized and favored the Yankee cause. Some wanted to remain neutral as they knew the treatment they or their parents had received from the English troops in Scotland when they had gone against the English government in the Rising of 1745. Those who arrived only a few years before 1775 were not free to make a choice as they had taken an oath of loyality prior to their arrival in America. These newly arrived Scots, our ancestors, had lost so much in Scotland, they did not want to risk losing all their possessions in this new homeland. Most of the newcomers still had family back in Skye and feared reprisals if they supported the Yankee cause.

The British Government was well aware of this and tried to round up all the Highland men and transport them to known loyal territory as soon as possible, before they could be persuaded to join the Yankees. It was for this reason that Major Donald MacDonald and Captain Donald MacLeod were sent to North Carolina. Flora MacDonald, having gone against the British before in helping Bonnie Prince Charles, knew exactly what the repercussions would be. Consequently she was very willing to support the British and help persuade her family and friends to do so as well. Soon Major MacDonald, Captain MacLeod and about 1500 men began marching to the sea coast where they expected to be taken by ship to Halifax, Nova Scotia for training and arms, then return to Anson County to fight the Yankees. They joined the Highland Emigrant Regiment and they wore their tartans and kilts with pride. Unfortunately for these Highlanders, less than half were armed and those classed as "armed" had nothing other than swords. They were met by a smaller but well armed force of Yankees at a place known as Moore's Creek Bridge February 27, 1776. In the brief battle, Highlanders were outmaneuvered by the highly skilled Americans. Some were killed, including Captain Angus's son, and more than half taken prisoner. Included among the prisoners were Allen MacDonald of Kingsburgh and his two sons, Captain Angus MacDonald, and Lieut. Miles MacInnes. Since there were so many prisoners and not nearly enough Yankees to guard them, the younger men were released. They were told to go home and think about joining the Yankee cause. Some of the Highland prisoners escaped.

On October 28, 1785, in London, England, Captain Angus MacDonald submitted his claim to the Commission appointed by the British Government to settle claims of American Loyalists.

His claim stated that he had resided in North Carolina from December, 1773, until he was taken prisoner by the enemy in February of 1776. He took an active part in the uprising of Highlanders at Cross Creek and was taken prisoner February 27, 1776. He remained a prisoner over two years. After being released he rejoined the British forces and served until "the Peace.." He submitted a "Schedule" of property losses in North Carolina; lost when his possessions were taken or destroyed by the Americans. Angus claimed the loss of 5 tracts of land, each of which was operated as a plantation complete with buildings, horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, tools, and equipment. Two of the plantations were equipped with grist mills. The land areas were all in Cumberland County, in the vicinity of Cranes Creek, which is northwest of Fayetteville. The different tracts had areas of 400, 300, 250, 256, and 655 acres, for a total area of 1861 acres. Angus also claimed the loss of 94 sheep, 10 horses, 70 hogs, and 39 cattle. Several of his plantation were rented to tenants.

On October 28, 1785 his case was heard in London. In sworn testimony, he stated that he arrived in North Carolina in December, 1773 and settled at Cranes Creek in February of 1774. After being captured he was kept in close confinement for a year and was then let out on parole. After his release, he joined the British Army in Philadelphia in 1777. He obtained a lieutenancy in the PIONEERS AND GUIDES in 1778. He was at the siege of Charleston, and later Captain in the NORTH CAROLINA HIGHLANDERS and continued with them until the peace. He went from New York to North Carolina to rescue his wife and five children, who had lived on his home estate until they were forced to flee, without any possessions, in 1781.

From North Carolina, Angus took his family to Nova Scotia, where they lived until he started his voyage to England to try to recover his losses. Angus arrived in London a few days before the hearings, October 20, 1785. The evidence of the hearings shows that he produced a conveyance, dated 1 April 1774, for four tracts of land totaling 400 acres purchased from Alexander MacDonald. Alexander MacDonald of Cuidreach, on the Isle of Skye, was married to a half sister of Flora MacDonald. She was a daughter of Flora's mother and her second husband, Captain "One-eyed" Hugh MacDonald. Angus stated that when he arrived in North Carolina he carried over 300 guineas, a draft for 1340 guineas, and goods and possessions having a total value of about 700 pounds sterling. He could not produce deeds for the other tracts of land because they had been left in "the office" in North Carolina but he gave the following information;

- 300 acre tract purchased from a man named Cameron, 1774
- 250 acre tract purchased from a man named Gilmore, March or April of 1775
- 256 acre tract purchased from a man named Matthews, May 1775.
- 655 acre tract purchased from a man named Bowie.

He claimed loss of crops totalling 1000 bushels of indian-corn and 150 bushels of wheat. In 1781, his wife and children were forced to leave home without even a "second shift."

A supporting witness to these claims was Captain Alexander Morrison who had known both Captain Alexander and Captain Angus MacDonald in Scotland and North Carolina. He lived eight or nine miles from Angus, in North Carolina. He was with them when they made the bargain for the land at Cranes Creek. He said that Angus MacDonald was a man of good character and had brought property into the country.

Another witness, Donald Shaw (son in law of Morrison), had known Angus in America and before, and spoke highly of him.

There is nothing in the file to show when a decision was made about the property losses, but there is a document showing the following:

Captain Angus MacDonald waited in London for four months without receiving payment. Angus had given his tenure of Griminish to his brother Archibald before leaving for America. Some time during his the waiting period in London, Angus returned to his native Uist. However, he did not go back to his ancestors in Griminish, but resided at Balranald, then occupied by his kinsman, Donald MacDonald.

He presented another claim on or soon after, February 17, 1786 asking that some form of aid or temporary support be given him until he "might receive compensation for his lost property," and he gave the following reasons;

He had served in the rebellion in America and his wife and family had been forced to remain in the hands of the enemy who plundered them of their effects and confiscated all his estate.

Before the evacuation of New York (November, 1783) he returned to North Carolina for his family and took them to Nova Scotia "where they are now" and with whom he had remained until he came to England to have his claim heard. Since his arrival in England, he had been examined by the Commissioners for the Loyalist Claims, his claim "amounting in Carolina currency to 3393-17 pounds, equal in Sterling to about 1936-6-4." He had to refurnish his family with clothing, household furniture, and equipment; to purchase tools for farming; "to build a house in the wilderness" and, this, exhausted all his finances and involved him greatly in debt, he having no resources other than his half-pay, and "what is still a greater sting to his feelings as a husband, and a father, that for want of means, he is unable to go back to his family."

Josiah Martin, who had been governor of North Carolina when Angus lived there, was then in London. He wrote a letter, dated 17 February 1786, supporting the Memorial and recommending that "a temporary aid, or subsistence, be awarded to Captain Angus MacDonald to enable him to return to his family in Nova Scotia."

Captain Angus was called for a hearing on February 25, 1786. In the record of that hearing, the following information can be found:

He went to North Carolina, December 1773.

He raised a company of 250 men and joined Major Donald MacDonald's forces by order of Governor Josiah Martin. He had two commissions of Captain; one from Governor Martin and one from Lord Cornwallis. He had half pay as Captain.

After the peace, he went to Nova Scotia with his wife and children.

He came to England in October 1785.

His case was heard October 28, 1785, Loss of 1939 pounds Sterling, Intends to return to Nova Scotia at first opportunity.

The Commissioners evidently thought it better to send him back home to Nova Scotia than to pay his support in London until his claim was paid. The decision was to pay him 25 pounds "to defray the expense of his return to Nova Scotia."

It is assumed that he returned as soon as possible and that the compensation for property losses was paid to him after his return to Nova Scotia. Of all the American loyalists named MacDonald who submitted claims to the British government for property losses in North Carolina, Captain Angus MacDonald was the one who received the largest amount of compensation. With all his land, he probably had slaves but, unlike some of his neighboring claimants, he did not submit any claim to the British government for the loss of slaves. It is probable that when he went back to North Carolina, to rescue his wife and children, he also rescued some of his slaves and took them to Nova Scotia, with the family. This would explain the story in Nova Scotia that he brought his wife and family, and slaves to that

country.

Angus and his family settled in Kennetcook, Hants County, Nova Scotia. For some reason they spent a lot of time on MacNabb's Island, according to an article written, August 10, 1901, by J.D. Bayer, a great grand son of Angus. Bayer states that his great grandfather Angus came to Nova Scotia from Florida, where he had a plantation of some size and a dozen slaves. That they originally came from the Isle of Skye and his great grandmother was married after the celebrated Flora MacDonald who was married to Allan MacDonald of Kingsburg.

\*\*One must remember that a lot of people in Nova Scotia thought of the eastern sea coast of the United States as one giant Florida and then Miles was in Florida prior to Nova Scotia may be the source of this statement. Flora married Alan of Kingsburg Nov.6, 1750, did Bayer mean that his great grand parents married after that date?\*\*

Captain Angus MacDonald married Catherine MacLeod, the daughter of the Rev. Donald MacLeod III of Greshornish (1698-1759), Skye and Ann MacLean, the daughter of the Rev. John Maclean the second son of John MacLean, 8th of Boreray. The Rev. Donald MacLeod III of Greshornish served as a missionary to the Island of Benbecula, in 1736 to North Uist and 1754 to Duirinish on Skye. He spent most of his ministry in the outer Hebrides.

Captain Angus MacDonald and Catherine MacLeod had several children;

- 1. Donald, born in North Uist (c.1750), was alive in 1795 and living in North Uist at that time.
- 2. Angus, born in North Uist, married Margaret Buchanan. He died in the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge or shortly thereafter of wounds.
- 3. Alexander, born in North Uist, died in Nova Scotia.
- 4. Mary, born about 1767 on the Isle of Skye, married Archibald Crawford of Nova Scotia.
- 5. CHRISTIANIA "Christy" born about 1769 on the Isle of Skye, married MILES MacINNES of Skye, North Carolina and Nova Scotia. (Bayer said he remembered hearing that the first time Captain Miles MacInnes saw his wife was when he and some other officers were on a trip to MacNabb's Island and unexpectedly came upon the three MacDonald girls bathing.)
- 6. Alexanderina "Lexy" married Jacob Bayer, Nova Scotia.
- 7. Catherine born ca. 1773, married Alexander MacDougal, Nova Scotia.

After the marriage of Christy to Miles MacInnes, Captain Angus MacDonald moved to Meagher's Grant. The old cellar of his house could be seen in 1910. Each of the MacDonald girls received two slaves. Tom Wade of Windsor Junction is a son of one of the girls given to Christy MacInnes, Black Charlotte. The other one also named Charlotte, married a former southern slave named Dennis McGruda.

Charlotte lived in a small log cabin on the MacInnes' farm, and one night when Dennis came a courting, the MacInnes boys crept up to the shanty to listen. Dennis first knelt down and said a long prayer after which he managed to pop the momentous question, and in a very short time Mr. MacInnes, who was a Justice of the Peace, had to perform the marriage ceremony for the happy couple.

Dennis McGruda got to Nova Scotia by guiding the British to a Yankee stronghold in the war of 1812. The British found him at work for his master and compelled him to show them where the enemy was by promising him his freedom. They were good as their word, and that's how Dennis McGruda got to Nova Scotia.

Captain Angus MacDonald received half pay of Captain till 1813.

\*\*\*From Moore County Court Minutes of February 22, 1785:

"Thomas Matthews came into court and on oath returned the following articles of the estate of Angus MacDonald liable for confiscation to wit: 200 acres of land, 9 pounds and 15 shillings, one surveyors chain, 2 head of cattle and

one horse in the hands of Thomas Collins."

\*\*\*\* Moore County Court Minutes of August 21, 1792:

"A Letter of Attorney from Anguish McDaniel to Ferquard Campbell was duly proved before Samuel Ashe, Esq. one of the judges of the Superior Court and Ordered to be registered."

It would therefore appear that Captain Angus MacDonald, then in Nova Scotia, had some hopes of recovering at least a part of his property. The foregoing claim is quite different in form from those filed by others of the Highlanders. Whereas other claims are submitted with certificates from officers who were captured at Moore's Creek, Capt. MacDonald produced only two, one from Dr. Morrison; the other from Donald Shaw, (Dr. Morrison's son in law) and these only mildly certified to his loyalty and scarcely at all to his property. The entire claim is confused and one can hardly tell just how much property he lost. The 400 acre tract referred to was sold to him by Alexander MacDonald of Mt. Pleasant, North Carolina, and the deed is recorded in Fayetteville. The other deeds referred to as having been left "in the office" are not of record. The 400 acres mentioned lay on, and is believed to include the mouth of Little Crane's Creek where it enters Big Crane's Creek, just below the railroad between Cameron and Vass. The mill mentioned was originally built by Thomas Gilmore, and at one time known as the Keith, Muckle and Stokes's Mill. In the early days of the Raleigh and Agusta Air Line, this place was a flag-stop, and was known as Walnut Grove. A few of these trees still grow in the vicinity.

Ca 1750 Angus (VIII) married Catherine MacLeod in Isle Of Skye.

**7 Catherine MacLeod.** Born in 1731 in Isle Of Skye, Scotland. Catherine died in Meaghers Grant, NS, in 1813; she was 82.

Catherine's grandparents were the Rev. John MacLean the second son John MacLean, VIII of Boreray and Mary MacDonald of Morar, the daughter of Alexander MacDonald, 6th of Morar and Anne MacDonald of Sleat. Her other set of grandparents were Alexander MacLeod III of Greshornish, Skye the son of Norman MacLeod, 2nd of Greshornish and Catherine MacLean of Coll.
