The Sibley's of Wittenburg were well-known early pioneering furniture-makers in Nova Scotia. Some of the second and third generations moved to Meagher's Grant, Halifax County; Amherst, Cumberland Co.; to Truro, and then beyond. This family overlaps with several others in the Colchester, Hants and Halifax County areas that I have researched, namely Dickey, Dillman, Kerr, McMullen and others – please see details of these families at www.gofffamilyhistory.ca

¹ Most Sibley's in NSHVS are of the Wittenburg family, but it is worth mentioning that there is a Sibley family from the Head of St. Mary's Bay, Marshalltown, Digby Co., starting with David Sibley b. 1805. Several of this family are also in the NSHVS. No relation is known.

First Generation

1. Ezekial (Stephen) Sibley, son of **Henry Sibley** (1720-1766) & **Sarah Haislup**. Born in 1756. Ezekial (Stephen) died in Wittenburg, Col. Co., NS, in 1813; he was 57.

On the passenger list of the transport ship "Beaufort" which arrived in Halifax 1749, is the name of Henry Sibley, "a Soapmaker." He had a son Stephen who went first to settle in Cornwallis, and then came to St. Andrews (Wittenburg)², where he was the first settler. (Jennie Reid)

Mildred (Pulsifer) Burrows uses the name of Stephen for the first settler of St. Andrews, just prior to 1813, but records show his name to be Ezekiel. He came from Cornwallis, Kings Co., with four sons, Henry, Newcomb, Joseph and William, the latter two of whom remained in St. Andrews. Stephen's oldest son Henry married Sally McNutt and they kept a roadhouse on the Old Cobequid Road. Eight of their children grew to adulthood. Newcomb married Susan Campbell and they lived at Middle Stewiacke. They had 4 sons and 3 daughters. Joseph lived all his life in St. Andrews and was known as "The Chairmaker". He married Jane Woodworth and they had 12 children. It was his son Michael who became the lead man in the Sibley Furniture Company³, soon joined by several other brothers and cousins. Sibley Chairs, the main staple of the factory, have long been associated with the village of Wittenburg. William, the fourth son of Stephen, went to New Brunswick when a young man and worked at lumbering on the Miramichi River. He married Eliza Thomas, the daughter of a boat builder of Saint John, NB. They came to Nova Scotia following their marriage in 1832 and settled in Wittenburg. They also had 12 children. (A History of Wittenburg/St. Andrews).

Ezekial (Stephen) married Mary West. Born in 1764. Mary died in 1796; she was 32.

The kept a roadhouse on the Old Cobequid Road, St. Andrews. Eight children grew to adulthood.

SIBLEY, **JOSEPH**, farmer and chairmaker; b. c. 1790, the son of Ezekiel Sibley and Mary West; m. Jane Woodworth, and they had ten children; d. 1 Feb. 1862 in St Andrew's (Wittenburg), N.S.

About 1812 Joseph Sibley, with his brothers and father, settled on the south branch of the St Andrews River in central Nova Scotia, where the small community of Wittenburg now stands. Probably the first settlers there, they cleared the land and established their farms. Joseph combined woodwork with farming and made, for local sale, various items needed in pioneer homes: buttertubs, spinning wheels, looms, and the like. In an era of home-made furniture he was particularly successful in producing chairs and selling them locally. He tried them in various styles before settling on the typical Sibley chair familiar to collectors, with slat backs and turned finials. The slats were

usually made from birch or ash. The stretchers, hickory or ash, were dried; the uprights, usually maple, were green when the chairs were assembled, and as they dried they clamped the ends of the stretchers in a vise-like grip which made the chairs remarkably sturdy. Ash splits were woven to make the seats.

Joseph Sibley lived out his days in Wittenburg. Assisted by his sons, Michael (1833–1908) and Isaac, he farmed and made chairs and other items in slack seasons. The inventory of his estate shows "22 butter tubs, 16 sets chair rounds, 3 sets new chairs" on hand. As far as is known all Joseph's work was unsigned; he is notable not for examples of his workmanship but as the originator of the Sibley chairs. Michael took over the business and expanded it to produce several kinds of furniture which reached a wider market. Therefore most of the Sibley chairs one sees date from the years the business was operated by Michael and by other members of the family who succeeded him.

"The Sibley family of Colchester County made other types of furniture but their chair, with its distinctive, shaped back slats and mushroom finials, is best known. Beginning with Joseph Sibley (born 1790), who was known locally as the 'chair maker,' the Siblevs continued in operation until 1900." (findagrave)

William (4th and youngest son of Stephen, the pioneer Sibley) ran a sawmill on the St. Andrews River. When it burned down, he went to work in the lumber woods on the Mirimichi, N.B. In St. John, he met and married Eliza Thomas, b Aug. 6, 1814, dau. of Thomas Thomas, a boat builder and his wife, Catherine Dukeshire Thomas. They lived in Wittenburg, and he built a sawmill on Wallace Brook, later he settled on Sibley Hill. William and Catherine had 8 sons and 4 daus.

Sam Moore confirmed that Alexander, s/o Daniel, was married to Ruth Sibley. He was first married to **Mary Eleanor Goff** (b. 24 Feb 1854 in Goffs, Halifax Co., d. 27 Feb 1890 in Devon, Hfx. Co.), d/o William Goff and Hannah Dickey. They had one child Mary Victoria, b. 24 Feb 1890, md. Samuel Moore.

"Death of Alexander McDougall, Guysboro Road. A gloom has been cast over this community by the sudden death of Mr. Alexander McDougall of Guysborough Road, which occured at his fathers home on November 15th. Mr. McDougall had been ailing for some time but his illness was not thought to be serious until Nov. 3rd; he had been to consult his physician the previous evening and on the following day had driven some distance alone and on his return went to his parents home close by his own place; where he was stricken with paralysis. Drs. Densmore of Elmsdale and McLean and Haliday of Shubenacadie were called but all their efforts were unavailing. The remains were interred at Gays River, and 31 carriages containing relatives and other friends followed the body to its last resting place. Rev. A. B. Dickie conducted the funeral service.

The deceased was born at Kempt, Hants County, 43 years ago, but removed with his parents when small, quite near his late home. He leaves a wife and one daughter, aged parents and four sisters to mourn the loss of a loving husband and father, a devoted son, and a kind brother. This is the fourth time that Mr. and Mrs. McDougall have been called to part with loved ones, two sons and one daughter having died some years ago and now their eldest and last remaining son. The sisters surviving are Mrs. John E. Long of Richibucto, N.B., Mrs. George Slocumb of Malden, Mass., and Mrs. Miles D. Goff and Miss Bella McDougall of Guysborough Road.

The bereaved ones feel deeply the kindness shown by their neighbours and friends in their affliction, during the painful illness friends were ready to help and sympathize with the family and the many cts of devotion proved the high esteem in which the deceased was held by those who knew him. Mr. A. Gladwin's consideration for all their wishes and his kind and sympathetic manner while performing the duties of Undrtaker were appreciated by all the relatives. The pallbearers were James G. Kerr, James McMichael, John McMichael, Edwin Hirtle, Freeman Nelson, Clifford Goff."

McDougall, J.A., d. 15 Nov. 1899 at Guysboro Road, ae 43 (PW). Since his gravestone says 1900 but no date, it is likely he died 15 Nov. 1899 and was buried in 1900. **Edward George**. Born on 24 May 1855. Edward George died in Jamaica on 14 Mar 1895; he was 39. Buried in Wittenburg, Col. Co., NS. Occupation: Baptist minister, died of TB.

## <u>Appendix 1</u> The History of Wittenburg, by Mildred (Pulsifer) Burrows

### A HISTORY OF WITTENBURG

### THE NAMING OF WITTENBURG.

In 1621 King James 1st of England (James VI of Scotland) gave to Sir William Alexander of Scotland a grant of the land of Acadia with the stipulation that he colonize it. Sir William's first attempt to colonize this land in 1622 came to grief but a year later another shipload of adventurers came and picked up the survivors of the previous expedition, ten men who had spent the winter in Newfoundland. These men all came to Acadia and returned to Scotland full of enthusiasm for the timber, the fish and the fertile meadows found during their explorations of the area.

One man in this group of explorers, legend calls him Selkirk, set out from the Dartmouth area with an Indian guide. They travelled by cance up through the lakes and Shubenacadie River until they came to a small tributary and they entered this stream which narrowed gradually as they followed it to its source. Here Selkirk found himself in a valley running in a north to south direction with a high hill the northern side to form a bowl-shaped hill. This had outcroppings of bedrock on the top and dropped away in sheer cliffs on the northern side. Two centuries later the eastern one was called Best Mountain after the man who first homesteaded these high hills.

The Scottish explorer who camped in this narrow glen with his Indian guide knew nothing of the future of this valey nor of the people who would later inhabit it but it reminded him of the steep hills and swift-running burns of his homeland. Also legend says he camped there on St. Andrews Day so he named the glen and the stream which runs through it for his country's patron saint. Thus St. Andrews was the name on the early maps and the first settlers adopted it and it was used until 1885. Then because so many Scottish settlers in Canada named their community for St. Andrews, the Postal Department experienced great difficulty in determining to which place of that name the mail should be sent so a change of name was requested.

A meeting was called and in spite of some dissect it was decided to accede to this request but then arce the difficulty of choosing a new name which would suit everybody. James D. Fulsifer, remembered by the old folks for his dry wit, suggested Hardscrabble but as this was more applicable to his own acreage than to all of the village, it was discarded. Finally Rev. E. T. Miller, the minister of the church, suggested the name of Wittenburg as the church here reminded him of the controversy over the spelling. Apparently in Germany a berg is a village between the other hand, in Scotland a burg means an industrial town and as this description was equally apt and as some wanted to retain some small link with the historic name they had relinquished, they chose the Scottish spelling. This difference in spelling argument whenever the subject is mentioned in the presence of the two differing factions.

During World War HT considerable dissatisfaction was expressed by the populace because their community's name seemed to denote a relationship with the enemy and as other Canadian towns were discarding names with a German connotation, a meeting was called in Wittenburg to do likewise. Again some difficulty was experienced in finding a suitable name. Each person present submitted one for consideration and some of these were Ashmount, Crystal Springs (both descriptive of some aspect of the place) and several containing the word maple, such as Maple Springs,

Mapleville, Mapleton and others. There are many maples in Wittenburg and as this word had a distinctly Canadian flavor, the title Mapleville won the vote. It was submitted to Ottawa with a request for the change but Parliament was flooded with similar requests by this time and refused to grant any more. So this community still has a German name so at variance with the surnames of its inhabitants that visitors are intrigued and invariably inquire about its origin.

This community of Wittenburg is a small hamlet tucked away in the southwest corner of Colchester County in central Nova Scotia. A brook begins at the southern boundary and meaniers northward, wending its way back and forth across the narrow intervales and fed by small streams and springs flowing down from the high hills which rise on either side of the valley. Usually the brook glides along quietly, in places rippling over smooth stones and now and then widening out to form a tranquil pool where trout and suckers on the sandy bottom lie hidden by the mirrow-like surface which shows only the reflected beauty of the sky or the trees which grow along its banks. It is usually possible to cross this brook at many points by stepping stones but smetimes during a thaw in winter or when a freshet ends a drought in summer, the little streams become brooks and the central brook a raging torrent which washes away boulders and bridges and creates waterfalls whose roar can be heard to the top of Pulsifer Mountain.

This is the brook along whose banks the nills were built, the products of which attracted the early settlers and for a time made Wittenburg a thriving community. In order to have power to run the mills in the dry weather, ceveral ponds were formed by building dams at strategic points and some of these are still there today although there is no use for the story power and all that is left of any of the mills is one or two old grist stones.

But even before the mills were built or any settlers hid homesteaded here, an industry was started by an English company. At a date not known today, some explorers became interested in the bedrock outcroppings in the area from which could be quarried the slate tile in short supply in England so a location for a quarry was chosen at the western slope of what later was named Sibley Mountain. Entry to the quarry was not made through Wittenburg but from Coldstream because the road from Halifax to Truro was closer to the quarry site at that point than elsewhere.

The two-story house for the manager and the one-story cottagis for the workers were all sturdily built of the first rock ou arried. John Bulgin, the bockkeeper for the company, kept a slate tile in a prominent place in his house and on this "bulletin board" messages or instructions for household chores were jotted down for any absent member of the family. Minnie (Goodwin) Ransey, widow of George Ramsey of Stewiacke, who is a descendent of John Bulgin, cheriches this slate now.

After the tile was quarried it was laborously hauled by ox-cart over the corduroy roads bridging the swamps between the quarry and the road at Coldstream. From here it was taken to Fort Ellis at the point where the two rivers meet and there loaded on ships for England. All went well until the third shipload set sail. The first two had arrived safely at their destination but of the third there was never a trace of information. It is thought that it ran into a storm and the lack of buoyancy caused by the nature of its load invited disaster. Following this loss the quarry was abandoned. It is not known today whether the company felt that transportation involved too great a risk or it may not have been too affluent and possibly the loss of what represented several months work may have resulted in bankruptoy.

John Bulgin remained in Nova Scotia for his wife was a Goodwin girl from Stewiacke East. His name appears often in Michael Sibley's account book showing that he regularly bought tea and tobacco at this store during the years around 1855. He met his death by drowning. The houses at the quarry site remained for years before the effect of frost and storm began to upset the walls. Then about 1930 a lumbering concern made the area accessible for trucks and the slate rocks were gathered up and hauled away to be sold for flagstone walks. Probably the people of Trune and other towns who bought them little realize that the flagstones gracing their front lawns were once a part of the cottages built over a century before in the winderness of St. Andrews. All that is left to show that an industry once flourished there are the holes from which the slate was quarried. These are filled with water and the youth of the community was always well warned by the older folk to stay away from this area when hunting or fishing lest scheene inadvertently step into the deep pools and drown.

#### EARLIEST SETTLERS.

It is quite likely that the first settlers in what is now Wittenburg were three families--the Bentleys, Martins and Richardsons. Although the Sibleys were certainly the first to settle in the main part of the community and it was certainly due to their enterprise in setting up mills that the place developed so quickly, it seems likely that the above-named families had settled in the extreme northern edge of the village before Stephen Sibley started his home here about 1812. If they were not started before the Sibleys then it must have been very scon after.

Little is known of these three families but John Wright refers to them at various times in his writings. His father, born in 1817, often played with David Bentley. His home is now almost regrown in trees and even in 1856 Wright says it was deserted with the buildings in a tumble-down state and only a few apple trees left in the old orchard. The Bentleys were still there in 1832 however, for they were among the charter members of the Lower Stewiacke Baptist Church formed at that date. Also Wright speaks of the flint-lock gun owned by David Bentley when he was a young man. With this he would go out any morning and in a few minutes have all the partridge he wanted. In blueberry time the pigeons came by flocks of hundreds of birds to the barrens near Bentley's home and he would shoot dozens at each charge from his gun. This farm was last lived on by a Fisher family about forty years ago and is between the McNutt and Forrest farms.

The Martins were next to them but their farm was off the main road, on the bank of the river. Jim Dean recently had a mill in that locality. Up until a few years ago there was still the remains of one field to mark the site of the old home. It too was deserted and the buildings down by 1856.

The Richardsons owned and probably cleared the farm now owned by Frank Ellis but which was sold by the Richardsons to the Dumfords in the 1840's. It was left by the Durnfords to Jack Forrest who sold to Harris Ellis. Little is known of this family. Although John Richardson married Ann Wright, the youngest sister of John Wright's father, all we learn from him is that John Richardson came accounting by way of a short cut through the woods. Following their marriage they lived in St. Andrews a few years then sold the farm to Durnfords in the late 1840's and went to North Sydney. The Miller Book says that John and Ann Richardson had five daughters and three sons and that John died in 1855 at the age of 76. Ann died in 1863 at the age of 14. If these dates are correct, then John Richardson was forty years older than his wife.

## <u>Appendix 2</u> The Genealogy of the Sibleys of Wittenburg, by Mildred (Pulsifer) Burrows

#### SIBLEYS.

It is not definitely known today when the first settler came to St.Andrews or who he was but most people believe he was Stephen Sibley and that he came here to live just prior to 1815. For the site of his homestead he chose a dry, sandy knoll about three miles north of the brock's source. Being a farmer he was doubtless attracted by the intervale land which almost surrounded this knoll on which he built his home.

Stephen Sibley came to this area from Cornwallis in the Annapolis Valley. Originally the Sibleys came from England where Stephen's father had been a wealthy scap manufacturer who came out alone to Halifax where he bought up a largo part of the city's real estate before returning to England to get his family. On the trip back to Halifax he contracted cholera and died. His wife had no business training and she seen lost the Halifax property. The family was given a grant of land at Cornwallis where many of the family remained for many years, but for some reason Stephen Sibley left there and soutled in what was then the wilderness of St.Andrews. Nothing is known of Stephen's wife and there are conflicting accounts of the number of children in this family. For instance, some say that Ruth Sibley who married Aaron Thorpe was his daughter but others believe she was a child of Ezekiel and Mary (West) Sibley who lived for a short time where the Godfroys later settled. Of this much we are certain; there were four sons named Henry, Newcombe, Joseph and William of whom the first two settled near and the latter two remained in St. Andrew while all four married and raised large families.

These boys would be young men when their father came to his new home so he would have help in clearing the land and erecting the buildings. They had just completed the frame of the barn when a severe windstorm struck and it was demolished John Wright tells that this was the storm long remembered by early pioneers as the Big Gale of November 12, 1813 which did a tremendous amount of damage to buildings throughout the county. The Sibleys rebuilt the barn and this time it was so strong ly braced that it stood until a decade ago and had Herbert MacLeod, the owner at the time, kept it in repair it could have stood for many decades longer.

Stephen's oldest son, Henry (born in 1788) married Sarah (Sally) McNutt (born 1793) about 1813 and they kept a roadhouse on the Old Cobequid Road at the sit where Doug Ramsey now lives. Of their many children, eight grow to adulthood and their names were Henry, who inherited the place, Ezekiel, Mary, Eliza, Eunice, William, Lucy Ann and Susan. Although none of these lived in St. Andrews they visited their rolatives there frequently.

Newcombe married Susan Campbell and they lived at Middle Stewiacke where they also kept an inn but whereas Henry catered to the stage coach travellers, Newcombe provided pasture for the flocks of sheep or herds of cattle being driven to Halifax. As the roads of that time were mostly trails for equestrians or pedestrians, it was necessary to ship meat to Halifax on the hoof and have it slaughtered. At intervals on the roads between Halifax and the farming areas were places where the animals could be pastured for a day or two so that there would be a minimum weight loss during the trek. The herdsmen were put up at the home of the man who provided pasturage and this was the type of inn run by Newcombe.

His four sons were called Nathaniel, Jonathon Campbell, James and Robert Blackwood and the three girls were Ruth, Mary and Lydia. Two of these boys were doctors. Robert Blackwood went to Australia during the goldrush and made his home there. During World War II Maynard Taylor looked up his Sibley cousins, descendents of Robert B. Sibley, who live in Australia. When Newcombe was an old man he returned to St. Andrews to spend his last years with his nephew, Ezekiel T. Sibley.

Stephen Sibley's third son. Joseph, was known as an ingenuous, good man and he was given the title of The Chairmaker by his contemporaries. He lived all his life in St. Andrews and before 1830, probably around 1818 when he married Jane Woodworth, he built a house right at the edge of the old road at Ellis' corner. Later, about 1850, this was replaced by a larger house set back a few yards from the first and this house is now the home of Frank Ellis.

Joseph and Jane Sibley md twelve children of whom Sarah, Isaac and Stephen died as babies. The sons who grew up were Shelomith, William (known as William 2nd to distinguish him from his uncle of the same name), Asel Benjamin, Michael and Joseph Isaac. The girls were Elizabeth, Mary Ann, Sarah Jane and Catherine. SHELDWITH married Catherine Turnbull of Pictou County and they had one daughter, Maria Anne. They lived in Pictou, Trure and Stewiacke before returning to St. Andrews where Shelomith bought out his cousin W. Ingram Knowles.

WILLIAM and always made his home in St. Andrews although his work of bridge building took him to many parts of Nova Scotia part of the time. He married his cousin, Mariah Ann Sibley in 1854. In 1856 their only child was born. She was named Maelja by her father who made up the name from the first two letters of Mary, Eliza and Jane. Maelja married Edward MacGregor of Stewiacke, the first mayor of that town. They had no children.

ASEL BENJAMIN made the first clearing on Sibley Mountain but in 1853 he gave up farming and spont a few years making trunks and boxes, etc. In 1861 he sold his land to the Ramseys and went to Amhorst where he worked as a pattern maker in an iron foundry. He married Eliza Jane Johnson of Coldstream in 1848 and their three children were William, Martha and Rosina.

MICHAEL lived most of his life in St. Andrews where he worked with his father as a furniture maker. For a few years around 1855 he had a store in Stewiacks and later around 1875 he lived in Mill Village (West St. Andrews) for awhile but for the most part he was in St. Andrews where he, like his brother William 2nd, played a prominent role in the industrial life of the village. He married a cousin, Mary Jane Sibley. Two children died when a few days old but one daughter, Almira, lived and she spent her life in St. Andrews. She married Edger Burgess who had come from Rawdon to work in the Sibley factories. They bought the farm of her great grandfather, Stephen Sibley, and here they stayed the remainder of their lives. Their children were Arthur who married Bertha Cruikshanks of Stewiacks. They made their home in Dorchester, Mass. Jessie Burgess died of diphtheria when young. Edna married Herbert MacLood of Halifax and they had a son, Arthur, who died when a child. Both Herbert and Edna MacLeod were nurses but on retiring from that profession they returned to Wittenburg and lived in her parents' home. Just prior to their deaths in 1959 and 1960 they moved to Truro. Bertha Burgess married Leslie Loomer who came to Wittenburg as a student minister. He gave up the ministry and engaged in the greenhouse business until his death. They had no children.

Olivia, an adopted daughter of Michael and Hary Jane Sibley, married a widower, John Woodworth, and they lived in Wittenburg for a short while before going to California.

JOSEFH ISAAC was the youngest son of Joseph and Jane Sibley. As a boy he was called Joseph, then his full name was used but finally the Joseph was dropped and he became known as Isaac. He lived for a time in St. Andrews where he worked with his brother, William 2nd, then began to clear the farm where Hugh MacNutt later lived. After a few years working in Truro he went to California about 1869 where he died a few years later.

ELIZABETH was the oldest child of Joseph and Jane Sibley. She married Robert Wright of East Stewiacke when seventeen years old. She had twelve children, the oldest of whom was twenty-one and the youngest two years when she died at the age of thirty-nine.

MARY ANN married James Williams of St. Andrews. They had five sons and two daughters. She died at the age of forty-two years, in 1862.

SARAH JANE married her cousin, W. Ingram Knowles in 1852. They had three children when he left St. Andrews and went to the western states. She was a dressmaker for some years. She died in 1867 at the age of thirty-six years and was buried in the cemetery here.

CATHERINE was a teacher. Her husband, John Lynds, was a carpenter from frure. They had two children and one year before she went west to join her husband she lived with the children in an apartment above the schoolroom at East Stewiacke where she was teaching.

William Sibley (born in 1796) was the fourth son of Stephen Sibley. In later years he was known as William 1st to avoid confusion with his nephew. He went to New Brunswick when a young man and worked at lumbering along the Miramichi River. It the a ge of thirty-six he married Eliza Thomas (elghteen years old) the daughter of a boat builder of Saint John, N.B. They came to Nova Soctia following their marriage in 1832 and settled first at Mill Town (West St. Andrews) where he had had a mill. In 1848 they bought land on Sibley Mountain near where his nephew, Asel Benjamin, had cleared his farm. Here they lived and brought up their large family of eight boys and four girls. William Sibley died in 1870 and his wife in 1905.

The children were Maria Ann, Mary Jane, Cavert, William Henry, Ezekiel T., Michard, Stophen, A. Benjamin, Aaron, Eliza Catherine, Ruth and Edward George.

MARIA ANN married her cousin, William Sibley 2nd and MARY JANE married his mother Michael.

CALVERT married Mary Jane Best and lived for a time on the Hawkins place Best Mountain. He had a mill on the brook near the Martin place and also farmed

the Williams farm for a year or two after the Williams went to California. He ran a grist mill in Gays River for awhile about 1869 and then he and his wife and three children went to South Dekota where he engaged in long distance freighting. On one trip he disappeared and no clue to his fate was ever found.

WILLIAM HENRY, at the age of twenty-one, began to clear the large farm where he lived the rest of his life. He married Martha Bell of Chaswood and they had seven children - Alburn Henry, Annie Eliza, George Stephen, Ellen Maria, Richard Edward, Jennie Catherine and Ruth Barbara. Alburn married Eudora Pulsifer the oldest daughter of Oswald and Jane (Durnford) Pulsifer. They had one son, Edward.

Annie Eliza married George Urquhart and their children wore Valeta, Leota, Elva and Alburn. George married Hattie Tanner am following her death he married Jane Sargent of Chaswood. Their children are Ivan, Mary, Susan, Velma, Edward, Elli Cecil, Earle, Dora, Gladys, Effie am Norman. The oldest son Ivan married Reta Mc-Mullen and they now live in Wittenburg. They have five sons - Charlie, Richard, Douglas, Ralph, Vernon and a daughter Irene.

Ellen Marie married Captain Card of Burlington and their children are Harold, Orland, Eldon, Verna and Stewart.

Richard Edward married Bllen Mosher of Musquodoboit Harbour and he romained in Wittenburg on the family farm. Besides their daughters Winnie and Blanche, they brought up a foster son Alfred Goode. Winnie is married to Ralph Campbell of Middle Stawiacke and they have two sons and two daughters. Blanche and her husband John Nagels live in Montreal. They have four sons and one daughter. Alfred Goode and his wife and family live in Magog, Que.

Jennie Catherine married George Taylor of Chaswood. Their three children are Dora (Mrs. Edgar Gates), Ralph, who married Merle Creelman and lives at Milford, and Fred whose wife is the former Retha Taylor and they live in California.

Ruth Barbara married Morton Card of Burlington and their children are Silbert, Avard and Leta.

EZEKIEL T. married Esther MacLaughlan of Canso. She was the first teacher in the schoolhouse built and opened in 1867. Their children were Edgar Manning, Stanley, Norman, Lucinda, Mary Estella, Harriet Margaret, Florence Kathleen and Berenice. Berenice was named by Dr. Steele, a Baptist minister in Amherst, and he

Edgar worked as a talleyman in the lumbering business both at home and in B.C. until the outbreak of World War I. He came home so broken in health that he lived only until 1919 and his death came on the day of his parents' fiftieth wedding anniversary.

Stanley, a mach inist, married Ella Gaetz and they went to Vancouver to live. Their children are Marebele, Edgar, Lewis and Frances.

Norman married Mary Bell and they went to Alberta. They had two sons, Lewis and Norman.

Lucinda, as all the girls in this family, was a school teacher. She married John Bryson and their children ware Vivian, Queenie, Mary Joyce, Vern and Dean Scott.

Mary Estella, after graduating from Normal, taught for several years and then married a neighbor, James W. Ramsey. They moved to their present home on Ramsey Hill when their children were small. They have two sons, Laurie and Jamie and four daughters Gladys, Lois, Helen and Jean while another daughter, Esther, died when in her teens. Lurie married Rona Durrant and lives in Ontario. They have four children. Jamie married Gertrude Guild and they have three sons, James, Evan and Arthur. They live near his parents on Ramsey Hill. Gladys and her husband James Spates live in Mass. They have one son. Lois, Mrs. McPhee, now a widow, lives in Stewiacke. She has one daughter and two sons. Helen married Carl Conrad of Dartmouth. They have four sons and one daughter. Jean's husband, Dr. Arthur Er-

Harriet Margaret married Woodill Taylor of Chaswood, great grandson of Joseph Pulsifer who was one of the first settlers of St. Andrews. They had two daughters and four sons. Florence Kathleen married Walter Gilbert of Musquedoboit Harbour. They had one daughter.

Beronice married William Reed of N.H. and they have three daughters. R ECHARD NEWCOMBE married Isabella Bruce of Elderbank. He worked with his cousin, Michael Sibley, for many years before he and his brothers took over the Sibley Bros. Factories. After selling out, he went to Denver, Col. where his wife became principal of the State Normal College. He engaged in cabinet work. They had two daughters.

STEPHEN also worked with Michael Sibley in his shop and was one of the four brothers to take over the business. He became ill with tuberculosis and after a long fight for his health he succumbed to the disease.

BENJAMIN was the third of the four Sibley Brothers and, like Stephen, he contacted T.B. and died young. Before he became ill he married Gemmie Pulsifer of Wittenburg and they had two daughters, Gertrude, who died of diphtheria when a child, and Della who went to California to live.

AARON was a member of the Sibley Bros. He married Susan Leck of Chaswood. After the factories closed they went to New Glasgow for a few years and later to Halifax. They had two daughters and one son.

ELIZA CATHERINE, known as Cassie, merried George Olgivie, a farmer in Elderbank, where they lived until his retirement when they returned to Wittenburg to live until her death. They had twin daughters, Marie and Maud.

RUTH married Alexander MacDougall of Guysboro Road. She also came back to Wittenburg where she died at the hame of her mother.

EDWARD GEORGE taught school for a time before he became a Baptist minister. He did not serve in this work for very long for he also fell a victim to T.B. A trip to California seemed to result in a return to good health but soon after returning to Wittenburg he again became ill and died in March, 1895.

# <u>Appendix 3</u> The History of the Sibley Factories in Wittenburg, by Mildred (Pulsifer) Burrows

### THE SIBLEY FACTORIES.

Some time about 1820 Joseph Sibley built a small shop over the brock at a spot west of where Mrs. Fearl MacLeod's house stands today. In this shop he constructed many household articles such as tubs, spinning wheels, looms and many kinds of furniture. Also many implements for the farm were made by him and when wagons came into use he made all the wooden parts of the wheels while his son, William 2nd, tired them in his blacksmith shop. He also made wagons, sleds, shafts, etc., and William did the iron work on the wagons, shoed the sleds and so on.

According to William Sibley's account book, it was about 1853, when Michael was about 20, that he began to do the same type of work as his father, Joseph Sibley. At first he worked for his father as did another son, Joseph Isaac, when he reached the same age a few years later. Gradually Michael took over the business and when Joseph died in 1862 at the age of seventy-two years, Michael and Isaac continued to run the shop. However, it was Michael who was in charge for in 1858 he made an agreement with Isaac that he work with him for one year for £15 and it was Michael, who in 1862, began to hire and train his cousins for this work. Ezekiel and Richard were the first two to work for him and at first were on a daily basis. From 1863 to 1865 Richard worked on yearly contracts and for a few years after that he worked either by the day for 75 cents, by the month for [14.00 to 918.00, or on a contract to do a certain amount of work.

By 1866 Stephen had begun his apprenticeship, followed three years later by Benjamin and in 1870 by Aaron. Also in 1866 an Amos Archibald worked by agreement and a Ben Smithson was another employee. Usually the men boarded with Michael and a careful record was kept of all the meals consumed.

The first yearly agreement with Richard is as follows: "Richard N. Sibley has hired with me for a year for the sum of seventy-two dollars to work in the shop at nearly all kinds of work that I do. Also for one month he has agreed to work out of doors at whatever is needful. Commencing June the eight One thousand eight hundred, sixty-three." At the bottom of the page is written - "This agreement fullfilled and settled." One year Stephen agreed to work at turning in the shop and another year it was entirely bench work.

The outdoors work mentioned in Richard's first agreement included such jobs as wood cutting and splitting, splits hunting, getting and pounding, rush getting and spreading to dry, fencing, plowing, hoeing potatoes, haying and work at the dam. The splits and rushes were used for the worm bot tomed chairs and the splits were made from black ash which grew along the edges of swemps and brooks. These were pounded with a poleaxe after which the strips of wood, or splits as they were called, could be peeled off in layers.

The main product of the shop was chairs and there were several kinds according to Michael Sibley's records. Some had woven bottoms and some had a solid bottom made of wood. Some had bent posts and some had straight posts. These all came in three sizes, men's, women's and children's. The men's were higher than the women's chairs but sold for the same price of a dollar each. The children's, smaller still, cost 75 cents. Double chairs were made and rockers were a popular item at \$1.50 each. Once there is mention of a nurse chair for  $87\frac{1}{5}$  cents but this may have been a special order.

Besides the chairs they made desks at \$1.25, teachers desks at \$3.25, spinning wheels for \$7.50, reels for \$2.00 and wheels for \$4.00, tables, bedsteads plain as well as the elaborate speel bedsteads, washstands, dressers, chests, coffins am probably other articles. Michael made an occasional loom and one page in his 36

book lists all the 25 pieces of wood required and the size of each piece. This wood amounted to 116 feet of hardwood costing \$1.74, the gagwheel hand and screws cost 50 cents, 12 6-inch bedscrews 30 cents and it took 6 days work at \$1.75 making a tota cost of \$13.04. He offered a cash price of \$12.00 or a credit price of \$14.00.

Other shop work included hundreds of cogs for his brother William, wheel spokes and birch wheel rims, whirls, waterwheels and wagons. A wagon for Esekiel brought in 370.00. Also he did custom work such as the uprights, posts and rail for the bannister in William Fulsifer's house.

Various schemes were tried out by Michael and his cousins during the years that they worked for him and these are the arrangements made with Ben, starting in 1869. "Benjamin Sibley has hired with me for two years for the sum of ten cents a day (or thirty-one dollars and thirty cents the year) the second year for twenty cents per day (or sixty dollars and sixty cents the year) to work in the shop to make chairs or what ever may come in the way that would be called shopwork. Fayment to be made at the end of each year or otherwise as may suit. Commenced on the morning of the ninth day of September, One thousand, eight hundred and sixty-nine."

On Sept. 8, 1870 is the following: "One year has passed away tonight since he began to work. 51 and 4 days lost. It will take until Nov. 6th or more to put the first year in." On Nov. 22, 1870 the year was completed with Ben having the sum of 23.80 paid to him, the other (6.50 having been drawn earlier. It was common for the year to run over into several additional months for Michael accounted for every hour spent at a funeral, frolic or singing school and no time was allowed for sickness. Once Michael settled up a year's work with Ben with a balance of 21 hours and 18 minutes still owing.

On Oct. 22, 1871 Michael states that "He got in seven months lacking four days of the second year and on that date this new agreement was made between Benjamin Sibley and I, Michael Sibley. I am to furnish Benjamin with wood sawed out to sizes for posts, rungs and slats for one hundred sets of bent back chairs and Ben is to cut off, turn, bend, bore, mortice, plain, bend and make slats and drive all together ready for bottoming and find stuff for bottoms which is to be half splits or more, the rest rushes (flags). He is to have the use of the shop and tools, and board himself while making the one hundred sets of chairs and find me with enough logs at the mill for two thousand of lumber. The price for making and bot toming the chairs is to be three dollars and to take his pay in chairs at the following rate:

6 chairs bottomed and painted 5.50 6 chairs bottomed 4.55 6 chairs without bottoms 3.15

Six chairs made a set so Benjamin made 600 chairs that winter which would bring him 0500.00 or over half the chairs and on April 16 when the deal was completed, Michael still owed him 9 sets of bottomed chairs and 7 sets of unbottomed ones, and they made this next contract: "I have left with Benjamin Sibley 27 sets of chair posts, long and short and slats bent for the same. (Two sets of those are bent posts). The long and short rungs both flat and round for 15 sets are seasoned ready for fitting. The romaining 12 sets of rungs are just turned and plained out. I want you to make up those 27 sets and charge mo with what they cost." On Dec. 28, 1872: "Settled up the above and paid for making up the same and left with Ben and Aaron Sibley the same until called for from time to time: 25 sets bent unbottomed chairs and 2 sets straight unbottomed chairs."

Aaron, when he began to work in 1870, made the same agreement as Ben had in 1869 except he was to get 340.00 the first year and 370.00 the second with payment to be made quarterly. When Richard had been working at piece work he had received 10 cents per chair for bottoming. Michael's adopted daughter, Olivia, in 187 painted chairs at a cent a chair for each coat. (They were given two coats each). The most she painted in one day was 12 and in a period from February to June she on made \$1.63. As in April she had bought 2 skeins of wool and 6 yards of striped cott and had drawn 25 cents in cash, she only had 4 cents coming to her when they settle accounts. It took as long to paint a chair as it did to "drive" one together, for Michael could drive 12 chairs or rocking chairs together in one day. Freparing the pieces took longer than assembling them.

It was not too long after this that the four Sibley boys - Richard, Stephen, Ben and Aaron bought out Michael's interest in the shop. The Sibley Bros. expanded the business into the lower factory and the upper factory. The lower factory had two buildings and a drying shed. One building was the original shop built by Joseph Sibley and the second building was beside it with the drying shed at the very edge of the road by the spring. The upper factory was on a lot between the house now owned by Stuart Day and the lot where James W. Ramsey recently had his shingle mill. Here there was one factory and two small drying sheds.

The brothers not only had enough work to keep themselves busy but hired a number of other men and this thriving business brought many new families into the comcunity. For a few years the youngest brother of the family of Sibleys, George Edward, worked in the factories after ill health forced him to give up the ministry. Some of the sisters in the family also worked there before their marriages and Effie there.

Michael had been content to sell to his neighbors and a local merchant, Mr. Gass of Shubenacadie. Now, however, the products of the factory became known far afield. Aaron was salesman and he would load a wagon high with chairs and travel all over Colchester and Hants Counties selling them at a dollar each. Also during the years from 1883 to 1887, John Wright, cousin of the Sibleys, sold their furnitare throughout Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Quobec. That this furniture was popular as woll as durable is proven by the fact that it can be found in most communities of this county today, apparently as strong as the day it was made and to all appearances good for another hundred years of use. Chairs and other furniture also went to St. Pierre & Hiquelon.

Later the Sibley Bros. sold out to their older brother Ezekiel, with a change of name to the Anglo-American Manufacturing Co. About that time the demand for this type of furniture lessened and the company closed down about 1898. Some of the buildings were moved away and the others gradually fell down so that there is no trace of them today and apparently not even a photo of them in existence.

One product of the factories was the window blind. These were woven of factories was the window blind. These were woven of factories was set up in a building adjoining his octagonal house and this building, which is still there, was always called the loom house. Some blinds were still in use in the church and school up until 1930.

The tapered feet, stretcher arrangement, bent back posts which taper above the seat, arched slats, and mushroom-shaped finials are distinctive of the chairs made by the Sibley family. Joseph Sibley, a Wittenburg, Colchester County, farmer, was the first Sibley to make chairs and other items, beginning ca. 1820, and is considered to be the one responsible for the distinctive combination of features. Michael Sibley began to work with his father by 1853 and was managing the shop by 1858. The operation had expanded by 1878 and wood-seated chairs, stencilled "Manufactured by/Sibley Brothers/ Lower Stewiacke/Colchester County/ N.S." are supposed to date from this



period. A Sibley cousin, John Wright, sold the furniture throughout Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Quebec. The business closed by 1898. The original seat on this chair was likely a woven splint seat. It has been replaced with a piece of green carpet laced with nylon cord. Originally the chair was painted green.
